Readings for September 6, 2026 • 23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time*

1st Reading (Ezekiel 33:7-9)

Thus says the LORD: You, son of man, I have appointed watchman for the house of Israel; when you hear me say anything, you shall warn them for me. If I tell the wicked, "O wicked one, you shall surely die," and you do not speak out to dissuade the wicked from his way, the wicked shall die for his guilt, but I will hold you responsible for his death. But if you warn the wicked, trying to turn him from his way, and he refuses to turn from his way, he shall die for his guilt, but you shall save yourself.

2nd Reading (Romans 13:8-10)

Brothers and sisters: Owe nothing to anyone, except to love one another; for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law. The commandments, "You shall not commit adultery; you shall not kill; you shall not steal; you shall not covet," and whatever other commandment there may be, are summed up in this saying, namely, "You shall love your neighbor as yourself." Love does no evil to the neighbor; hence, love is the fulfillment of the law.

Gospel (Matthew 18:15-20)

Jesus said to his disciples: "If your brother sins against you, go and tell him his fault between you and him alone. If he listens to you, you have won over your brother. If he does not listen, take one or two others along with you, so that 'every fact may be established on the testimony of two or three witnesses.' If he refuses to listen to them, tell the church. If he refuses to listen even to the church, then treat him as you would a Gentile or a tax collector. Amen, I say to you, whatever you bind on earth shall be bound in heaven, and whatever you loose on earth shall be loosed in heaven. Again, amen, I say to you, if two of you agree on earth about anything for which they are to pray, it shall be granted to them by my heavenly Father. For where two or three are gathered together in my name, there am I in the midst of them."

The Road Less Traveled

**"You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies;
you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows." (Psalm 23)**

*This is the **sixth** in a series of reflections on the 23rd Psalm.*

MY CUP
Overflows
with your
Blessings
PSALM 23:5

There is an unexpected change in Psalm 23.

In the earlier verses, David speaks of the Lord as a shepherd caring for His sheep. Then, without warning, the scene changes. The Shepherd becomes a gracious host, and the sheep become honored guests.

David writes, **"You prepare a table before me in the presence of my enemies; you anoint my head with oil; my cup overflows."**

In the ancient world, sharing a meal was a sign of welcome, friendship, and peace. To be invited to someone's table meant that you belonged there. You were accepted, valued, and cared for.

This is the remarkable image David gives us. God does not simply provide enough to survive. He prepares a table. He welcomes us into His presence. He treats us not as strangers, but as beloved guests.

Even more remarkable is where the table is prepared: **"in the presence of my enemies."** David does not say that his enemies have disappeared. The dangers of life remain. The struggles, fears, and uncertainties are still there. Yet they no longer have the final word.

God's peace does not depend on perfect circumstances. His presence is enough.

David continues, **"My cup overflows."** An overflowing cup is a picture of abundance. It reminds us that God's blessings cannot always be measured by wealth, health, or success. His greatest gifts are His mercy, His forgiveness, His faithful love, and the assurance that we are never alone.

As Christians, these words naturally lead us to another table—the altar of the Eucharist. At every Mass, the Lord prepares a table for His people. There He nourishes us with the Body and Blood of His Son, not because we have earned a place, but because He loves us. We come hungry, and He feeds us with the Bread of Life.

Every time we receive Holy Communion, we are reminded that the Good Shepherd is also the gracious Host. He invites us to His table, strengthens us for the journey, and fills us with the grace we need to live as His disciples.

Perhaps today we should ask ourselves a simple question: **Do I recognize the abundance of God's love, or have I become so focused on what I lack that I overlook the table He has already prepared for me?**

The Lord still prepares a table for His children. His invitation remains open. May we come with grateful hearts, trusting that whatever we bring to Him, His grace will always be more than enough.

Updates from ROC Catholics Northwest Vocations Committee....

**An interview with lay ecclesial minister,
Lee Ventrella, Parish Minister for Homebound &
Hospital Visitation at St. Charles Borromeo**

What brought you to this ministry? I have volunteered in the Church since my early teens when I helped a nun clean the sacristy and also washed and ironed purificators. Later on, I taught in the religious ed. program and helped with my family at the coffee hour after Sunday Mass. While on a business trip, I became very ill and almost died. In the hospital, volunteers brought me Holy Communion, and a local priest anointed me. I was overwhelmed with love and the presence of Our Lord. When I recovered, I started serving in this ministry as a way to "give back." When the Coordinator at St. Charles retired, Fr. John Firpo asked me to take her place. I responded that I had to think about it, and I prayed. I was retired and this was a "job," much more than volunteering. I know that the Holy Spirit took over and gave me the nudge that I needed to tell Father John that I would lead this Ministry. 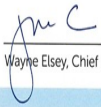

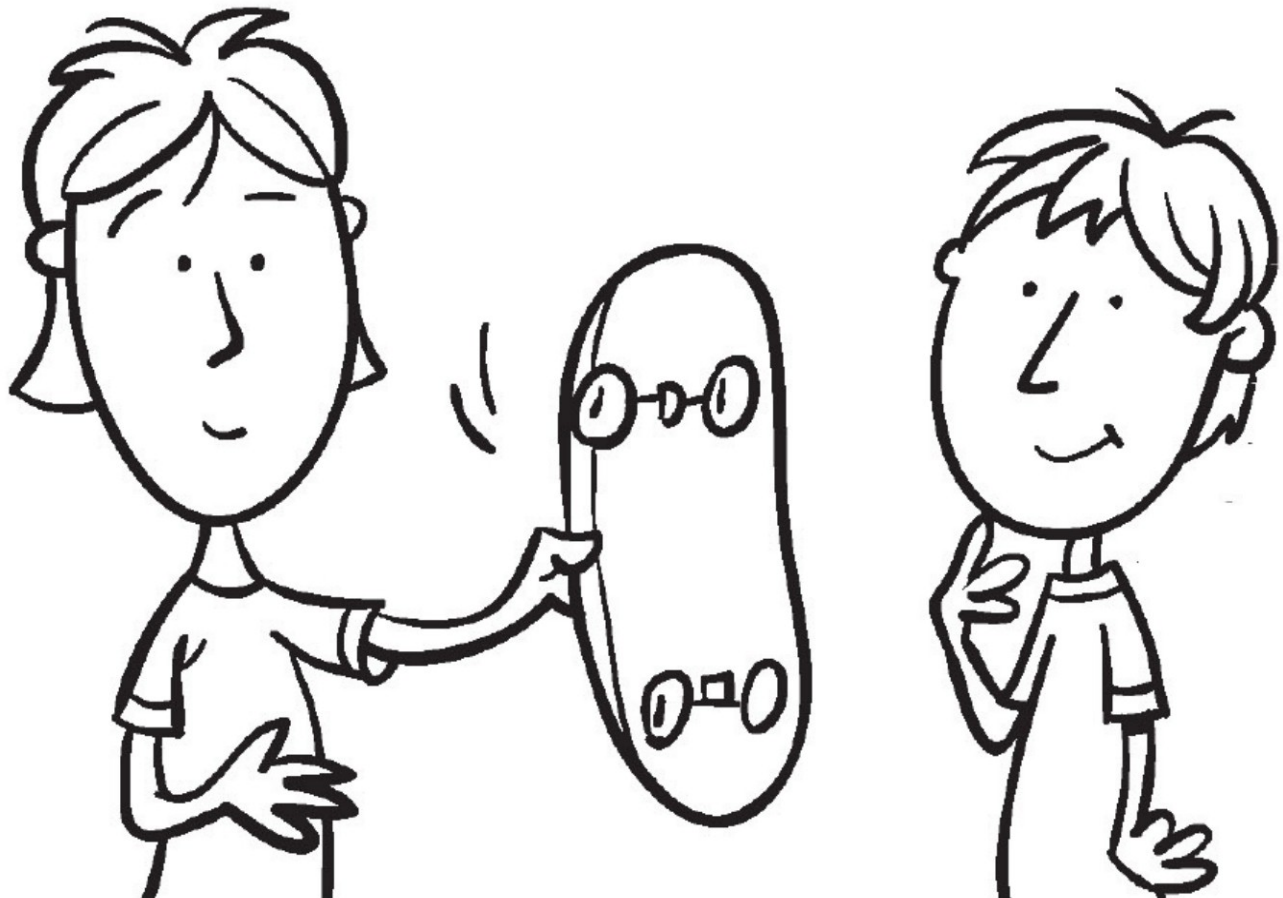

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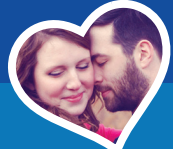
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
