### MULL-ING THINGS OVER

We have reached the Fourth Sunday of Advent. It seems like we were just celebrating Thanksgiving and suddenly here we are – the week of Christmas! Before we rush off to “Jingle Bells,” we have one more week of Advent to observe and celebrate. Even though it has gone by quickly, we still need to observe this week. The central focus of the week is Mary – Jesus’ Mother. She was a young woman when visited by the Angel Gabriel. God’s question to her, “Will you be the mother of my Son,” must have stunned her and frightened her at the same time. She knew nothing about being a mother and was only recently married to Joseph. She had, however, confidence in God’s Word and trusted God implicitly: “May it be done to me according to your Word.” She trusted the Lord. Her assent was all God needed to move his plan of redemption along. Jesus was immaculately conceived, and the Word became flesh in her womb. But, what would this mean to Mary? What is this all about?

Mary is our model in times of crisis. We pray, “Lord what does this mean?” Most times we receive no answer, but we trust and believe. If it is God’s Will everything will work out as it should be even though I do not understand. Joseph and Mary packed their bags and headed to Bethlehem because Joseph was of the House of David and had been told to report in Bethlehem for the census and to be taxed. It became part of the wait for her child. I wonder how many times she wished that her baby was already here? With a mother’s excitement, I wonder what she thought of the long journey to Bethlehem? Pregnant, newly married, traveling a great distance, not knowing anyone, and yet both Joseph and Mary believed – God would make sure everything came out all right! They set out and made history.

We have been victims of waiting. Last March, when Covid-19 hit, many of us thought we would have a few months to deal with this illness and then it would be brought under control. What was to be maybe a three/four-month wait has become ten months and still counting! Many have become impatient waiting for this thing to end. We struggle with the virus, with the joblessness, with the fear, with isolation, and with unanswered question. When someone we know dies of the virus, it becomes that much more real, and we become even sadder! There is a long-distance sorrow that we cannot quench. We want this over now! And, still, we move on, we go back to work, we put on that mask, we socially distance and pray not to get sick. Our patience runs thin and still we go on. Advent this year has reminded us that we are Advent people – even though we have met Christ, we continue to try to make sense out of this illness and challenge ourselves to move on. Our heroes’ list keeps multiplying and the battle continues. We discover once again the need for patience and trusting that God will bring something good out of this.

As we approach the celebration of Christmas 2020, we are well aware of the many families who have experienced death in this past year – a higher than normal number! This will be the first Christmas without their loved one. Pray for them. There is very little else you can do; but, embracing them in prayer and lifting them up to the Lord allows them to know they are loved, and others join in their mourning. All the safeguards we are asked to follow are not simply to protect ourselves but also to protect others. This illness requires us to think of others and realize that we are all in this together. If we are part of the fight together; then, we also must be part of the recovery together. We cannot stop thinking of the extended hurting that goes on after death. We can’t simply breathe a sigh of relief that COVID missed me. Carrying the dead in our prayers is a promise that they will not be forgotten, and that love continues beyond death. So, pray for our friends!

These final days of Advent are also days for us not to think of ourselves (What do I want for Christmas?) but rather to think how grateful we are to have others. Those who have suffered with Covid know what it means to experience the support and love of others. They know how important it is for others to come together and encircle a loved one with care. Christmas, after all, is the very action of God encircling us, bring us together to receive His Son – not as a singular Savior but the Savior of all. So, as we approach Christmas this week, keep your eyes and ears open, listen for those opportunities to be of help to others showing not only your care but your willingness to be part of a solution. These are dramatic times and they require dynamic resolutions. When we come to Christmas Day, we want to celebrate that moment when heaven touched earth and Jesus joined humanity. We also want to celebrate our commitment to let the spirit of Christmas live on in and through us. The real proof that Jesus was here is the Church, her sacraments and Jesus joining us in worship and prayer. It is also in the charity, sense of direction, openness to God’s life-giving Presence today telling us we have become an instrument of Jesus coming in the world just as Mary was that instrument. May Christmas bring us the joy of being for others. On behalf of our wonderful staff, Merry Christmas to all – we hold you in our prayers.
