MULL-ING THINGS OVER

In the liturgical calendar, today has many titles. It is eight days since Easter was celebrated so it is called the Eighth Day of Easter, the end of the Easter Octave. It is called the Second Sunday of Easter beginning the Second Week of the Easter Season. It is Divine Mercy Sunday, designated by Pope St. John Paul II, to commemorate the effects of Jesus' Death-Resurrection-Redemption and the giving of Divine Mercy. The Gospel Reading of the day recounts Jesus' first appearance to the Apostles after the Resurrection. Jesus breathed on the apostles and said, "Receive the Holy Spirit, if you forgive sins, they are forgiven..." The bottom line is that Jesus loves us and is always ready to bring us forgiveness.

This afternoon, all are invited to the Daily Mass Chapel where we will pray the Chaplet of Divine Mercy. We cannot sing it yet because of COVID-19, but we can recite it together. We make our personal request for God's mercy and then offer thanks to God for giving it to us! We have so many things to commemorate during Holy Week that sometimes we forget why we must celebrate. Very simply, God loves us so much that he gave He gave his own Son to us in remediation for our sins. Jesus loved us so much that He was willing to embrace death for us and open the gates of heaven. In these acts, the Divine Mercy of God is shown to the world.

During the fifty days of Easter, the Church encourages us to look for signs of God's presence in our lives. Mercy is one of the primary signs of God. When we show mercy towards others, the faithful witness the action of God showing mercy towards us. Did God enjoy watching His Son die? Probably not. Yet, that very act, gave God the chance to show His love through that activity. Jesus had a mission to complete and when it was completed, God and humanity were reconciled. The reconciliation was felt by all human beings. It becomes a sign of hope and a sign of Easter!

During this next week, you might want to challenge yourself to see mercy in action in your own life. Firstly, in you and the way you show mercy to others. In your family, and the way that your family serves mercy to one another and outside the family. Secondly, when and how has God worked through you to bring mercy in the world – he has done that, you know, can you describe when, where and how? We pray for forgiveness and mercy throughout the world. It begins with baby steps and expands. We need to do more than prayer; we need to ask God to help us become instruments of mercy and forgiveness.

The Chaplet of Divine was designed by St. Faustina. Through repetition (mantra-like) we praise God but also sow in our minds and souls the lessons Jesus taught: "For the sake of your sorrowful passion – have mercy on us and on the whole world." It becomes a pleading call to our merciful God to watch over, guide and assist us in bringing mercy into the world, The prayer is centered on the Body and Blood of Jesus, offered in the Eucharist and a reminder that as Jesus offered it at the Last Super he was making reconciliation for our sins and presenting a reconciled world to God.

Catholics are encouraged to go to confession either before or after praying the Chaplet in order to receive special grace from God and an indulgence and forgiveness of sin. The results: reconciliation with God and fulfillment in eternal life with God. There is a very deep relationship that exists between God and those He has created. There is a humbling recognition of God's mercy when he acts with unconditional love. He expects nothing in return because He acts freely out of love. The big challenge, of course, is that as God has acted so should we act. Unconditional love is almost inhuman, it is very difficult for the human heart, but God asks us to try it – with His grace all things are possible.

As we journey through these Easter days and hear eyewitness accounts of Jesus' death and resurrection, we are called to be like the apostles – the activities of the First Easter did not make sense immediately. It was only after prayer, reflection and real testimony that the pieces of the puzzle started to come together and gradually the full picture emerged.

Relax, pray, enjoy the fresh air, the warmth of sun, the blue of the sky - God is speaking through all of them. Remember the small moments when people have spoken to you in love, recall those times when you were surprised by something that happened "out of the blue," share your story with someone you love – God approaches you through experiences of people just like this. Don't take people for granted but see them as gifts from God. You will then see living signs of hope, you will become an instrument of God's grace and love, Easter will have spoken to you again. Have a great Easter! Rejoice in Divine Mercy! Signs of hope are alive today. Have a good week!

Did you know?

St. Francis-St. Stephen School partners with St. Pauly Textile Inc. to collect used clothing and textiles. The school receives payment for these items, which are then distributed both here in the U.S. and worldwide to people who need them. St. Pauly collects over 120,000 pounds of clothing every day and estimates that this clothing ends up in 44 different countries yearly. In 2017 the company was able to help keep over 20 million articles of clothing out of landfills. The company was founded 22 years ago in Rochester and is an A+ rated member of the Better Business Bureau. Accepted items include clothing, shoes, sneakers, belts, purses, blankets, sheets, drapes, linens, pillowcases and stuffed animals. Donors are asked to donate items in a plastic bag to protect against dirt and the elements. Receipts are available in a small box located on the shed which is located in the school parking lot. Please keep us in mind when you are cleaning out your closets. Your donation helps the school and the environment!

“Lord, when did we see You... in prison?” Matthew 25:39

“Please, don’t give up on them.” - A former inmate speaking to a jail ministry on behalf of her incarcerated friends.. We have many times heard Jesus speak about “giving liberty to captives” (Luke 4:18), and we are always deeply touched by His compassion upon the crucified thief who asked Jesus to remember him as he entered into His Kingdom. Yet, we might ask ourselves how often our own outreach concerns extend to our incarcerated brothers and sisters and their families. Are we aware of the conditions in jails and prisons on our society?

America’s rate of incarceration is greater than any other nation’s in the world: although our country has 5% of the world’s population, it has 25% of its prisoners. Sentence length and time served are much longer in the US than elsewhere, and include more solitary confinement, less rehabilitations, and poor re-entry assistance. The levels of Covid-19 in many of our prisons promoted one NYC inmate to remark, “It’s...like we aren’t even human.” A crime data expert at the Brennan Center for Justice recently observed, “It is really a system that sets people up for failure.” ([America](#), August 2020)

As we continue to struggle with our own confinements during the pandemic, let us deepen our understanding of the sufferings of our incarcerated sisters and brother and pray to know how we can best care for them. In the coming weeks of this Easter Season, our Diocesan Public Policy Committee will be providing further information and assistance to parishes in these efforts.
