MULL-ING THINGS OVER

Lots of things to pray about this week! Tomorrow (January 18), we celebrate the birthday of Martin Luther King. It is not only a day set aside to honor his memory but also a day inviting us to focus in on racism and prejudice which remains a part of our society. As you know, Martin Luther King was assassinated because of his standing for social justice and equality for all people. His preaching and famous words are constant reminders that all people are created equal and endowed with certain rights by God, these have been quoted many times over. This past summer as we saw the Black Lives Matter movement begin and grow, we were told that it isn't just calling for an end to racism that is important but also doing something practical and effective (changing attitudes) that is needed for systemic change. We are called to live in a society that we share with all people. Where we recognize the common nature of all people. Where there is the common decency to view each person as a Child of God and therefore our sister or brother. It is not simply a social change but also a change recognizing what is basic in God's plan.

Martin Luther King Day is not simply a day off from work, or a day to participate in a walk/march, or a day to pray; it is that but also is a day to reflect on our own attitudes. We are called to review our view of people, our relationship with people, and ask ourselves, "Is there more I should be doing to help advance equality and mutual love?" During these pandemic days, we have found that the coronavirus has no prejudice. It attacks every kind of human person. Some may be more prone toward the illness, but those sick in the hospitals are all kinds of people coming from our community. Our funerals are not showing favoritism toward one segment of the population or another – people are dying, and death has no prejudice. Likewise, the love and support that has been expressed in these days has not been bound by racism or prejudice. Look at the lines waiting for the vaccination – it is an array of cultures, colors and societies. The virus does not discriminate. Isn't it strange that when we are in a challenging situation, we tend to be less selective about who we help, who we stand in line with and who should be next? What is Dr. Martin Luther King telling you today?

This week, we will also be inaugurating a new President and Vice-President. The election for these candidates has been hot, divisive, and difficult. The post-election time has been even more divisive. Quite often, after an election, when people coalesce around the victor, we find unity and a sense of direction and purpose. Not so this year! Because of the coronavirus, the Inauguration will be smaller, simpler and involve no parade. There is wondering and great expectation about what will happen before, during and after the ceremony. There will be calls for unity and a common sense of purpose. We will be challenged to remember that we are "one nation under God." Most likely, we will be invited to unite against a common enemy (coronavirus) and focus on mutually helping one another. But, will we do it? The Inauguration Ceremony will begin with a prayer. Quite often, prayer is the one point of unity when we all bow our heads and acknowledge our dependence on the divine. Do you think everyone will be doing that this Wednesday?

The election is over. Whether or not your candidate won, we have a new President and Vice-President. The people have spoken by their ballots! We are called to pray for them. We are invited to unite behind them. We are called to be the united country envisioned by our Constitution. This is not just for the victorious party, nor is it for the favorite candidate – this is for all Americans. We are in battle against an enemy that kills (coronavirus), we are involved in multiple controversial situations throughout the world, we are trying to get back on our feet – to accomplish our mission we must work together. As a new President takes over, he needs our prayer. He needs the guidance of our God (his God), and he needs his country uniting behind him. May this be our prayer as his administration begins.

We also are still in the midst of a pandemic. We are tired, many are sick, there are physical and emotional challenges we need to face every day. We are tired of wearing those masks. We want to sit down with friends and play cards, share a meal, watch a game, enjoy conversation – none of this can be done without safely distancing. We want to feel free and safe when we go out. We want to be free to choose where we go and what we do. But, not yet. We cannot drop our guard. We cannot ease up on protecting ourselves and those closest to us. It is a struggle, it is a cross, but we need the patience to continue. We need the perseverance to be wary just a little while longer. We need to pray and be reminded that God is in this battle with us! Pray for peace. Pray for social justice. Pray for unity. Pray for our leaders. Above all, pray!!!




