August 15, 2021 * 20th Sunday * Ordinary Time



Dear Friends,

This weekend in our faith journey we celebrate the Assumption of the Blessed Mother Mary. We have been taught that Mary was assumed into heaven upon her death. This is the belief of the Catholic Church, Eastern Orthodox Churches, Oriental Orthodoxy, Church of the East and some Lutheran and Anglo-Catholic Churches.

I have always had a reverence for Mary since I was a child. I had a shrine on my dresser in my bedroom for her. I had another outdoors in one of my mother's gardens with a statue of Mary and her mother Anne, that my grandfather gave me. Every May beautiful flowers from my mother's gardens decorated my bedroom shrine and the ones dedicated to Mary in my grammar school classrooms.

My mother had a favorite prayer dedicated to Mary called the Memorare. This prayer was particularly important to me when my mother and father were both in dire health and I was being called upon to make serious decisions. I prayed it and the Blessed Mother came to my aid. I will always remember that moment.

Assumption. Many years ago I attended a seminar with the diocese. A gerontology physician asked us how we wanted to die. You probably can imagine all the answers, "in my sleep, without pain", etc. After all the attendees responded he asked if all the answers were expressed. I raised my hand and said no. He asked how did I want to die. I said I wanted to be assumed.

Not to be presumptuous but having a dad who was a funeral director and having some experience in the human passing of life, I thought then, and still with all humility do today, I would like to be assumed. Even with a fear of open heights, I would close my eyes tight and pray for the deliverance to eternal life.

The probability of this is certainly questionable, but I have always been one who is open to things others might believe are unimaginable.

When I was ordained November 11, 1983, I chose for my Gospel the Magnificat of Mary (Luke 1:46-55). Today, I still rejoice in God my savior. I pray I will be humble enough always to echo the Blessed Mother in saying, "may His will be done."

I hope as we celebrate this feast day of Mary's Assumption, we can all humbly pray to rejoice that we will say, "yes" to the Lord's will for each of us.

Speaking of the possibility of being assumed, it is my intention to live for a long time, God willing! This past Thursday, August 12th at 5:31 PM I turned 66 years old! Do I say ouch? No!!! I am one who always says "I am still young, just not as young as I used to be." And that's the truth! Everyday!

I am so, so grateful for my life. I believe we should celebrate our natal day every year and rejoice for the breath of life that fills our lungs.

Some people like to pass on their birthdays, ignore them or just gloss over them. I cannot disagree more. Perhaps you are familiar with the noted theologian Henri Nouwen. He said something I thoroughly embrace. Henri said "Birthdays need to be celebrated. I think it is more important to celebrate a birthday than a successful exam, a promotion, or a victory. Because to celebrate a birthday means to say to someone: 'Thank you for being you.' Celebrating a birthday is exalting life and being glad for it. On a birthday we do not say: 'Thanks for what you did, or said, or accomplished.' No, we say: 'Thank you for being born and being among us.'" I share my birthday with many individuals. How blessed I am to have shared the day with Gladys who is now in heaven. I continue to share my day with Jeff, Dan, Matt, Sarah, and Clyde. I couldn't be happier than to pray for these individuals all having birthdays alongside me. As Henri Nouwen proclaimed, "Birthdays are so important. On our birthdays we celebrate being alive. On our birthdays people can say to us, "thank you for being!" I am thrilled these folks are alive in my life. AND, thank you to all of you who affirm my life today and always!!!

In closing, I was among the best circle of friends who are the Lord's ministers when I was in Macedon New York. These women and men nurtured my faith and spirit beyond my expectations. They still do though they have all retired (not me of course) and we were blessed to gather last week at Muddy Waters in Palmyra New York. In the enclosed picture are my beloved Carol Holtz-Martin who was Pastor of the Baptist Church in Macedon, Don Turk who was Pastor of the Methodist Churches in Perinton, and Shelia Swanger, who was Pastor of the Methodist Church in Henrietta. Their spouses, Dana, Ruth and Jim are with us in the photograph.

I also want to acknowledge Ruth Kinsey who pastored the Quaker Church in Pumpkin Hook and Steve Howarth who was Pastor at Western Presbyterian in Palmyra. These two also have blessed not only myself but Carol, Don and Shelia.

Solemnity of the Assumption

The Feast of the Assumption of the blessed Virgin Mary celebrates Mary, Mother of God, being assumed body and soul, at her death into heaven. It is the oldest feast of Our Lady celebrated by the Catholic Church.

Catholics have believed for centuries that the Blessed Virgin was assumed into heaven at her death. In 1950, Pope Pius XII, proclaimed Mary's Assumption as a dogma of the Church, officially recognizing this belief as a true and necessary part of our Catholic beliefs about the Mother of God.

The feast of the Assumption of Mary is a solemn or 1st class feast and hence a Holy Day of Obligation, celebrated each year on the 15th of August. This year, Aug 15 is a Sunday and since the Assumption is a first class feast, it supersedes the 20th Sunday of Ordinary Time.

The Assumption of Mary points to the dignity and destiny of our human body and turns our eyes to our true life beyond the grave. As we gather to show our love and affection for our Blessed Mother, we bring glory to her Son, Jesus.

We pray:

Most holy and pure Virgin Mary, help us to have great respect for our bodies and the bodies of others recognizing in them the temple of the Holy Spirit as we look forward to seeing each other, body and soul, with you & your son, Jesus, the Christ, forever in heaven.

I resisted going to AA even when I told about getting drunk in confession and was given the penance of going to an AA meeting. I was tenaciously protecting my disease. When I finally was ready , AA was there for me. Part of the program is to "carry the message." Miraculously, my God helped me to be an example to my beautiful friend and neighbor, Megan. I am so grateful that she had the humility and courage to reach out to me and through the gift of my sobriety, the hand of AA was there to help.



Care of the Earth



A recent study found that just four types of plastic make up nearly half of all the trash in the ocean. Our oceans are drowning in a plastic pollution crisis. Plastic wrappers, plastic bags, plastic cutlery and plastic bottles, collectively account for 44% of all trash in the ocean. These are items we encounter every day. When you order take-out, your food automatically is bagged in plastic, complete with an individual wrapped set of plastic cutlery. If you're out on a hot day and need to quench your thirst, you almost certainly have no choice but to buy a plastic bottle of water. And these items—most of which we only use for a few moments—almost always wind up in the ocean... only 9% of plastic gets recycled.

One thing is clear...

The only way to keep plastic out of the ocean is to make less of it!!!

So...why can't we sing? When can we sing again?

These are some of the most-asked questions I have gotten over the last year. I wish I had a crystal ball and an answer for you! Up until the last week or so, the members of our music ministry have felt comfortable having a small ensemble of fully vaccinated choir members provide live vocal music at our Masses since the beginning of June while waiting for a green light from the Diocese to allow congregational singing to resume. (We're still waiting, which means that we should not be singing in the congregation. It truly hurts my heart to type this.) It has been wonderful to see our choir members back in action again and to hear some new music as preludes before the Masses and during the Preparation of the Gifts for Communion. My heartfelt thanks to each and every one of our choir members for the gifts they share which make our celebrations more joyous and also allow us to pray in ways that go beyond mere words.

However, the only constant we can count on is change...and it is already happening in the form of the Delta variant of the COVID-19 virus. **It is time for us all to pull back from live vocal music as we head into the unknown of the fall in order to keep each other safe.** Cases are on the rise – breakthrough infections in fully vaccinated people?! – and I take this topic extremely seriously. Though I have not yet met everyone who attends Mass in person or online in the chat box, I care about each of you. I would never want to make a decision that would harm any member of our St. Catherine's family.

In trying to stay on top of the various bits of information regarding the Delta variant and why scientists are concerned, I learned that the original COVID virus strain had an R2 replication quotient rating. This means that every person infected with the virus could infect two people. The Delta variant has an R8 rating, meaning that an infected person could spread the virus to as many as eight other people. (source: <https://health.clevelandclinic.org/delta-variant-mask-guidance/> as of 7/30/21)

So, to those in our congregation who are yearning to sing out loud and strong...I am so with you! I long for the day that our cantors can say, "Please stand and SING OUR GATHERING HYMN..." I'm pretty sure that I will not be the only one with tears in my eyes that day as I hear your beautiful voices gathering together in worship and praise of our loving Father...who certainly knows how hard it is for us to keep our joyous voices silent. In the meantime, please let the voices of our combined choirs from St. Catherine's and Transfiguration be our voices as we quietly hold the words to the songs in our hearts. I thank God for the ability to record over 100 songs with our friends in the choir at Transfiguration since last April to use in our Masses! We are already working to begin adding some more songs to our collection over the next week or so. Our instrumental musicians will still be able to enhance our liturgies through the addition of guitar, percussion, and piano. Thank God!

Let us keep each other as safe as we possibly can (by not singing – for now) so that St. Catherine's continues to be a place where all feel safe, comfortable, and loved. Let us do the hard work to protect one another so that maybe, just maybe, we'll be safe enough to sing together, "O come, all ye faithful, joyful and triumphant" at the beginning of our Christmas liturgies. Whenever we can finally sing together as the body of Christ without anxiety or concern for each other will truly be joyful and very triumphant. Thank you for your (quiet but heartfelt) support! 


