





\$125 went to St. Joseph's Neighborhood Center past weekend. REACH Advocacy will be this weekend's Parish Sharing recipient.

**REACH Advocacy** advocates for and with chronically homeless persons in the Rochester area. They have operated a winter shelter in different locations for the last 5-6 years. The site for the winter of 2019-20 was at 720 West Main Street (the old monastery for the Coptic Christian Community). In 2020-21 hotel-based housing with Monroe County financing was provided as lodging for the homeless. For 2021-22 they will be operating a number of smaller shelters, in each of which guests will have individual rooms (safest in the age of Covid). In the meantime, the monastery is being renovated to serve as a community resource center, the administrative hub for scattered shelter sites in 2021-22, & a winter shelter again when circumstances permit. We will be sending REACH our parish sharing this weekend to help support their winter shelters.

#### Come Home to Mass! Updated Mask Guidance (12/31/21)

On December 31, Gov. Kathy Hochul announced an extension of the mask mandate that requires masks to be worn in all indoor public places. This mask mandate will be in effect until February 1, 2022, at which point the state will reassess its effectiveness based on Covid-related public health conditions. Masks are required for all people attending any indoor gathering at St. Charles Borromeo- this includes but is not limited to weekday Mass, weekend Mass, funerals, ministry

meetings in the School, CYO functions in the gym, and when conducting any business in the Rectory and School offices.

As a reminder, masks must be worn properly- fully covering your nose and mouth and left on at all times.

We appreciate your cooperation in making sure we are in compliance with this mandate!

### Readings for January 16, 2022 • 2<sup>nd</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time

#### 1st Reading (Isaiah 62:1-5)

For Zion's sake I will not be silent, for Jerusalem's sake I will not be quiet, until her vindication shines forth like the dawn and her victory like a burning torch. Nations shall behold your vindication, and all the kings your glory; you shall be called by a new name pronounced by the mouth of the LORD. You shall be a glorious crown in the hand of the LORD, a royal diadem held by your God. No more shall people call you "Forsaken, " or your land "Desolate, " but you shall be called "My Delight, " and your land "Espoused." For the LORD delights in you and makes your land his spouse. As a young man marries a virgin, your Builder shall marry you; and as a bridegroom rejoices in his bride so shall your God rejoice in you.

**Psalm Refrain:** Proclaim to all the nations the marvelous deeds of the Lord! Proclaim to all the nations the marvelous deeds of the Lord!. (Psalm 96)

#### 2nd Reading (1 Corinthians 12:4-11)

Brothers and sisters: There are different kinds of spiritual gifts but the same Spirit; there are different forms of service but the same Lord; there are different workings but the same God who produces all of them in everyone. To each individual the manifestation of the Spirit is given for some benefit. To one is given through the Spirit the expression of wisdom; to another, the expression of knowledge according to the same Spirit; to another, faith by the same Spirit; to another, gifts of healing by the one Spirit; to another, mighty deeds; to another, prophecy; to another, discernment of spirits; to another, varieties of tongues; to another, interpretation of tongues. But one and the same Spirit produces all of these, distributing them individually to each person as he wishes.

#### Gospel (John 2:1-11)

There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee, and the mother of Jesus was there. Jesus and his disciples were also invited to the wedding. When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, how does your concern affect me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servers, "Do whatever he tells you." Now there were six stone water jars there for Jewish ceremonial washings, each holding twenty to thirty gallons. Jesus told them, "Fill the jars with water." So they filled them to the brim. Then he told them, "Draw some out now and take it to the headwaiter." So they took it. And when the headwaiter tasted the water that had become wine, without knowing where it came from — although the servers who had drawn the water knew — the headwaiter called the bridegroom and said to him, "Everyone serves good wine first, and then when people have drunk freely, an inferior one; but you have kept the good wine until now." Jesus did this as the beginning of his signs at Cana in Galilee and so revealed his glory, and his disciples began to believe in him.

#### St. Charles Borromeo Parish Sacramental Preparation 2022

Are you considering **Sacramental Preparation** for your child this year? Here are the requirements to prepare for First Penance, First Communion and Confirmation:

- Children prepare and receive sacraments at their <u>home parish</u> where their family is registered and attend Mass.
- Weekly Mass attendance in-person or online is an essential and spiritual part of your family's faith journey!
- Children need to be enrolled in either a Catholic School or be enrolled in St. Charles Home-based Religious Education or another Faith Formation program.
- Children do <u>not</u> prepare for the Sacraments in their Catholic School classroom or in Religious Education. Our preparation will include:
  - Textbooks, activities, and resources for children to complete with parents, guardians, and/or sponsors.
  - the child accompanied by a parent or guardian attends Sacrament meetings held on Sundays, after the 10:30 Mass is finished.
- Children 2<sup>nd</sup> grade or older may be ready to prepare for:
  - \* **First Penance** (also known as First Reconciliation)
  - First Communion (also known as First Eucharist)
  - \* Preparation for First Penance must be completed <u>before</u> preparing for First Eucharist.
- Students 8<sup>th</sup> grade or older may be ready to prepare for the Sacrament of Confirmation:
  - This is the beginning of a <u>2-year process</u>, with immediate preparation for the Sacrament of Confirmation taking place in the spring of the 2<sup>nd</sup> year.
  - Formation continues throughout the two-years by attending religion classes at Catholic School or being enrolled in St. Charles Home-based Religious Education.


