From the
Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends in Christ,

As we hear the Gospel this weekend, we should be mindful that in the Gospel of Luke Jesus tells a parable about a poor man named who is also named Lazarus and a rich man, both of whom die and their places in the afterlife are described. We hear of how the rich man found himself in a place of torment, while Lazarus is at peace in the bosom of Abraham. The rich man becomes mindful of how his family were also rich and paid little attention to the poor. In his desire to spare them his fate he exhorts Abraham to let Lazarus return to them and warn them. *He said, 'Oh no, Father Abraham, but if someone from the dead goes to them, they will repent.' Then Abraham said, 'If they will not listen to Moses and the prophets, neither will they be persuaded if someone should rise from the dead.'*" (Luke 16:29-31)

The parable that Jesus proclaims takes on greater gravity when we consider that Jesus literally raises from the dead a man named Lazarus. Furthermore, it is strange to hear of how *Jesus first responds to the news that Lazarus was ill. Now Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus. So when he heard that he was ill, he remained for two days in the place where he was.* If, as it says, that Jesus loved this brother and his sisters, why would He choose to wait two before going to be with them? It is the parable that helps us make sense Jesus' decision.

In fact, the Gospel makes it clear that Jesus sought to bring about this miracle so that more people would come to believe in Him. *So then Jesus said to them clearly, "Lazarus has died. And I am glad for you that I was not there, that you may believe. Let us go to him." ... So Jesus, perturbed again, came to the tomb. ... He cried out in a loud voice, "Lazarus, come out!" The dead man came out... Now many of the Jews who had come to Mary and seen what he had done began to believe in him.*

What we can glean from all of this is that suffering, and sacrifice are often required of those who become truly devoted friends of Christ. St. Theresa of Avila is known to have said the following: *We always find that those who walked closest to Christ were those who had to bear the greatest trials.* When we face trials and tribulations because of fidelity to Christ, we should not be surprised. Rather, we should accept daily crosses with gratitude and the sure and certain hope that Jesus will always bring about a greater good from the sufferings we endure. Grace be with you all,

- ♦ The Fifth Sunday of Lent is known as Passion Sunday in the *Roman Missal* of 1962 and represents the beginning of a more solemn period within the season of Lent known as Passiontide that contains Passion Sunday and Palm Sunday (the Fifth and Sixth Sundays of Lent). In the *Roman Missal* of 1970 and its Third Typical Edition of 2002, Passion Sunday and Palm Sunday have been combined as "Palm Sunday of the Passion of the Lord" on the Sixth Sunday of Lent, but some elements of the two-week observance of Passiontide remain.
- ♦ The crosses and images in the church will be covered beginning this weekend. One tradition suggests that this symbolizes Jesus' hiding from the religious authorities as described in [John 8:59](#). While that description of the origin of this practice may not be entirely correct, it is still valuable to consider the increasing rejection by the establishment of the words and actions of Jesus from now until the time of Jesus' passion and death on the Cross on Good Friday.
- ♦ The music of the Mass of the Fifth Sunday of Lent reflects the increasing solemnity of these final days of Lent when the focus shifts to the Passion of Jesus.

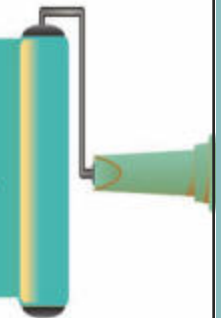
