MULL-ING THINGS OVER

It is Christmas weekend. We have had the holiday, but its spirit continues. The decorations are bright, and the memories are fresh. We can still take a night drive and appreciate the twinkling lights and the elaborate designs. Winter weather has come but we bundle up and enjoy the sights and sounds of this season. It is a warm contrast to the reality of the sickness and death which seems to surround us. We are living the reality of our Church's teaching that sickness and death cannot overcome our hope and our living another day. If Christmas teaches us anything, it is to be hopeful and remember God is with us in the good times and the bad.

This Sunday is traditionally called Holy Family Sunday. It centers on Jesus, Mary and Joseph who still share that stable, the warm blankets the townsfolk brought them, and the tasty food that has been shared with them since the birth. The angels have departed but the shepherds continue to meander around. Many folks from town have come out to meet the Holy Family. In its own little way Bethlehem has become home to the Holy Family. Maybe the song of the angels had indeed touched the hearts of all who believe.

This year, particularly, we have rediscovered family. We have been forced to go home. We have been told to shelter in place. Many of the area's social activities have been cancelled and we have been warned to stay away from crowds and remain in place in our homes. Meals are now shared regularly. Family chores and family activities seem to have slowed down and we feel comfortable spending time with one another. In its way this seems the perfect time to celebrate Holy Family Sunday. In a sad and challenging way, we have been forced to rediscover our families and be reminded how important it really is.

On December 8th, Pope Francis declared The Year of Joseph. It began on December 8, 2020 and will conclude on December 8, 2021. During this year, we are invited to focus in on Joseph the Patron Saint of the Universal Church; Joseph the foster-father of Jesus (the Son of God) Joseph the husband of Mary; Joseph the man of faith; Joseph the protector of the Holy Family; Joseph the dreamer; and, Joseph the Patron of a Happy Death! Many of you may remember that when Francis was elected Pope, he placed his reign under the patronage of St. Joseph. It was at that time that he asked and then directed that Joseph's name be added to the Eucharistic Prayer so that his intercession could be requested at every Mass that was to be celebrated. I, also, have a special devotion to St. Joseph as Bishop Hogan chose to ordain me a priest on the Feast of St. Joseph in 1976. Joseph was Bishop Hogan's patron Saint and one that he suggested to me as patron of my priestly ministry. This invitation I eagerly accepted.

Joseph, of course, was an integral to the Holy Family. He was the protector, the guide and the provider. Fortunately, his job as a carpenter was one that easily adapted to any place God would lead him to live: Bethlehem, Egypt, or Nazareth. Apparently, he was pretty good at his craft because he was sought out for repair work and new pieces of furniture. Joseph was a man of faith – he regularly attended synagogue and with Mary would have been the first teacher of Jesus in the Hebrew Faith and by his way of life would have taught Jesus about God, the world and a way of life. Next to Mary, Joseph would have been the closest individual to Jesus shaping him and helping him understand the plan of life that God had in store for Him. We do not have a lot of written material about Joseph but if results teach us anything – Jesus turned out to be a solid Man and Joseph was his primary male influence in growing up. We often picture Joseph on his deathbed with Jesus and Mary at his side. They mourn as his agony ends in death, but they are united until the end. They were together throughout life, now they are together at the end. We have no account of his death – but, know Jesus and Mary would have been with him through the end of Life.

As we take time in these days between Christmas and New Year's Day and Christmas and the Feast of the Epiphany, perhaps we can step back for a few moments and reflect on who the people are in our life that formed us, stood by us and (in some cases) we have led to the doors of heaven in Death. These are family days when we continue to join with our family and celebrate the sights and sounds of the Season. It is a time when we rejoice that we are alive and are looking forward to the infinite possibilities of a new year. This year we call upon Joseph to guide us, bring us strength and help us continue to deal with the virus and its hold on us. God promises to remain with us and does so with faithful people like Joseph. St. Joseph pray for us. Holy Family, hold us in your hands. People of Faith, embrace the New Year!

Stewardship Reflection

“Rejoice always, pray constantly, give thanks in all circumstances; for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus for you.” (Thessalonians 5:16-18) This scripture reading sums up Stewardship. “Rejoice always” means place your trust in God; He will provide all that you need. “Pray constantly” means prayer should be a running conversation with God throughout the whole day, every day. “Give thanks in all circumstances” means even in bad situations, thank God. Suffering a little bit helps build empathy for others in similar situations and shows our dependence on God.

Did you know?

St. Francis-St. Stephen School partners with St. Pauly Textile Inc. to collect used clothing and textiles. The school receives payment for these items, which are then distributed both here in the U.S. and worldwide to people who need them. St. Pauly collects over 120,000 pounds of clothing every day and estimates that this clothing ends up in 44 different countries yearly. In 2017 the company was able to help keep over 20 million articles of clothing out of landfills. The company was founded 22 years ago in Rochester and is an A+ rated member of the Better Business Bureau. Accepted items include clothing, shoes, sneakers, belts, purses, blankets, sheets, drapes, linens, pillow-cases and stuffed animals. Donors are asked to donate items in a plastic bag to protect against dirt and the elements. Receipts are available in a small box located on the shed which is located in the school parking lot. Please keep us in mind when you are cleaning out your closets. Your donation helps the school and the environment!
