MULL-ING THINGS OVER

Lost and alone, that is the only way that I can describe him. I was locking up the church one Saturday and I noticed a gentleman sitting in the last pew of Church. At first, I thought that I would simply leave the back door unlocked for him to leave and come back and finish my mission. Something drew me to him. I went over to excuse myself, and to say to him that I was going to lock up and how long did he think he would be there. I didn't have to say anything. As I approached, he looked up. "Okay, okay, I am leaving," he said, "you are just like everyone else – throwing me out!" I stopped, looked at him and said, "That is a little unfair, I haven't said anything yet." He looked at me, then said, "Tell me that is not what you were planning to say." I looked at him and said, "Actually, I was coming over to ask you how long you might be here because I am locking up but can easily come back to lock your door after you leave. Stay as long as you wish!" "No, I'll go," he said, "I don't think anything is being accomplished by me being here." He started gathering his things and stood up. I walked over to him and simply said that things look tough.

That opened the door – he started to tell me his story. He sat down again, and I sat a couple of pews ahead of him. He had been a successful businessman and seemed to have everything he wanted: a home, a family, two cars, a good job, friends, opportunities, and money in the bank. He spoke of how grateful he was to God because of the many blessings he had enjoyed. I noticed; he used the past tense. He lost it all. It all started innocently. He had more money than he needed. He began to gamble and was quite successful. He had started out small but then he gambled with more and more money. He said, "So, there was more money and more money. Strange, he said, the more I won the more I wanted." I could not stop. My wife pleaded with me. I told her how we had so much more money because I could gamble and gamble well! She responded telling me that she worried about me because we really didn't need all the money and that she worried about me each time I went on a "binge." She told me my children were afraid of me because I was driven by the need for money. She also said, "In case you haven't noticed, you have no friends." She left me and took the kids.

"Why?" I asked. He said, "I don't know but I really didn't care. I still had my home and kept winning and would send them money. I sold the house and moved into an apartment. I was so proud of myself and how well I was doing – money, money, money." Then, I lost. And, I lost again. Very quickly, I was losing, it seemed, all the time." He continued to tell me that he stopped gambling. He wasn't interested anymore. Problem was he was not interested in anything. He quit his job. Stopped going to Church. And, he sat at home. Occasionally, he would walk, sit in parks, stop for a drink, and talk to someone. He seemed to have no feelings. He did not want anything and was just as happy not being with anyone. As I said at the beginning "alone and lost."

Now, here we were sitting in Church. I asked him why he had stopped by the Church. "Oh, I haven't lost my faith," he said to me, "just my way. So, periodically, I stop by a Church just to remind God that I am still here and to see if he has any words for me today." I asked him if God had any wisdom for him today. He smiled a slight smile and said, "He always has wisdom. The question is will I listen and take it to heart?" "I am sorry for yelling at you today," he went on. "I really just wanted to be alone and you seemed a threat to me." "I can leave," I said, "this is as much your home as mine and I didn't want to lock you in or throw you out. I believe we all have the experience of having to sort things out and set some direction for ourselves." He shook his head and looked down at the floor. "Let me leave you to your thoughts," I said, "but, don't burn all your bridges. Someday, you will need a helping hand or a shoulder to cry on or someone to depend on. God will always be there, you are correct. But I know for a fact that God sometimes like to use someone else to do His work."

I got up and walked away, turned, and said, "I will be praying for you," and continued to walk. When I came back to the church later, he was gone. I never have seen the gentleman again. I don't know where he went or what became of him. Somehow, though, I know he still has God – and, God has him!

We have begun the Season of Lent. It is a COVID-19 Lent filled with many ambiguities. But it is Lent. What are you going to do with it? Where are you with your walk with the Lord? I pray for that gentleman every day. Wherever he is, what ever he may be doing, I pray he is doing it with God. I say the same prayer for you. We are all at various stages in our relationship with God. May this year confirm for you that God has never left you even amid the turmoil and unrest. He is still walking, and you are walking as well. Bless you during this First Week of Lent.

At the rectory, we put the bowl on our table and drop something in each time we walk by. Each week, we will print a little story/recipe/thought to remind you of our Lenten almsgiving. Today.....

A Story of Hope from El Salvador: Edwin Carlos is a 17-year-old living in El Salvador, eager to support his parents and two little brothers. After his teacher told him how new techniques and technology were changing the way agriculture was being done, Edwin Carlos decided to join a group of 220 students who are learning it is possible to farm while restoring the environment. Living in a country that has lost 75% of its fertile land to deforestation and other agricultural practices, Edwin Carlos recognizes the responsibility he has. “He who knows has an obligation to act,” he says. Like him, nearly 1,200 families in El Salvador started home vegetable gardens during the COVID-19 pandemic, growing nutritious foods like onions, tomatoes, cucumbers and squash. They can eat what they harvest or sell the produce for additional income. Young people want to build a better future for themselves and their communities – and thanks to programs like CRS Raices Ahuachapin, they are doing it.






Box Tops for SFSS School

Did you know?

St. Francis-St. Stephen School partners with St. Pauly Textile Inc. to collect used clothing and textiles. The school receives payment for these items, which are then distributed both here in the U.S. and worldwide to people who need them. St. Pauly collects over 120,000 pounds of clothing every day and estimates that this clothing ends up in 44 different countries yearly. In 2017 the company was able to help keep over 20 million articles of clothing out of landfills. The company was founded 22 years ago in Rochester and is an A+ rated member of the Better Business Bureau. Accepted items include clothing, shoes, sneakers, belts, purses, blankets, sheets, drapes, linens, pillowcases and stuffed animals. Donors are asked to donate items in a plastic bag to protect against dirt and the elements. Receipts are available in a small box located on the shed which is located in the school parking lot. Please keep us in mind when you are cleaning out your closets. Your donation helps the school and the environment!

Pero, somos frágiles, y pecamos. Gracias a Dios, tenemos muchas oportunidades de arrepentimiento y de buscar de nuevo el camino del Reino de Dios. La vida es un camino de conversión permanente. Este año recibimos las cenizas encima de la cabeza después que el sacerdote reza sobre toda la gente: “Conviértete y cree en el evangelio.” Sí, el cambio en nuestras vidas es no solamente escuchar el mensaje de Jesús en el evangelio, sino creerlo y vivirlo durante toda la vida. *Hna.
