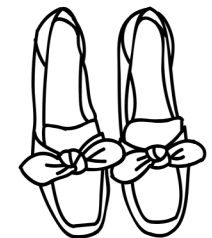

**\$125** went to **House of Mercy** this past weekend. **R-Community Bikes** will be this weekend's Parish Sharing recipient.

**R-Community Bikes** is a grassroots, 501(c)3 organization, staffed entirely by volunteers, that collects and repairs used bicycles for distribution, free of charge, to the Rochester area's children and adults. Since 2008 they have given away over 41,000 bikes and repaired more than 54,000. They do sell higher end bikes that have been donated to raise funds for their expenses. In September they will have a 1-day sale at their Tremont Street warehouse. Individual bike sales also occur at that location. Free bikes are given away by lottery at the 226 Hudson Avenue location. They do repairs at Hudson Avenue year-round and from May to October at 5 off-site locations. 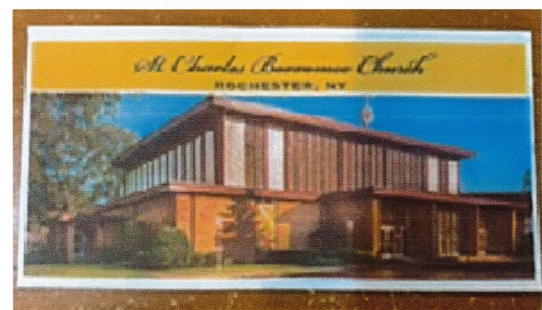
**St. Charles Borromeo is switching our offertory envelope service from Cathedral Corporation to Catholic Envelope Service, a division of NCS!**

Cathedral Corporation has been experiencing many difficulties in fulfilling their obligations to deliver offertory envelopes to our parishioners in a timely manner. So, the decision was made to make a change.

Starting in **August**, those who receive either weekly or monthly envelopes will be receiving these envelopes from **Catholic Envelope Service**. This change is being done internally by St. Charles Borromeo Staff, and no actions are required on your part. We are working with Catholic Envelope Service now with regards to the look of the envelopes so you may notice slight changes but for the most part the envelopes will remain consistent to what you are used to now.

We appreciate your patience while we transition from Cathedral Corporation to Catholic Envelope Service. In the meantime, we will have a good supply of blank envelopes available for your use at the entrances to Church if you should need them. ## Readings for June 28, 2026 • 13<sup>th</sup> Sunday in Ordinary Time\*

### 1<sup>st</sup> Reading (2 Kings 4:8-11,14-16a)

One day Elisha came to Shunem, where there was a woman of influence, who urged him to dine with her. Afterward, whenever he passed by, he used to stop there to dine. So she said to her husband, "I know that Elisha is a holy man of God. Since he visits us often, let us arrange a little room on the roof and furnish it for him with a bed, table, chair, and lamp, so that when he comes to us he can stay there." Sometime later Elisha arrived and stayed in the room overnight. Later Elisha asked, "Can something be done for her?" His servant Gehazi answered, "Yes! She has no son, and her husband is getting on in years." Elisha said, "Call her." When the woman had been called and stood at the door, Elisha promised, "This time next year you will be fondling a baby son."

### 2<sup>nd</sup> Reading (Romans 6:3-4,8-11)

Brothers and sisters: Are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life. If, then, we have died with Christ, we believe that we shall also live with him. We know that Christ, raised from the dead, dies no more; death no longer has power over him. As to his death, he died to sin once and for all; as to his life, he lives for God. Consequently, you too must think of yourselves as dead to sin and living for God in Christ Jesus.



### Gospel (Matthew 10:37-42)

Jesus said to his apostles: "Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever does not take up his cross and follow after me is not worthy of me. Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it." "Whoever receives you receives me, and whoever receives me receives the one who sent me. Whoever receives a prophet because he is a prophet will receive a prophet's reward, and whoever receives a righteous man because he is a righteous man will receive a righteous man's reward. You do not need to be an expert— simply someone who enjoys welcoming others, encouraging participation, and helping a group stay organized. Training, support, and resources will be provided. If you have an interest in helping with an existing ministry, facilitating a new small group, or sharing ideas for future opportunities, we would love to hear from you.

Please watch the bulletin for occasional updates throughout the summer as we continue our planning and prepare for an exciting fall season of faith, fellowship, and evangelization.

## The Road Less Traveled

We have all heard the familiar words of Jesus: "*Judge not, that you be not judged.*" They are among the most quoted—and perhaps most misunderstood—verses in Scripture. (For reference, see the Gospel of Matthew, 7:1.)

Jesus is not asking us to abandon common sense or moral discernment. We must still distinguish right from wrong. Rather, He is warning us about something much more subtle and insidious: the tendency to appoint ourselves as judges of another person's heart.

We see someone's actions, but we rarely know the burdens they carry, the wounds they bear, or the struggles they fight in silence. **God alone sees the whole story.**

Judgment has a way of closing a door. Once we decide we know who someone is, we stop listening. We stop wondering. We stop seeing the possibility that there is more to the story than meets the eye. Compassion, on the other hand, keeps the door open. It leaves room for mercy, for understanding, and for the recognition that we ourselves are still growing.

The verses that follow make this even clearer. Before pointing out the speck in our neighbor's eye, Jesus asks us to examine the plank in our own. His concern is not that we ignore sin, but that we approach others with the same humility and mercy that we hope God extends to us.

Every one of us depends upon God's patience. Every one of us has received mercy we did not earn. Remembering that changes the way we look at other people. We become less interested in passing judgment and more willing to offer understanding, forgiveness, and compassion.

Perhaps Jesus is inviting us to stop asking, "How do others measure up to me and my standards?" and begin asking, "**How closely does my heart resemble the heart of Christ?**"

Thanks be to God.

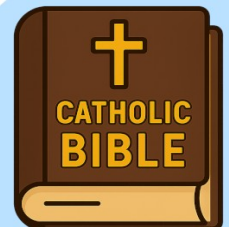
