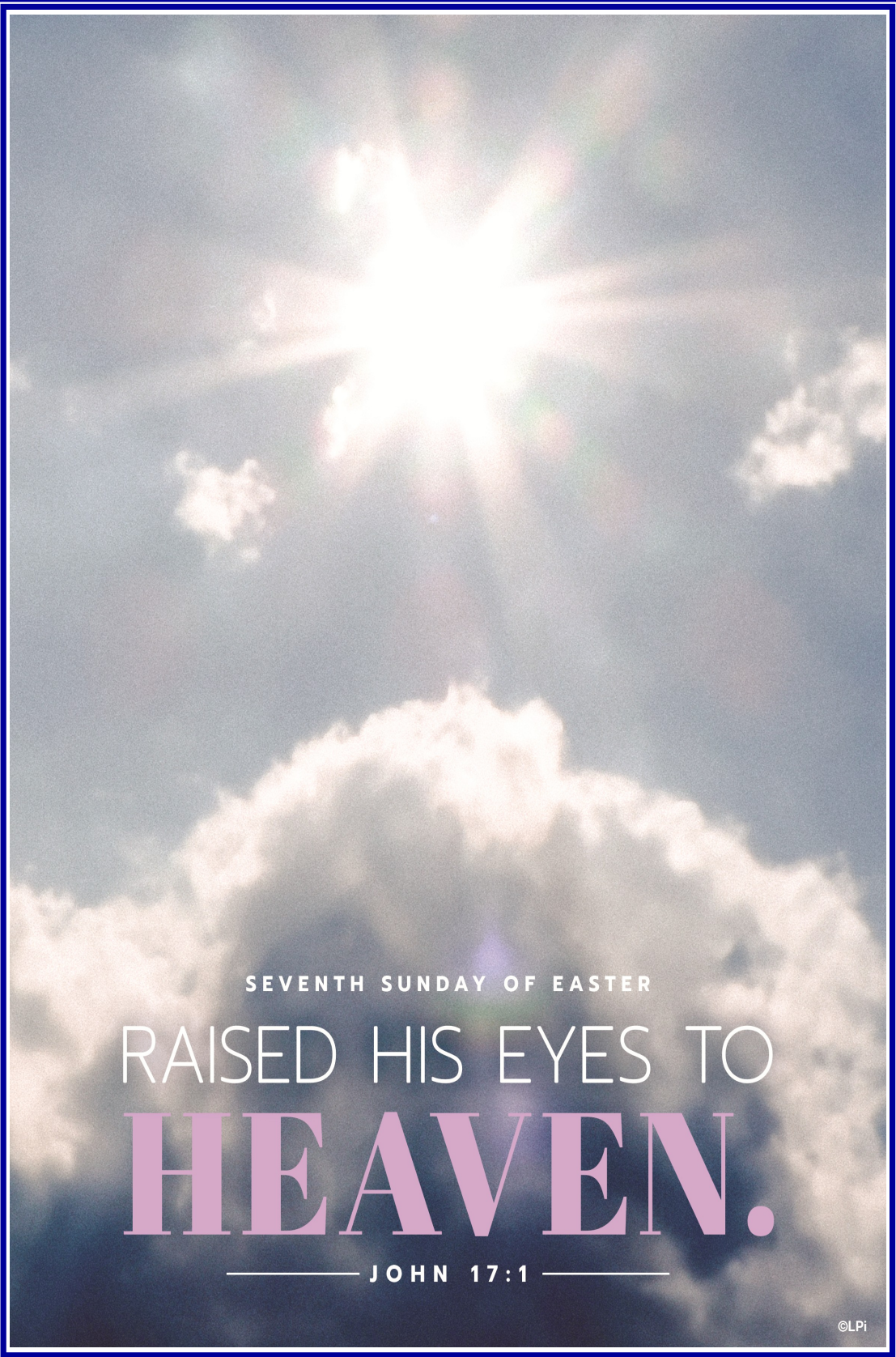

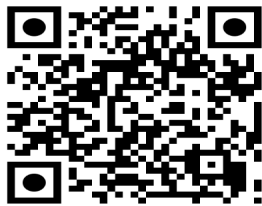


\$125 went to **Women's Care Center** this past weekend. **Focus Pregnancy Help Center** will be this weekend's Parish Sharing recipient.

Focus Pregnancy Help Center is rather unique in that it is located across the street from a large abortion facility downtown. They have a sidewalk ministry (which has been reinforced by other groups including 40 Days for Life) that seeks to change the heart of a mother before she ends the life of her child. Free pregnancy testing, early ultrasound referral, & material aid are among the services they offer. They have been in operation since 2005. Many in the neighborhood have not been sympathetic to their work and FPHC has faced obstructions. Focus is open Monday-Friday. Their website is: www.focusphc.com and are also on Facebook (*Focus Pregnancy Help Center*). We are directing this weekend's parish sharing to them.

Readings for May 17, 2026 • 7th Sunday of Easter*

1st Reading (Acts 1:12-14)

After Jesus had been taken up to heaven the apostles returned to Jerusalem from the mount called Olivet, which is near Jerusalem, a sabbath day's journey away. When they entered the city they went to the upper room where they were staying, Peter and John and James and Andrew, Philip and Thomas, Bartholomew and Matthew, James son of Alphaeus, Simon the Zealot, and Judas son of James. All these devoted themselves with one accord to prayer, together with some women, and Mary the mother of Jesus, and his brothers.

2nd Reading (1 Peter 4:13-16)

Beloved: Rejoice to the extent that you share in the sufferings of Christ, so that when his glory is revealed you may also rejoice exultantly. If you are insulted for the name of Christ, blessed are you, for the Spirit of glory and of God rests upon you. But let no one among you be made to suffer as a murderer, a thief, an evildoer, or as an intriguer. But whoever is made to suffer as a Christian should not be ashamed but glorify God because of the name.

Gospel (John 17:1-11a)

Jesus raised his eyes to heaven and said, "Father, the hour has come. Give glory to your son, so that your son may glorify you, just as you gave him authority over all people, so that your son may give eternal life to all you gave him. Now this is eternal life, that they should know you, the only true God, and the one whom you sent, Jesus Christ. I glorified you on earth by accomplishing the work that you gave me to do. Now glorify me, Father, with you, with the glory that I had with you before the world began. "I revealed your name to those whom you gave me out of the world. They belonged to you, and you gave them to me, and they have kept your word. Now they know that everything you gave me is from you, because the words you gave to me I have given to them, and they accepted them and truly understood that I came from you, and they have believed that you sent me. I pray for them. I do not pray for the world but for the ones you have given me, because they are yours, and everything of mine is yours and everything of yours is mine, and I have been glorified in them. And now I will no longer be in the world, but they are in the world, while I am coming to you."

The Road Less Traveled

There is a well-known line from Mr. (Fred) Rogers, who once recalled his mother's advice when he was frightened by what he saw in the world: *"Look for the helpers. You will always find people who are helping."*

It is a comforting thought, especially in times of crisis or uncertainty. But most of us do not encounter "helpers" only in dramatic moments. More often, we meet them in the ordinary—in the daily rhythms of care.

Caregivers are among those helpers.

They rarely make headlines. Their work is not dramatic in the way the world typically measures importance. Instead, it is steady, patient, and often hidden. It shows up in rides to appointments, in meals prepared, in medications managed, in long hours of quiet presence. It is found in listening, in encouraging, and sometimes simply in staying. It is a role filled by many—spouses, parents, children, grandparents, other relatives, friends, and even strangers.

Caregiving is not only an act of service; it is an act of love lived out over time. It asks for endurance, compassion, and a willingness to enter into another person's vulnerability.

In many ways, caregivers reflect something essential about the heart of the Gospel. They remind us that love is not always expressed in grand gestures, but in faithfulness—one small act at a time.

And perhaps there is something else Mr. Rogers' words invite us to consider: not only to look for the helpers, but to recognize them among us—and to be grateful.

Some of us, at different points in life, are called to be the ones who receive care. That, too, requires humility and trust. It is not always easy to be the receiver of care when we are used to being independent and self-reliant. I know this well. Yet in that moment, something sacred can emerge—an exchange of grace: receiving care, and allowing another the gift of caring.

In both roles—giver and receiver—we are drawn into a deeper understanding of love: a love that serves, a love that stays, and a love that reflects the quiet presence of God. May God continue to bless the helpers and caregivers among us, whose compassion and faithfulness make the Gospel visible each day.

The Social Ministry Committee collected Hygiene Items, Cleaning and Paper Products, during Lent. As always, our parishioners stepped up in an extraordinary way and donated more than we could have imagined to a few organizations. Three carloads of hygiene, cleaning, paper products & food went to St. Joseph's Neighborhood Center, located on South Ave. This agency serves the community's health and social needs. Our contributions restocked their supplies. We also took two carloads of paper and cleaning supplies to Catholic Charities Family and Community Services. The buckets filled with cleaning supplies were noticed and appreciated!

These organizations were extremely happy with the "overwhelming" amount of items we donated. They commented on "how generous" our congregation was and continues to be.

Hundreds of pounds of non-perishable foods brought in during Lent also filled shelves at Greece Ecumenical Food Shelf. (*Just a note that in 2025, we donated more than 3,800 lbs of food and products to GEFS*). The receptacles in church never seem to be empty, and needed non-perishable food is being delivered constantly to food shelves.

\$1,152.20 was collected for the Catholic Relief Services Operation Rice Bowls. 25% of that amount stays in the Diocese of Rochester.

St. Charles Borromeo parishioners can always be counted on to put others' needs in the forefront. The Social Ministry Committee members are grateful to be the representatives of our parishioners' generous hearts.

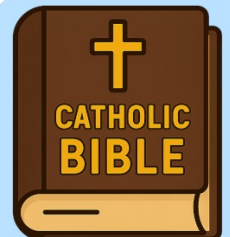

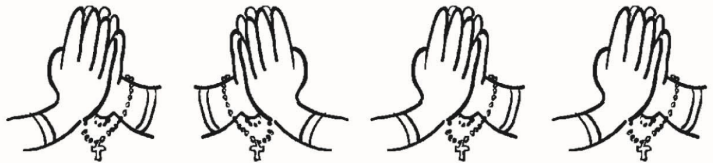
