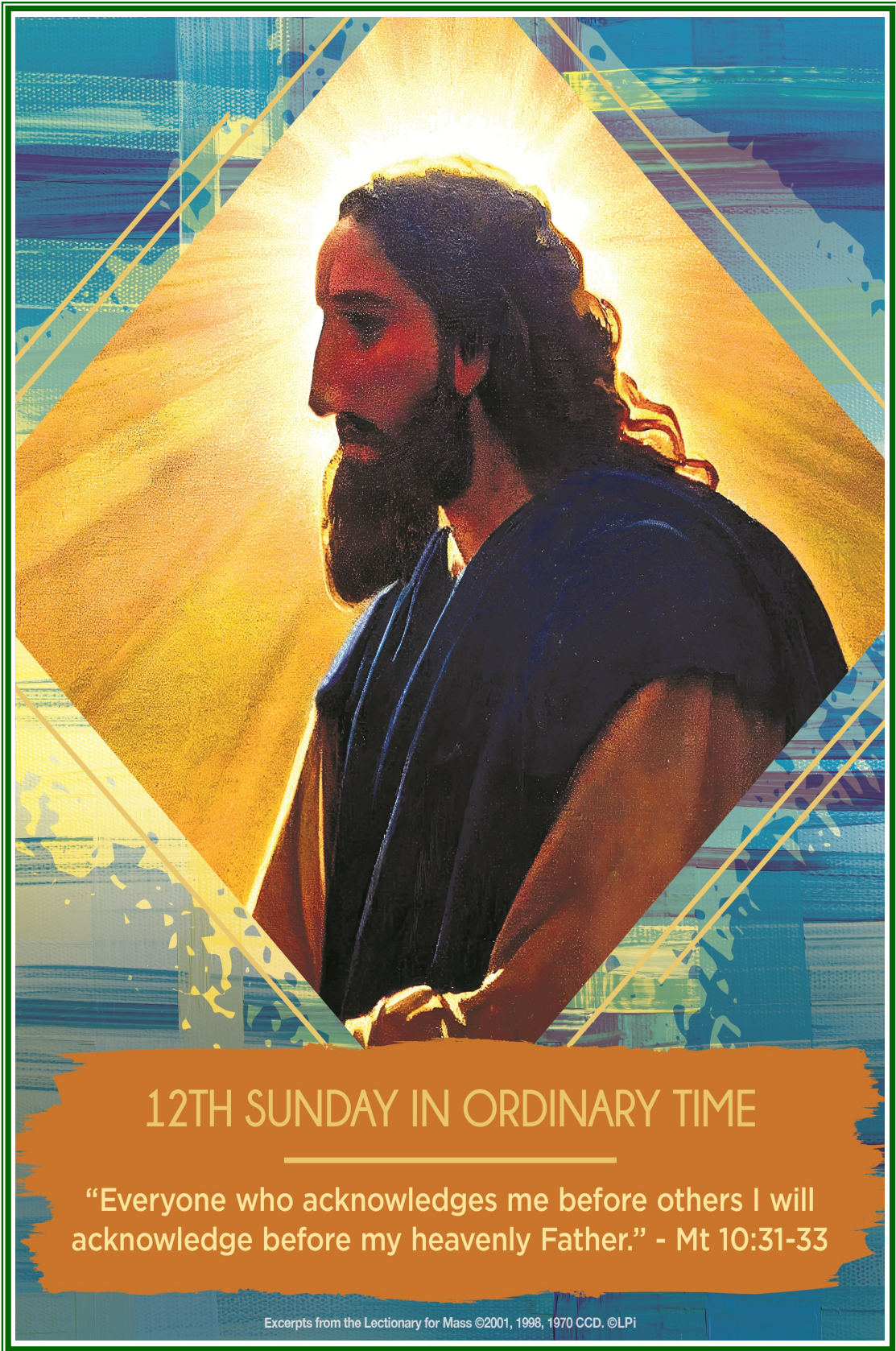

**BETHANY PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH  
HAS A LIFESAVING NARCAN BOX**

The Monroe County Department of Health (MCDOH) has installed a **Naloxone Box** by the steps in front of Bethany Presbyterian Church on Dewey Avenue (across the street from St. Charles Borromeo).

In the box are free doses of Narcan, the medication that counteracts opioid overdoses. This nasal spray will restore normal breathing to a person whose breathing has slowed or stopped as a result of overdosing on opioid medications, heroin, or other drugs that have been laced with the opioid fentanyl. Slowed or stopped breathing can cause brain damage or death. Naloxone (Narcan) does not cause any harm to a person but may save a life!

MCDOH is grateful to Bethany to allow the placement of the Naloxone Box on their property, as it is the only box available to the public in the Dewey-Stone area. MCDOH will keep the box stocked as product is taken.

**\$125** went to **Dreams from Drake** this past weekend. **The House of Mercy** will be this weekend's Parish Sharing recipient.

The **House of Mercy** is a ministry begun in 1985 by Sister Grace Miller with help from the Sisters of Mercy. Their current facility (which is #3) is a large renovated building on Ormond Street. It is three times the size of the #2 shelter and includes a commercial-scale kitchen. They have 76 beds available, making them a large resource for the homeless in our community (in code blue temps, they add cots to increase their capacity). They offer 3 meals a day to their guests and also have a clothing closet (*only new items accepted*) stocked with toiletries. Transportation assistance consists of RTS bus passes and the shelter van for medical appointments. Four on-site case workers are available to help clients. Their food cupboard distributes non-perishable items on Wednesdays. Two of their community partners are other organizations that SCB supports: R Community Bikes & The Vineyard Farms ([www.houseofmercyrochester.org](http://www.houseofmercyrochester.org)). We will give this weekend's parish sharing to the House of Mercy.

**NOTE:** A group of student athletes from McQuaid Jesuit High School rowed the entirety of the Erie Canal earlier this month to raise money for this homeless shelter.

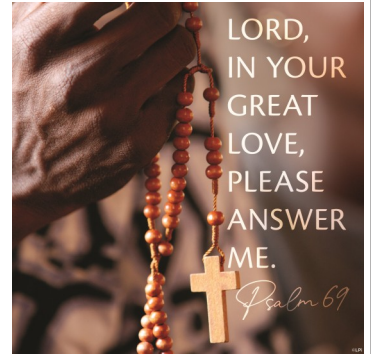
## Readings for June 21, 2026 • 12<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time\*

### 1<sup>st</sup> Reading (Jeremiah 20:10-13)

Jeremiah said: "I hear the whisperings of many: 'Terror on every side! Denounce! let us denounce him!' All those who were my friends are on the watch for any misstep of mine. 'Perhaps he will be trapped; then we can prevail, and take our vengeance on him.' But the LORD is with me, like a mighty champion: my persecutors will stumble, they will not triumph. In their failure they will be put to utter shame, to lasting, unforgettable confusion. O LORD of hosts, you who test the just, who probe mind and heart, let me witness the vengeance you take on them, for to you I have entrusted my cause. ## The Road Less Traveled

Just over a year ago, when Pope Leo XIV was elected to lead the Church, I was curious to see how this American-born, Augustinian prelate would follow in the footsteps of Pope Francis as well as the other 265 Popes that preceded him. Would his unique path to the papal cathedra prepare him to lead the 1.4 billion Catholics worldwide, with unity and hope? Time would tell.

A year has passed, and to me it seems that the College of Cardinals, in cooperation with the Holy Spirit, have chosen the exact person that our world needs as the Vicar of Christ. Pope Leo XIV chose his papal name in deference to Pope Leo XIII (serving 1878-1903) and his leadership in areas of 19/20th century social justice - thereby indicating a direction for his modern-day papacy. In addition, Leo XIV has been very clear when speaking on issues of compassionate immigration policies and international warfare, reminding us that we need to turn to the Gospel teachings of Jesus to find more just and humane ways of handling these challenges. And, he is reminding us of the potential dehumanization of technology without moral safeguards, a very 21st century concern. His steadfast focus on bringing Christ and the Gospel to the center of our lives cuts through all of the other, often un-Christian noise. He seems (to me) to be meeting the moment in providing Catholics and Christians everywhere with the moral and spiritual (and intellectual) leadership that our complicated world so desperately needs. (By the way - if you would like to learn more from him - in his own words - I highly recommend his first and very recent encyclical letter entitled **MAGNIFICA HUMANITAS**. It can be found at [www.vatican.va](http://www.vatican.va))

When we find ourselves in prayer this coming week, let us offer a prayer of thanksgiving for our Holy Father, Pope Leo XIV; asking that his ministry as our earthly shepherd will be blessed with wisdom and peace for many years to come.
