MULL-ING THINGS OVER

It was cold and snowy as I pulled out of the Church parking lot heading to a home in the country. I was bringing Holy Communion to a woman who was a daily Mass attendee and she had had surgery. I called to see if she wanted Holy Communion and she seemed quite grateful for the offer. Little did I know I would be traveling in a snowstorm. The roads had been plowed but in some places the wind had blown the snow across the road drifting and making it slippery. As I turned down her road, I could feel the back of the car sway. She told me to watch for a lighted Christmas Tree. There it was, in full lights, showing me the way. I backed down the drive ready for a quick getaway!

I knocked on the door and she called to let myself in. As I came in, I kicked the snow off my shoes then removed them – didn't want to track snow through the house. She was seated in the living room. Welcomed me. There was a fire in the fireplace blazing away. She had a little table with a candle lighted and a white cloth spread out. I placed the Eucharist there. Next to the chair to which I moved was a lovely Christmas Tree. I seated myself watching her. She seemed agitated. I asked if everything was all right. She told me that she had let her little puppy out and he had not come back yet. With the storm, she was afraid something might have happened to him. I told her that I would give her Holy Communion and then go out and see if I could find him. Of course, this was my first time at this house – wasn't sure where I would look.

We sat, settled ourselves, and began the prayers. First, I shared the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick with her. We prayed for her improved health, for those who were assisting her, and for others who were sick. I then retrieved the Blessed Sacrament and we began the Lord's Prayer. I gave her Holy Communion. As we prayed silently, I could hear the fire crackling and the sweet smell of the wood. It almost seemed as if I was sitting in a picture from a Christmas card. I blessed her house, blessed her Christmas Tree, and said a little prayer for the puppy. Then, I blessed the woman. As I finished, I stood and asked the dog's name. "Henry," she responded. "Where would you suggest that I begin looking?" She suggested out the front door – that was where she let him out. I put my shoes, coat and gloves on and opened the door.

As I stepped out on the porch, I noticed a figure moving toward me. It was a gentleman, he greeted me and Identified myself. He was a neighbor down the road. I noticed in his arms he had a blanket. I explained that I had brought Holy Communion and heard that the dog was still out. He smiled, walked by me, took "Henry" out of the blanket and handed him to his owner. She was delighted. He told her how he had been out in the barn and saw the little dog come into the light. She was barking and disturbed the cows. He recognized it and picked him up. He was shivering so the gentleman wrapped her in a blanket, put her in the truck and took her up the road. "Henry" seemed very placid as he sat in the woman's lap. I had walked in behind him and closed to door and was taking off my coat as the woman invited us all to tea.

The gentleman put on the kettle, I got cups and the lady of the house told me where she hid the Christmas cookies. Soon, we were all sitting in the living room, drinking tea, munching on cookies and telling our stories. The woman had obviously calmed down and was very relaxed. Henry had fallen asleep and seemed completely comfortable and "at home." I heard a lot about what you do when you raise cows and there is a snowstorm. Soon, I announced that I would be on my way. I still had to drive back to the rectory and the snow was still falling. I started to pick up, but the others told me to leave things where they were. They would take care of them. I put my coat and shoes on and made for the door, petted Henry, and was gone into the night.

This Sunday is the Third Sunday of Advent. John the Baptist was heard in today's Scripture calling everyone to "Get ready! Prepare the way of the Lord." Something big was about to happen and the world was not quite ready for this arrival. Very soon, the wonderful words of the Christmas story will be read, and we will once again transport ourselves to Bethlehem. There we will recall the Birth of Our Savior and be reminded that we possess this treasured story to tell family and friends Besides reading the Christmas story, however, we are also called to live it. Little incidences like finding Henry, share a "tea moment" with a housebound person, sharing prayer, a sacrament and friendship are all mystical ways that God continues to come to us and remind us of His love for us and His willingness to share life with us. A Christmas cookie and a cup of tea became a celebration not only of the recovery of Henry but also a rediscovery of God.

GIVING THANKSGIVING THANKS

The Grinch may have tried to steal Christmas, but he didn't have a chance of getting rid of Thanksgiving at Our Lady of Peace. Through all the problems of the time "it came just the same". Seventy-one volunteers showed up over the three workdays that it took to make this Holiday happen! We fed over 900 people and included 4 area migrant camps - we fed the folks that feed us! And oh, were there ever donations; coffee, cookies, apples, canned goods, stuffing and 3 turkeys. Though we had to purchase turkeys and at a prime price this year, we received generous donations of money and gift cards, which helped to cover the costs.

Pizza was donated for the workers' lunch on distribution day as well as Italian cookies. Who were the workers? I usually don't give a list of names because someone is inadvertently left out. This year teens and senior citizens stood side by side, 6 feet apart with masks, to work on this project. Rotary Teens, our own Our Lady of Peace Youth Group, Parish Council members, Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, our maintenance men and my husband John! There was no gathering in the hall to wait for your basket, names were called in, boxes and turkeys selected and put into trunks of cars. That was a lot of carrying of boxes and 20 lb. turkeys, but they did it. Books from Geneva Reads were tucked into every box, a treat for kiddies at home these days. Ten agencies came to pick up baskets for their clients and the crew chief for the migrant workers sent his helpers for theirs. Geneva community members who signed up with me came and had their baskets put into their cars.

There was a great spirit in the room-on every day we worked. Father Tom blessed the food and workers on the first day and that Blessing carried through the entire weekend. Yes, "it came just the same". I hope you had a wonderful Thanksgiving, I want you to know that hundreds of others did, as well, because of you.

Celebración de la Fiesta de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe: 12 de dic. en la iglesia San Francisco

N. Sra. de Guadalupe, Madre de Cristo

Sí, cuando miramos la imagen de Nuestra Señora de Guadalupe, debemos estar muy conscientes que ella es una mujer indígena encinta, esperando el nacimiento de su hijo. Lo que es importante en la vida de María es que ella es la madre de Dios. Ningún otro ser humana ha tenido ese honor. No solamente es la madre de Cristo, cuando aceptó la invitación del ángel Gabriela con “hágase en mí tal como has dicho,” pero también es la primera discípula de Jesucristo. Ella llevó el mensaje de Cristo a la casa de Isabel al proclamar la grandeza de Dios y cómo su espíritu se alegraba en Cristo. Ella vivió el mensaje de su hijo durante su vida y después de la muerte de Jesús.

Lo que Jesucristo enseñaba y hacía durante sus años de ministerio público al entrar la casa de Isabel ella proclamó como necesario: deshacer a los soberbios, derribar a los poderosos de sus tronos, exaltar a los humildes, colmar de bienes a los hambrientos, dar socorro a Israel. Fue María de Guadalupe que dio el mensaje: “Yo soy la perfecta siempre Virgen María, Madre del verdadero Dios por quien se vive.” Así fue la esperanza de María de Guadalupe que los pueblos pudieran abrirse al mensaje de Cristo y vivirlo. Ella es la evangelizadora de México. Ella es la fuente de la alegría de México y de toda América.

Espero que podamos apreciar el significado de la aparición de María al indígena Juan Diego en Tepeyac cuando los de Europa habían estado en México pocos años. Así mostró que no solamente a los europeos que María estaba prestando atención, sino también al Mundo Nuevo y a los indígenas. Baja presurosa a Tepeyac y a Juan Diego para mostrarlo su ternura y su cariño. Y así estaba mostrando a nosotros esa misma ternura y el amor. Su aparición y el milagro de las rosas en invierno nos ayudan saber que era causa de aumentar la fe en Cristo—ella siendo la proclamadora de su Hijo.

Ojalá que la celebración de la Eucaristía hoy en honor de ella y su mensaje de fe en su Hijo, su evangelio y seguimiento sean una ayuda para nosotros de ser más fieles en nuestra fe cristiana. La celebración no es solamente una de María sino es el mensaje del seguimiento de Cristo. Esta fiesta es en el medio del tiempo de Adviento; es un tiempo cuando debemos salir al encuentro del Señor. De nuevo comenzamos una jornada de discipulado. Estamos llamados a ser discípulos por Jesús y por María. Debemos preguntarnos si somos de Cristo o no. ¿Tenemos una verdadera fe en Cristo? ¿Intentamos conocer a Jesucristo? ¿Leemos la biblia, especialmente los evangelios? ¿Estamos dispuestos a aprender de Jesucristo y de ser siervos del Señor? ¿Estamos siguiendo a ese Cristo del Nuevo Testamento? ¿Estamos preparándonos para recibir a Cristo en las formas que El nos viene hoy: en la Palabra, en la comunidad y en la liturgia? ¿El ejemplo de vida de Jesús nos ayuda a vivir más cristianamente y menos centrados en nosotros mismos? ¡Adelante vamos!
