Today, we begin the celebration of Catholic Schools' Week. Catholic Schools' Week helps us celebrate St. Francis-St. Stephen School which has a long, long history in the Geneva community (over 150 years!).

For Catholics, prayer is the unique thread which binds us together, connects with God, and helps us form a community of faith together. When we pray, we not only unite with God but also join ourselves with believers throughout the world in the corporate expression of our relationship with God and with those who share our prayer. 

San Pablo en la segunda lectura de hoy quiere que todos vivieran sin preocupaciones. El desea que los solteros y solteras se preocupan de las cosas de Dios. El, siendo un hombre soltero, piensa que su estilo de vida es mejor porque puede dar su tiempo a las cosas de Dios. El piensa que los casados—hombres y mujeres—están divididos en el corazón. Se preocupan de las cosas de esta vida y de cómo agradar a su esposa/esposo.

¿Qué piensan ustedes: es malo que los esposos busquen agradarse? Sería malo de no buscar agradarse. Eso no debe ocurrir solamente durante el noviazgo. Did you know?

St. Francis-St. Stephen School partners with St. Pauly Textile Inc. to collect used clothing and textiles. The school receives payment for these items, which are then distributed both here in the U.S. and worldwide to people who need them. St. Pauly collects over 120,000 pounds of clothing every day and estimates that this clothing ends up in 44 different countries yearly. In 2017 the company was able to help keep over 20 million articles of clothing out of landfills. The company was founded 22 years ago in Rochester and is an A+ rated member of the Better Business Bureau. Accepted items include clothing, shoes, sneakers, belts, purses, blankets, sheets, drapes, linens, pillowcases and stuffed animals. Donors are asked to donate items in a plastic bag to protect against dirt and the elements. Receipts are available in a small box located on the shed which is located in the school parking lot. Please keep us in mind when you are cleaning out your closets. Your donation helps the school and the environment!
