### MULL-ING THINGS OVER

Today, the reading from the Old Testament Book of Chronicles speaks of a momentous time in Hebrew history. It is the time when the Hebrews were released from their captivity among the Babylonians. Persian King Cyrus defeated the Babylonians. The Book of Chronicles states: "In the first year of Cyrus, King of Persia, in order to fulfill the Word of the Lord spoken by Jeremiah, the Lord inspired King Cyrus of Persia to issue this proclamation throughout his kingdom, both by word of mouth and in writing: 'Thus says Cyrus, King of Persia: All the kingdoms of the earth the Lord, the God of heaven, has given to me, and he has also charged me to build him a house in Jerusalem, which is in Judah. Whoever, therefore, among you belongs to any part of His people, let him go up, and may his God be with him.'" (2 Chr. 36:19-23) With this statement the Hebrews were freed to return to Jerusalem and Cyrus himself would rebuild the Temple of Jerusalem.

It serves as a reminder that even in their captivity, God remained with His people. He suffered with them, dreamt of Jerusalem with them, He longed for a return to the land given to the Hebrews by God. Now, in triumph the once defeated Hebrews would march home and take possession of Jerusalem. It was one of those times in history when God proved His unconditional love for His Chosen People. God did not disdain His People but triumphantly walked them home. This reconciliation reinvigorated the people and encouraged them to follow God's commandments and once again be faithful to God in all that they do. It was now a time of rebuilding – not only houses and the Temple, but also their relationship with God. In reconciliation comes peace.

Commemorating this event on the Fourth Sunday of Lent (the middle of the Lenten Season), the Church reminds us that God has been with us and continues to be with us today. These 40 days of Lent are meant to be a time of rebuilding – deepening our relationship with God. It has been a year since the Coronavirus Pandemic began. It has been a year that we have endured the restrictions of the virus and helplessly watched as many of our loved ones died. It has been a year when we watched healthcare workers risk their lives and scientists do their greatest research as they sought an answer to this curse! These men and women used their God-given gifts and put them at the service of their fellow human beings. It has been a time when folks put aside their differences and reached out to those in need. We have seen signs and wonders of God's loving Presence moving among us. God did not cause the scourge, but He has helped us reestablish human bonds and fight against the disease. Like the story from Chronicles, God is giving us the tools to defeat our present-day enemy and restore confidence in God and one another.

The Gospel today reminds us that we are children of the Light, we continue to serve as witness and conveyer of God's light shining in the darkness. "...But, when (everyone) acts in truth and comes into the light, he makes clear that his deeds are done in God." (John 3:21) It is not only what we say but also what we do that gives testimony to the Presence of God. As our Lenten challenge, we are called upon in this Lenten Season to act like Cyrus doing the Lord's work even though we may not know what that work is. We are called to not only strengthen ourselves by our Lenten Penance but to allow that Penance to help us strengthen others, to carry God into the lives of those who aren't even looking for God. To act as a messenger to the world of what God can accomplish in good times and in bad. Our faith in God has been a great bond during the pandemic, it should also be bonding us in the holy days of this Sacred Season.

Today is also known as Laetare Sunday. It is Rejoice Sunday! It is a day when we pause from our Lenten Penance to take stock of our spiritual growth thus far this year and discover ways in which we can nurture this personal growth while sharing it with others. We rejoice in our faith and are glad that we can share it. There was much pain, suffering and mourning connected with the conquest of Jerusalem. This was changed into gladness and victory by the hope of a faithful people's return home. We will be better people because we have endured the pandemic and need to be people of hope that spark those who continue to suffer, continue to mourn, and continue to search for God. Every year, Lent sparks that fire of hope which encourages us to move on after Easter into lives invigorated by Lenten faith renewed.

As we move toward Holy Week and that annual commemoration of Jesus's darkest hours on this earth, remember to see the hope and light Jesus brings to those moments and realize our light can never be dimmed and faith can never be lessened unless we willingly let go of God to grasp only the world around us. Rejoice! You are a Christian, a child of God. Let your light shine this week!

## WE JOURNEY THROUGH LENT WITH CRS RICE BOWL: *Sustainability in El Salvador*

Drought has become a big problem across El Salvador, making it difficult for farmers to produce enough crops to support their families, and sadly, El Salvador has lost 75% of its rich land because of the large number of trees that have been cut down and harmful agricultural practices like the extensive use of fertilizers, making it one of the most food-insecure countries in the hemisphere. New farming techniques and a new generation of young farmers are making a difference. Thanks to the Catholic Relief Services (CRS) school program, *Raíces Ahuachapán*, young farmers learned how to grow vegetables at home—knowledge that was extremely important during the COVID-19 pandemic. In the days of the confinement, nearly 1,200 families started home vegetable gardens to grow nutritious foods like onions, tomatoes, cucumbers and squash. They can eat what they harvest or sell the produce at their church or the local market for additional income. Our CRS Rice Bowl alms help this happen. ## Something to think about—A Man and A Fork

There was a young man who had been diagnosed with a terminal illness and had been given three months to live. So, as he was getting his things 'in order,' he contacted his Priest and had him come to his house to discuss certain aspects of his final wishes.

He told him which songs he wanted sung at the service, what scriptures he would like read, and what outfit he wanted to be buried in. Everything was in order and the Priest was preparing to leave when the young man suddenly remembered something very important to him.

'There's one more thing,' he said excitedly.. 'What's that?' came the Priest's reply.

'This is very important,' the young man continued. 'I want to be buried with a fork in my right hand. The Priest stood looking at the young man, not knowing quite what to say. That surprises you, doesn't it?' the young man asked. 'Well, to be honest, I'm puzzled by the request,' said the Priest. The young man explained. 'My grandmother once told me this story, and from that time on I have always tried to pass along its message to those I love and those who are in need of encouragement. In all my years of attending socials and dinners, I always remember that when the dishes of the main course were being cleared, someone would inevitably lean over and say, 'Keep your fork.' It was my favorite part because I knew that something better was coming .... like velvety chocolate cake or deep-dish apple pie. Something wonderful, and with substance!' So, I just want people to see me there in that casket with a fork in my hand and I want them to wonder 'What's with the fork?' Then I want you to tell them: 'Keep your fork ... the best is yet to come. The Priest's eyes welled up with tears of joy as he hugged the young man good-bye. He knew this would be one of the last times he would see him before his death. But he also knew that the young man had a better grasp of heaven than he did. He had a better grasp of what heaven would be like than many people twice his age, with twice as much experience and knowledge. He KNEW that something better was coming.

At the funeral people were walking by the young man's casket and they saw the suit he was wearing and the fork placed in his right hand. Over and over, the Priest heard the question, 'What's with the fork?' And over and over he smiled.

During his message, the Priest told the people of the conversation he had with the young man shortly before he died. He also told them about the fork and about what it symbolized to him. He told the people how he could not stop thinking about the fork and told them that they probably would not be able to stop thinking about it either. He was right. So, the next time you reach down for your fork let it remind you, ever so gently, that the best is yet to come.

Friends are a very rare jewel, indeed. They make you smile and encourage you to succeed. Cherish the time you have and the memories you share. Being friends with someone is not an opportunity, but a sweet responsibility.

And just remember ... keep your fork! The BEST is yet to come!

Habla con Dios en silencio o en voz alta; cuéntale de tus problemas, pérdidas, crisis, penas, sufrimientos, emociones, enojo, falta de paciencia... Por compartir nuestras debilidades con un amigo, podemos entendernos más íntimamente, y así es en nuestra oración. Somos más humanos por nuestra honestidad. Nos mostramos nuestras necesidades de perdón y sanación.

**SACRAMENT OF MARRIAGE:**

Couples should contact a priest at least nine months in advance of their date. A year or more notice is advisable to secure the church and time desired. If one of the couple is divorced, a church annulment will be required. Circumstances of the prior marriage determine whether or not an annulment might be possible. Consult a priest at least a year in advance.
