

On January 22nd each year, the Catholic Church in the United States observes a day of Day of Prayer for the Legal Protection of Unborn



Children to mark the Supreme Court decision, Roe v Wade, on January 22, 1973, that legalized abortion throughout the United States.

In 2018, Mississippi passed a law protecting unborn children after fifteen weeks of gestation. This law was challenged and the case, known as Dobbs v Jackson's Women's Health Organization, is awaiting a decision by the Supreme Court. Oral arguments were heard on December 1, 2021 and a decision is expected in June 2022.

This a landmark case that could potentially overturn the decision of Roe v Wade. Please join the On Our Knees campaign in prayer and fasting for the Dobbs Supreme Court Case on the 22nd of each month, beginning on January 22, 2022, the 49th anniversary of the Supreme Court decision Roe v Wade, through June 2022, when a decision is expected.




