MULL-ING THINGS OVER

Wow, time flies by us quickly when we are having a good time! Christmas 2020 is now a memory – it has passed us by. New Year's Eve ringing in 2021 has also happened and we are enjoying this New Year. Today, we are celebrating the Feast of Epiphany, the visitation by the Magi, and the manifestation of the Savior, Jesus Christ, to the world. The days go by and the celebrations of our major feasts occur. I hope you have enjoyed these holidays and I hope you now feel closer to God, family and friends. Yes, the celebration continues.

Today's feast tells the story of the arrival of the Three Kings from the East. Their names were Gaspar, Melchior, and Balthazar. The story is that they were following the star and made it to Jerusalem. They lost the star and sought help from King Herod. Herod advised them to go to Bethlehem which they did. The star re-appeared and led them to the house where Jesus was. They knelt, presented their gifts of gold, mirth and frankincense. Later they left and went home by another route. An angel, in a dream, told them to ignore Herod and return to their homes by another route. This caused King Herod to become very angry and order the slaughter of all infant boys two years old and under.

The Three Kings were foreigners. For this reason, this feast centers on Jesus being the Savior of all people not just the Hebrews. Since he manifested Himself to these foreign kings and received their homage, He was recognized as King of all. Did you ever wonder about their conversation home after this witness? It was a long Journey, so they had had plenty of time to think and reflect. Maybe it took the form of something like this:

"Wow, did you ever see anyone in more poverty," Gaspar exclaimed, "I mean, they were in a stable, they did not have a room for Mary's privacy. The stable was wide open, it was cold and smelled like an animal's stable." The other two kings rode on listening. Melchior responded, "I am not sure what I expected to see. It certainly wasn't what I found. But Joseph and Mary seemed like pretty decent people. They were very hospitable, inviting us in, showing us their wonderful child, offering us food and drink and inviting us into prayer with them." He continued, "They went above and beyond normal hospitality, making us feel like family." Balthazar responded, "There was something very wonderful about our visit! We did not know a soul there; but I felt close to all of them. It was almost a mystical experience as I moved about the room, enjoyed the meal they offered us and visited. I have never talked to a shepherd!" Melchior remarked, "I could hardly believe the story of His birth – the angels and their message, the curious shepherds who appeared in the night looking for a Savior, the townsfolk who came out to see if the stories told in town were true – here they all were, strangers among strangers but all united, all at peace, all so grateful to God."

"Can you imagine that King trying to get us to betray these people so that he could kill them? What is the matter with a man who feels threatened by a tiny baby? What a pitiful person he is," mentioned Gaspar. "Can you imagine what we would be feeling like now if we had done what the king had asked us to do and reported the whereabouts of Jesus? I could not live with myself if I had caused those beautiful babies to be slaughtered!" "Yes," Balthazar said, "Hate can drive a person insane; I am glad we returned by a different route." Gaspar said, "I am a changed man, I don't think I will ever be the same after having had this experience. I thank God! I praise God for choosing me to be part of His plan and for the positive affect this has had on me."

We don't really know what the conversation was about on the way home, but we can be sure they were grateful and, I am sure, Mary and Joseph were grateful as well. Perhaps in the spirit of that gratitude, we, too, should be grateful for the holidays we have just celebrated. God has given us time with family and friends to celebrate the birth of Jesus. We have retold the story of Jesus' birth and been reminded of God's love for us, even in this coronavirus pandemic. We have entered this new year alive and know that God is walking with us in these new days. We have had the opportunity of Advent reflection as we prepared for these holy days and celebrated them – perhaps differently but nonetheless with faith and joy.

Thank you to all who made our Advent/Christmas celebrations special and meaningful. Thanks to our liturgical ministers who fulfilled their commitment and made the churches beautiful and the music sweet. Thanks to Bishop Matano who, even with a busy schedule, took time to celebrate Mass with us for Christmas. Thanks to those who joined us in Church, joined us in live streaming and joined us in prayer. We are all the richer for it. May God bless us in 2021 and may we grow in deeper awareness of one another as we remain healthy and safe. Happy New Year!

Note from the Nurse:

Christmas Blessings to all. I am praying this Christmas season is a healthy and joyful one for you and your family. CoVid-19 continues to be at the forefront of all our minds and as we see 2020 come to an end, unfortunately CoVid -19 will be coming along with us into the New Year.

Hope is on the horizon; as you know vaccines are starting to be administered in Upstate NY to front line health care workers and to the most vulnerable population in our nursing homes. The vaccine gives us hope; however; the need to social distance, perform hand hygiene, and mask up remains a strategy to help stop the spread.

Every day we see the rising numbers in our area and many of you likely know at least one person who has been diagnosed with CoVid. The severity of the disease varies from person to person as do the symptoms. One thing we all likely have in common is CoVid fatigue and frustration. It is important to note that CoVid fatigue and frustration is not an official diagnosis however it is a real symptom of a bigger problem.

I just want to get back to normal, I miss my family, when will this be over?" The mental exhaustion we are all experiencing is real, as well as feelings of sadness and helplessness. All the things that are happening are out of our control. What we can control is how we act and how we care for ourselves and one another.

Self-care is very important, now more than ever. Self-care looks different for everyone, do something for yourself every day, whether that be taking fifteen minutes and focusing on slowing your breath and deep breathing, reading something you enjoy, exercising, or taking a timed nap, do something that refreshes you. Step outside and breathe in the fresh air, open the curtains and let the light in, take a shower and get dressed every day, even if you don't go anywhere.

Do something for someone else, maybe you can call or text someone who is lonely or isolated. Give someone a compliment or acknowledge the struggle they may be having during this time. Be patient, everything seems to be moving slower these days, I truly believe everyone is doing the best they can. Be patient with yourself, it is easy to get dragged down into the negativity this situation has caused, recognize your feelings and the impact it has on those around you, do your best to be positive.

Please stay informed about the vaccine and when it will be available to you, each person is unique, and some may qualify for vaccination before others. The conversation to vaccinate should happen between you and your health care provider, they know you best and can advise you of what is best for you.

FAMILY HOPE CENTER



Did you know?

St. Francis-St. Stephen School partners with St. Pauly Textile Inc. to collect used clothing and textiles. The school receives payment for these items, which are then distributed both here in the U.S. and worldwide to people who need them. St. Pauly collects over 120,000 pounds of clothing every day and estimates that this clothing ends up in 44 different countries yearly. In 2017 the company was able to help keep over 20 million articles of clothing out of landfills. The company was founded 22 years ago in Rochester and is an A+ rated member of the Better Business Bureau. Accepted items include clothing, shoes, sneakers, belts, purses, blankets, sheets, drapes, linens, pillowcases and stuffed animals. Donors are asked to donate items in a plastic bag to protect against dirt and the elements. Receipts are available in a small box located on the shed which is located in the school parking lot. Please keep us in mind when you are cleaning out your closets. Your donation helps the school and the environment!
