



"Love your neighbor as yourself."


- Saint Paul (1 Thessalonians 5:18)

Journal Questions

- · The prerequisite of loving others is loving yourself. What does it mean to love yourself?
- · What is an experience you had that lied to you about your dignity
- What is an experience you had that revealed your dignity to you?
- . If you could put one name to it, which lie do you tell yourself the most? What single word or label would most effectively counteract that lie?
- Are you taking care of your basic human needs? In the areas of rest, cleanliness, exercise, nutrition... how are you doing? What is one area where you would like to improve?


- . Speak truth: Identify your primary lie and renounce it out loud by saying, "In the name of Jesus, I renounce the lie that I am ..." Then identify the truth you most need to hear that counteracts that lie. Say it out loud, "I claim the truth that I am..."
- · Reflect on what false and unrealistic ideals you have for yourself that are exhausting you. Identify them, then get intentional about rejecting them!
- Make self-care a priority and do one concrete thing to treat yourself this week (and ideally, on a regular basis)!

· Prayerfully reflect on the following: "You are a priority to God, become a priority to yourself!"

FEED THE HUNGRY

So many people in our world do not have enough food. Ways we can help include: not wasting food, donating food to food banks, cook/serve for a soup kitchen, donate money.



Being thirsty is not just about wanting a drink. It is also about having clean water that you can drink and use for cooking and cleaning. We can help by not wasting water in our homes, donate money to a clean water project, carry water bottles in cooler in our car to give to homeless people.



St. Rita of Cascia (1381 - 1457) had the opportunity to live her life as a wife, mother, widow, and eventually, member of a religious community. Born in central Italy, St. Rita felt the calling to become a nun, but was pressured at a young age into marriage. During her 18-year marriage to a cruel man, she raised two sons. When her husband was killed in a brawl and her sons died, St. Rita decided to go back to her first love and attempted to join the Augustinian nuns in Cascia. Her status widow caused some complications to her entering, but she eventually succeeded in professing vows.


Throughout her lifetime, St. Rita of Cascia was known for her prayerfulness and charity. She also experienced stigmata on her forehead, meditated frequently on Christ's passion, and cared for the nuns of her religious community and those in the lay community who came to her for counsel.


