CREATING A SAFE ENVIRONMENT: KEEPING OUR CHILDREN & VULNERABLE ADULTS SAFE

The Diocese of Rochester is currently updating their Creating A Safe Environment (CASE) policy and we are awaiting its distribution. However, it has been communicated to us that the category of volunteers requiring CASE training has expanded.

If you are currently volunteering at St. Charles parish in a category now required to complete CASE training, you will be connected either by your ministry leader or by the Parish Case Coordinator, Maureen Beattie. We will direct you to the Diocesan on-line training module and help answer any questions that you may have. The training consists of the on-line modules, completing a Volunteer Code of Conduct, and completing an authorization for a background check. CASE training is **only available** online. However, if you do not have access to a computer, we will provide access to a computer at the Parish.

CASE training must be renewed every **3** years. *If you are a current volunteer and have completed CASE training within the last 3 years, we will **not** be contacting you at this time.*

We appreciate your understanding and thank you for sharing your time and talent with our parish as a dedicated volunteer.

Updated Protocols (as of July 4, 2021)

The Diocese of Rochester has issued updated guidelines to its parishes in light of Gov. Andrew Cuomo's June 15 order lifting COVID-19 restrictions in New York State. Below we have outlined these updates and how St. Charles Borromeo will proceed at this time.

- Consistent with the State's implementation of the recent CDC guidance, masks are still required for **unvaccinated** individuals.
- If you are fully vaccinated, masks are no longer required. However, it is your choice as to whether to wear one or not.
- At St. Charles will offer a section of "social distancing" seating for those who wish to maintain distancing. The "social distancing" section will be the area closest to Dewey Avenue.
- Holy Communion will continue to be distributed only in the form of the Sacred Host. Please remember to sanitize hands before receiving Communion.
- Holy water fonts located at the doors will remain empty at this time.
- We have reintroduced congregational singing for the Mass parts only.
- We will continue to practice the modified expression of the Sign of Peace with no physical handshaking, but with a greeting and/or wave to each other.
- All Church entrances are available now (Dewey Avenue doors will remain "Exit Only" at this time). The ushers have begun taking up the weekly collection. Donation wells are still available in Church as well for your convenience. Thank you for your patience!

We appreciate your cooperation through these ever-changing times. We are happy to see more and more of you back at Mass. *We have missed you!*

Readings for July 11, 2021 • Fifteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

1st Reading (Amos 7:12-15)

Amaziah, priest of Bethel, said to Amos, "Off with you, visionary, flee to the land of Judah! There earn your bread by prophesying, but never again prophesy in Bethel; for it is the king's sanctuary and a royal temple." Amos answered Amaziah, "I was no prophet, nor have I belonged to a company of prophets; I was a shepherd and a dresser of sycamores. The LORD took me from following the flock, and said to me, Go, prophesy to my people Israel."

2nd Reading (Ephesians 1:3-14)

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavens, as he chose us in him, before the foundation of the world, to be holy and without blemish before him. In love he destined us for adoption to himself through Jesus Christ, in accord with the favor of his will, for the praise of the glory of his grace that he granted us in the beloved. In him we have redemption by his blood, the forgiveness of transgressions, in accord with the riches of his grace that he lavished upon us. In all wisdom and insight, he has made known to us the mystery of his will in accord with his favor that he set forth in him as a plan for the fullness of times, to sum up all things in Christ, in heaven and on earth.

In him we were also chosen, destined in accord with the purpose of the One who accomplishes all things according to the intention of his will, so that we might exist for the praise of his glory, we who first hoped in Christ. In him you also, who have heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and have believed in him, were sealed with the promised holy Spirit, which is the first installment of our inheritance toward redemption as God's possession, to the praise of his glory.

Gospel (Mark 6:7-13)

Jesus summoned the Twelve and began to send them out two by two and gave them authority over unclean spirits. He instructed them to take nothing for the journey but a walking stick—no food, no sack, no money in their belts. They were, however, to wear sandals but not a second tunic. He said to them, "Wherever you enter a house, stay there until you leave. Whatever place does not welcome you or listen to you, leave there and shake the dust off your feet in testimony against them." So they went off and preached repentance. The Twelve drove out many demons, and they anointed with oil many who were sick and cured them.
