MULL-ING THINGS OVER

It is Easter Sunday! Happy Easter to all! These bright Spring days seem to enliven us and help us understand the Easter Feast! Out of the darkness and cold of winter, we have emerged into Spring and we see the earth once again coming alive. Out of the darkness of the tomb, Jesus has risen in radiant light. Eternal life is ours! There seems to be deep hope brightening our spirits and helping us look forward to the future! As always, the Church invites her members to open their eyes and see the signs of life surrounding us. There are many signs for us this year!

We see the protocols that have governed our lives beginning to lighten up. Part of the reason for this is the vaccinations which many people are now receiving. For those of us who have already had our two, there is a sense of protection and safety. We are protected – but, can still help spread it; so, we need to be conscious of this fact. The wisdom of our scientists has helped us battle this illness and hopefully bring it under control. The way that health care workers have been mobilized and are now distributing these injections reminds us that we are all in this together – each needing one another to help us on the journey. The illness has actually brought us closer together – we have met the foe and we are defeating it. A sign of Easter Hope.

Nursing Homes, Assisted Living residences are beginning to open their doors for family visits. This has long been sought and wanted. The threat of COVID infection is one thing, having to isolate family and friends is another. We are all social individuals and we enjoy visits from family and friends. The updates, the laughter, the hugs, the knowledge that someone cares are all part of living life. When we are not able to do it, we tend to die a little and begin to lose our self-worth. When I am able to be in a nursing home room or a hospital room and I see the big smile greeting me, you know the patient is happy to see you and you smile right back! To be able to enter and visit these places is a real gift. A sign of Easter Hope.

Throughout Lent, we have seen our attendance numbers for weekend Masses slowly rising. People who have received a vaccination, people feeling a little more confident to be in a crowd, people who have been looking forward to receiving Holy Communion, people who have rides to Church are beginning to emerge from their homes and come back to Church. One of the Lenten songs we have heard: “Come back to me, with all your hearts, don’t let fear keep us apart...” is being acted out right before our eyes. There are very good reasons why our weekend attendance was low, it was a necessary fact that people needed to protect themselves, the Bishop’s dispensation from mandatory Sunday attendance, all are good reasons – but, needing to be back in Church, missing our neighbors and friends, needing to be together to pray with and for one another are also reasons to return and thank God for journeying with us this past year. A sign of Easter Hope.

Ironically, the funerals of those who died during the winter and have been delayed until safer times and better weather are beginning to be scheduled. Many families delayed the funeral because out-of-town or our-of-state relatives could not travel. Now, they can travel. These families need to gather, to pray, to receive Holy Communion, need to celebrate the life of their deceased loved ones. The very fact that they want to do this is because of love and Jesus’ Resurrection from the Dead. We believe Easter communicates the moment Jesus threw open the gates of heaven, redeemed us from our sins and restored us to the entitlement of eternal life. Funerals then become a sign of Easter Hope.

In a very similar way, Baptisms are being scheduled once again! The reasons why baptisms were delayed are like those for delaying funerals; the illness, the pause, the lack of protection, the impossibility of travel, quarantines and warnings. Now, it is Spring, now we have protection, now the threat is lessened, we find new hope in Baptism and Baptism becomes a sign of Easter hope. Seeing life in an infant child, seeing joy in parents’ faces, knowing the potential for this child’s life, seeing a family surround its newest member with love and prayers, all of these become signs of life and a sign of Easter Hope.

As we move through the fifty days of the Easter Season, we tell the story of Jesus’ resurrected days on earth and the fulfillment of His promise of life after death with God. We are invited throughout this joyful period to look around ourselves and see the Signs of Hope which remind us of the richness of life, the promises of God and the fullness of Easter which is life after death. Take some time this week – see what is alive – what is changing – what is evolving – what is our life – take them in as signs of Easter Hope. Happy Easter to all! Have a great week!

La Gran Fiesta de los Creyentes

“El Misterio Pascual es el fundamento, soporte y fuerza de nuestra fe y esperanza, es lo que nos hace amar como Jesús nos ha amado.” (Pedro Llabrés) Cada domingo celebramos la resurrección del Señor, pero una vez al año la celebramos en grande a la conclusión del Triduo Pascual que nos ayuda recordar la última cena, la pasión y muerte de Jesús y la resurrección de Jesús de entre los muertos.

La resurrección de Jesús no fue resucitación, devolviendo su vida mortal a él. El volvió a una vida eterna. Fue transformado a tal grado que algunos discípulos dudaban que fue él. El aparecía a los discípulos; fueron ellos que habían escuchado su prédica, que habían caminado con él, que cenaban con él y que creían en él antes de su muerte. Ahora al ver y escuchar a este Jesús transformado cambió a los discípulos, ellos fueron transformados y creían en la resurrección. También podemos hablar de las resurrecciones nuestras de cada día, porque realmente nuestra creencia en Jesús resucitado debe cambiar nuestra manera de hablar y de relacionarnos con los demás. Es un reto de cada día: orar con más fe y perseverancia, ayudar a alguien con amor, perdonar, hacer sonreír de felicidad a otra, ofrecer su servicio a otras sin que ellos lo piden, cumplir con sus responsabilidades responsablemente, hacer las cosas por amor a Dios y al prójimo. Resucitar cada día es dejarse ser transformado por Jesús resucitado. Que vivamos cada día con una vida nueva de amor y de servicio que Jesús resucitado nos da.
