### MULL-ING THINGS OVER

March has arrived! With its arrival is always the thought of Spring and the hint of Spring. We know winter will remain for three more weeks, but there are clues, the days are getting longer – its lighter earlier in the morning and stays lighter in the evening. We are beginning to hear birds singing and the geese flying in another direction. If you look closely enough you may even see a spring flower break the earth and the bulbs begin to grow. There is also the hint of Spring that we find in our Church. Lent itself is a harbinger of Spring. It gives birth to the story of the Resurrection and with that new life. We celebrate this weekend the Third Sunday of the Lenten Season. How are you doing so far? Have you been faithful to the promise(s) you made on Ash Wednesday? Do you feel a special closeness to God because of your Lenten practices? Have you found it easier to pray? And, has that prayer brought a special peace to your heart?

During these late winter days there is a restlessness we feel. We are tired of putting on heavy coats, hats, gloves, boots and watching out for ice, piled snow, and trying to peak around the big piles of snow right on the corner. We look forward to more sun, more warmth, blue skies – but not more smiles as we must still wear these masks! Some things seem to remain static. We are still in the pandemic, we still need to wear masks, socially distance, and limit the number of people who make up our crowd. We must be careful being around infants and our elderly. We must be especially aware of those with compromised health systems and who are prone to respiratory difficulties. We have to be careful shopping, eating out, and waiting in line. While we wait for seasonal change, some things need to remain the same.

Our first reading today speaks of the Ten Commandments. Given on Mount Sinai to Moses and delivered by Moses to the Chosen People, they were (and are) guides for not only knowing right from wrong but also establishing good order in our personal lives as well as in our community. God gave us rules to help us be honest, respectful, just and called us to give dignity to all people. The first three commandments deal with our relationship with God. We are to honor God, His Name, and keep His Day holy. The next seven commandments have to do with our relationship with others and with ourselves. Helping us all understand that we are children of God and responsible for one another. Two weeks of Lent having gone by, it is a good time to hear the Commandments announced to us – giving us pause to not only to think of them but see how they apply to us today. Our lives are enriched by the commandments which don't change even as we grow older and change.

In giving the commandments, God tried to raise our human minds to His mind. When he created the earth, there was perfect order. When Adam and Eve sinned, the order was broken. Sin entered the world. Sin was destructive from the very beginning. Sin causes us to look at ourselves and our wants rather than look to God and His wishes. Sin invites selfishness, jealousy, greed, lust, and a disoriented view of the world. Sin gave way to competition and aggression. God warned Adam and Eve (and us) that we would be dealing with sin all our earthly life. At the same time, God promised to send us grace. Grace would strengthen us against temptation, grace would help clarify our consciences, grace would draw us closer to God and there farther away from sin. God did not leave us hanging but gave us power to bring sin under control – if we choose to do so. When God gave us free choice, He gave us the power of making choices – good and bad.

These Lenten Days are days in which we clarify our thinking and thus further form our consciences. We are invited to clarify what “is from God” and what is “of human origin.” We all know right from wrong. We cannot hide behind indecision or ignorance. God's grace, His commandments, and the Christian example on display every day, all are helps to help to us in making choices - the right choices. When you think about it, God has placed great trust in us. He gave us freedom in order to prove our fidelity to God and His laws by making good choices, choices that help us be of service to others and give God honor and glory by our actions. As we continue to move through these Lenten days, we are invited to focus on God's mercy and forgiveness and not on his anger or hurt because of our sinfulness. Remember the story of the Prodigal Son – God went running to embrace that son in love not to condemn him or wish him evil. That same God is the one who wants to embrace us, lift us up, forgive us and love us. We just have to give him the chance. Have a great week!

A Story of Hope from Madagascar

Tomatoes, carrots, pumpkins and green leafy vegetables – these and other colorful foods are making a big impact on communities in Madagascar. Half of all children in Madagascar are under nourished, meaning they don't have enough nutritious food. The rainbow foods give families – especially children – the vitamins and minerals they need to grow and stay healthy. Frankline and Labaladezy have a large family, and their youngest child, Thorin, is almost a year old. Community health works trained by CRS hosted a puppet show in their village to teach about rainbow foods, doctor visits, and other ways to support good nutrition. It was a fun way to learn. Frankline and Labaladezy are using these tips, and Thorin is growing up healthy and strong. Frankline is happy her youngest son is doing so well. Every parent wants their children to reach their full potential, and CRS is helping make sure they can do just that.

## Stewardship Reflection

## Did you know?

St. Francis-St. Stephen School partners with St. Pauly Textile Inc. to collect used clothing and textiles. The school receives payment for these items, which are then distributed both here in the U.S. and worldwide to people who need them. St. Pauly collects over 120,000 pounds of clothing every day and estimates that this clothing ends up in 44 different countries yearly. In 2017 the company was able to help keep over 20 million articles of clothing out of landfills. The company was founded 22 years ago in Rochester and is an A+ rated member of the Better Business Bureau. Accepted items include clothing, shoes, sneakers, belts, purses, blankets, sheets, drapes, linens, pillowcases and stuffed animals. Donors are asked to donate items in a plastic bag to protect against dirt and the elements. Receipts are available in a small box located on the shed which is located in the school parking lot. Please keep us in mind when you are cleaning out your closets. Your donation helps the school and the environment!

### Box Tops for SFSS School


The Box Tops for Education program now has a digital app that you can download.

## Orando el Padre Nuestro

Durante el tiempo de la Cuaresma es bueno mirar nuestra oración. ¿Oras cada día? ¿O cada dos días? ¿O una vez por semana? Es bueno mirar cómo es tu comunicación con Dios. Oración debe estar dirigida a Dios, y es solo para Dios. Por eso no cabe en la oración el actuar para que otros puedan verte “humildemente” metido en la oración.



Quando los discípulos pidieron a Jesús enseñarles a orar, El los enseñó el Padre Nuestro. Tan íntima es la oración que podemos dirigirnos a Dios como su hijo o hija. El hijo o la hija habla

con cariño, con amor a su padre, y así debe ser en el Padre Nuestro, pero hay una diferencia aquí porque estamos compartiendo con otros; decimos nuestro padre. Desde el primer siglo los cristianos han usado esta oración para su oración personal y oración en comunidad.

La oración enfatiza la gloria de Dios, y también que es nuestro padre. Jesús dijo a sus discípulos que ellos pudieron llamarlo a Dios Padre como Jesús lo hacía. Esto nos da otra relación con Dios.

Nosotros los discípulos nos damos cuenta que Dios santifica su propia nombre y también extiende su propio reino.

La oración es en el plural; nos damos cuenta de las dimensiones comunitarias de la oración. Pedimos por el pan del día, por el perdón, por protección del mal. Hay una parte donde reconocemos que tenemos una responsabilidad mutua de perdonar a otras personas.

En este tiempo de la Cuaresma sabemos que Jesús habló de ayunos, dando caridad y la oración como importantes. Nuestra oración debe ser sencilla y humilde, siempre con una consciencia de que no somos una gran cosa. Cuando oramos, la manera mejor es entregarnos totalmente a Dios. Esta oración se dirige a Dios como un niño habla a su padre. Reconociendo esto podemos ver el cariño que resulta en la oración y puede inspirar más confianza en nosotros.

Si queremos dedicarnos a una vida de oración, debemos reconocer que Dios es nuestro Padre, que debemos santificar el nombre de Dios en todo lo que hacemos, que debemos extender el Reino de Dios, que debemos hacer la voluntad de Dios, y que debemos reconocer nuestra dependencia en Dios por nuestras necesidades y que necesitamos perdonar a otras, huir de tentaciones y con la ayuda de Dios estar lejos de mal.

Lo que puede ayudarnos es vivir siempre en la presencia de Dios, poniendo las necesidades del Reino sobre todo y solamente querer seguir la voluntad de Dios, siempre con la esperanza de tener satisfechas las necesidades diarias, el perdón de nuestros pecados y deudas, y liberación del mal.
