

Announcement

Last week's announcement came as a surprise to us ALL! To be clear this is what was said:

Bishop Lucia is pleased to announce that after much consultation and discussion with both clergy and lay leadership of the parishes in Western Broome, seven parishes will form a new Pastoral Care Area (PCA) effective July 1, 2022.

The PCA will now be comprised of Our Lady of Good Counsel, St. Ambrose, St. Anthony, St. Joseph, Endicott, Church of the Holy Family, Endwell, Our Lady of the Rosary, Maine, and Our Lady of Sorrows, Vestal.

Father Clarence Rumble remains pastor of Church of the Holy Family, Endwell and Most Holy Rosary, Maine, as linked parishes.

Father Ken Kirkman remains pastor of the Parish of St. Anthony and St. Joseph, Endicott and is appointed pastor of St. Ambrose, Endicott, as linked parishes Our Lady of Good Counsel, Endicott and Our Lady of Sorrows, Vestal, will share a pastor, Father Rick Prior.

This new configuration is to facilitate even greater collaboration among parishes and further the mission of the Church.

Father Donovan is assigned Pastor of Sacred Heart Cicero.

Father Prior is a native son of Our Lady of Sorrows, graduated from Vestal in 1981. He was ordained in 2001. I am certain you will learn the more important details when he arrives and do not doubt he will be welcomed as warmly I was in 2017!


Newsletter



WHY DO WE DO THAT? Catholic Life Explained

At a parish council meeting, our pastor mentioned the need for deacons. It is something I am considering. How do I know if I have


a vocation? What steps should I take next?

Any and all gifts that the Holy Spirit gives to the church are for the good of the community. As members of the Body of Christ, what one member does affects all. What the body does also affects each member. A vocation or call to ministry is tested and verified by the church. Through prayer, instruction, and service, a vocation is tested, and then acknowledged by the official call to orders or to service.

If you are considering becoming a deacon, the first step would be to talk to your pastor. He will be able to give you more specific information on the program in your diocese, what is expected of you, and how you apply. You might also begin to see a spiritual director, someone who can help you with your faith journey and vocation discernment. They do so by focusing on prayer, your relationship with God, and spiritual practices. Finally, you'll need to see the diocesan vocation director in charge of deacons to apply. Best wishes!

St. Joan of Arc (1412 - 1431) has had her story told throughout history through many books, movies and plays. She was born in the village of Domrémy, near the province of Lorraine, to a French peasant family. At a young age, she began to experience visions and voices, which were later identified to be of St. Michael. St. Catherine of Alexandria. and St. Margaret of Antioch. At the age of 13, all three saints told her that she was to drive the English from French territory, and that she must bring the Dauphin to Reims for his coronation. Trusting in God, she did as she was told.

During the Hundred Years War, St. Joan of Arc led French troops against the English and recaptured the cities of Orléans and Troyes. Captured near Compiegne the following year, she was sold to the English and placed on trial for heresy and witchcraft, eventually being found guilty and burned at the stake in Rouen.

St. Joan of Arc was canonized by Pope Benedict XV on May 16, 1920, and is the patron saint of military members.


