**Vocations**

Many faithful men are being called to serve the Church through the priesthood, but few answer the call. As our Lord says, *“Do not be afraid; just have faith.”* If you think you might be called and want to talk about it, call Father Jason Hage (315) 470-1468, or write: [vocations@syradio.org](mailto:vocations@syradio.org).

The author of *The Cloud of Unknowing* prays, “That which I am and the way that I am, with all my gifts of nature and grace, you have given to me, O Lord, and you are all this. I offer it all to you, principally to praise you and to help my fellow Christians and myself.” Knowing that God sustains us in being is the key to faith. All that we need to do is to love God as God is and the rest will begin to fall into place. God made us in His image and desires that we have life. God also desires that we be healed of all of our wounds, especially those caused by sin, and know his loving touch. Being weighed down by negativity, imperfections, the cares of the world, and weakness is not something that God desires.

Faith can profoundly change how we see God, ourselves, and one another. It gives a clearer lens through which to see life and connects us with the powerful virtues of love and hope. Three friends journeying with us through all that we encounter, faith, hope, and love, help us experience God’s embrace and heal us. All we have to do is let God be who God is and not foolishly try to make Him into what we need or want Him to be. Without God we cease to be. It’s that simple. The very blood that flows through my veins and the life that I have come directly from Divine origins. With this knowledge of who God is and who I am, I can open my ears and hear the powerful words Jesus speaks, “Do not be afraid, just have faith.” Trust begins.

When we are struggling, we naturally reach out for God because we know that a divine remedy is the only remedy. But, in doing so we wrestle with letting God take charge. We want something more miraculous and visible than the obvious and have difficulty in finding consolation simply resting in God’s presence. Our naked being, stripped of any pretense or self-serving agenda, is being called to rest in and love the uncreated Presence of God. Reach out in love to God. Ask God to heal you from all that separates you from Him. Put aside any ideas of God that create barriers between you and God’s tender and endearing presence. *The Cloud of Unknowing* leaves us with wisdom, “think of yourself and of him in the same way, that is, with the simple awareness that he is as he is and that you are as you are.” This is a meeting of two friends who desire nothing more than to share life together. ©LPi

## Cemetery News

Dear Parishioners:

The St. Mary's Cemetery Committee has undertaken a review of the existing condition of our cemetery and ways to improve its appearance and suitability for burial of cremains.

If you see an area of the cemetery you might be interested in for yourself or a loved one, please call the Parish Office [635-5762] and speak to Patti Pitts.

Also, the Cemetery Committee is exploring the possibility of authorizing the construction of a Columbarium to be dedicated by the Bishop with forty-eight niches for the sacred resting place of cremains. "The Church recognizes there are legitimate reasons for cremation including 'sanitary, economic or social' circumstances but it states that 'the ashes of the faithful must be laid to rest in a sacred place, that is, in a cemetery or, in certain cases, in a church or an area, which has been set aside for this purpose, and so dedicated by the competent ecclesial authority.'" Catholic Burial And Cremation | Simply Catholic. The estimated cost of a niche without engraving or opening fees would be approximately \$2,000. If you feel that the Cemetery Committee should pursue this objective, please email trustee John Brunetti at [johnjohnsephbrunetti@gmail.com](mailto:johnjohnsephbrunetti@gmail.com).

In an effort to improve the appearance of the cemetery, the Cemetery Committee plans to make the effort to enforce the Rules which have been in existence for many years and are posted at both entrances which read as follows: "One basket, pot or bouquet, not to exceed 12 inches, may be placed on each grave from April 1 through October 31. One Winter Wreath or spray is permitted from November 1 through March 31. In-ground planting of annual flowers is permitted as a substitute for baskets, pots or bouquets. Planting must be within 12 inches in front of the monument. Trees, shrubbery, benches, fences and other enclosures, vigil lights, glass or plastic flower blocks, artificial flowers, shepherd's hooks are forbidden." **Families are urged to remove items that are not in compliance with Rules by June 30<sup>th</sup> after which they may be removed by cemetery personnel.**


