From the
Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners and Visitors,

I hope all is well. This week the Church commemorates the feast of probably the most popular saint in the world—because he is revered by non-Catholics and non-Christians as well—St. Francis of Assisi who died on the 3rd of October 1226 at the age of 44. This simple man who sought to imitate Christ in his poverty, and to live a simple life totally dependent upon God and the generosity of others, has been an inspiration to all who wish to live simply, so that others might simply live. His praise of God the Creator in all the facets of creation has made St. Francis a patron saint of the environment, but Francis' spirituality runs much deeper. His was a radical obedience to all Christ said, in its literal form, such as "go, sell what you have, give the money to the poor, then come follow me;" (Matthew 19:21) and "do not worry about what your life, what you will eat or what you will wear...Seek first the Kingdom of God." (Matt. 6:25, 33). We should never underestimate the impact that just one person, living the Gospel in his radical fullness, can have upon the world.

We also commemorate Respect Life Sunday in the Church today. Our Church, from its very beginning, has championed respect for life in all its forms and at all its stages and while much of its efforts is to abolish the right to terminate the life of an unborn child in the womb, and to establish the same legal protections that you and I enjoy to those who are as yet unborn, our respect for life must also find expression in opposing war, improving healthcare and education, caring better for the elderly, extending quality healthcare to all, especially the mentally ill, and creating a world in which no one would ever dream of ending a pregnancy early or terminating the life of a terminally ill person. And so, we all have a lot of work to do, but let us never grow tired of struggle to protect the precious gift of life. God bless you all,

- ♦ Although October 3 is the Twenty-Seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time, we remember and honor Saint Francis, whose Feast Day is October 4, with some of the music of the Mass. The texts of the Offertory Song, "Prayer of Saint Francis", and Hymn after Dismissal, "All Creatures of Our God and King", of the Masses this weekend paraphrase texts attributed to Saint Francis. "Make Me an Instrument of Your Peace" was actually not a prayer of Saint Francis, as it first appeared in a French spiritual magazine, *La Clochette*, in 1912. But the original Canticle of the Sun, which is paraphrased and translated in the hymn "All Creatures of Our God and King", was according to tradition composed by Francis in 1224 while he was recovering from an illness, and first sung by Francis and his companions Brother Angelo and Brother Leo in 1226 when Francis was on his deathbed. We do not know what the music for the original version of the song as written in the Umbrian dialect of Italian sounded like.
- ♦ "All Creatures of Our God and King" and our Entrance Hymn, "I Sing the Mighty Power of God", give praise and thanks to God for Creation. The Entrance Hymn was chosen to reflect the Entrance Antiphon, which speaks of all Creation as established solely by the will of God, who is Lord of all things.
