MULL-ING THINGS OVER

As I entered St. Francis Church on Holy Thursday, there were four people present. I knew more would arrive, but it struck me how empty the place looked. Here was the day that we commemorate the gift of Jesus Himself in Holy Communion. We were prepared to re-tell the story of the Last Supper, hear the ancient hymns to honor Jesus as He lives today in the Holy Eucharist and soothe our hunger to receive Holy Communion. For many people it has been one year since they last received Holy Communion. Unbelievable – but believable in a pandemic. In the center of the sanctuary stood one single chair. In front of it, an empty bowl, an empty pitcher and draped on the chair was a single white towel. We know that during the Last Supper Jesus Himself washed the feet of his apostles. Each year, we would mimic the action of Jesus and we washed the feet of twelve parishioners. Not this year! While we are not closed down as we had been in 2020, we were limited in how many were allowed in the Church and we were not allowed to perform rituals that would involve people within the six-foot space allowed for each individual. Washing the feet, therefore, was not allowed. But a symbolic chair would remind us of the action we were not doing and calling our minds to Jesus' words: "As I have done, so you must do..."

As the liturgy began, around 100 people had assembled. A Eucharist Hymn was sung as Father Mull and Father Carlos approached the altar. A greeting was given, the Gloria was sung to remind us that Lent had ended, and we had begun what is commonly called the Triduum – the three-day remembrance of the end of Jesus' life – and His resurrection from the dead. The readings began. We heard the Passover Story of the Jews when they were asked to mark their doors with sheep's blood and close the door. The angel of death would visit Egypt and the first-born in every unmarked house would be slain by the Angel of Death. It was the Passover of the Lord. The Hebrews were ordered to leave Egypt immediately. With their flocks, their belongings, their children, and unleavened bread they marched out into history. In the Second Reading, we heard the words of St. Paul describing Mass in the early first century. He reminded that infant Church that it was Jesus Himself who blessed bread and wine ("This is my Body..." This is Blood") "as often as you do this do it in memory of me!" Thus, Jesus commissioned (ordained) the apostles to do so after He had left. The Gospel told the story of Jesus washing the feet of his twelve apostles. "as I have done, so you must do." It was the story of Holy Thursday.

Father Mull had the congregation sit after the Gospel and asked them to look at and meditate on the empty chair – when were the times you washed the feet of others? When was the time you refused to wash the feet of others? Jesus said, "As I have done so you also must do! The Mass continued. The words of Jesus were repeated. Bread and Wine once again became Body and Blood. We formed lines and all received Holy Communion – only under one form – bread – but the fullness of the Lord was consumed. It was familiar to all present, nothing spectacular - familiar words, and a miracle happened. As Jesus said at the Last Supper and as Jesus did at the Last Supper, we were invited to eat and drink. A miracle was performed, the people were satisfied. We shared Holy Communion.

Under ordinary circumstances, we would have then had a procession from St. Francis Church to the Daily Mass Chapel where a Repository was set up to honor Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. No processions this year. So, Father Carlos simply took the Holy Eucharist and moved to the tabernacle. With song, incense and reverence, Jesus was enshrined in the tabernacle. As the priests left, the people were invited to remain in adoration of the Eucharist and then return to their cars and return to their homes. We recalled how Jesus walked with his disciples to the Garden of Gethsemane. Jesus asked, "Watch one hour with me." That same invitation was offered Holy Thursday night. While we awaited for the dawn of Good Friday, we watched with the Holy Eucharist being reminded of what a great gift it was to us, what a great opportunity He provided for us, and while the Apostles denied Jesus in the night, we embraced Him and promised to wait for Him! The evening opened the way for us, the faithful, to be prepared for the action of Good Friday and helped us appreciate the meaning of that day and to hear the continuing story of salvation.

As we begin a new week today, take a moment and appreciate all that Jesus did for us. Think about the mystery of faith that we have commemorated. Be grateful for what Jesus left behind. He did so, that we would not be afraid, we would not be orphans, we would realize that God is always present, and we can experience that Presence every time we share a sacrament. Have a blessed and holy week.

Did you know?

St. Francis-St. Stephen School partners with St. Pauly Textile Inc. to collect used clothing and textiles. The school receives payment for these items, which are then distributed both here in the U.S. and worldwide to people who need them. St. Pauly collects over 120,000 pounds of clothing every day and estimates that this clothing ends up in 44 different countries yearly. In 2017 the company was able to help keep over 20 million articles of clothing out of landfills. The company was founded 22 years ago in Rochester and is an A+ rated member of the Better Business Bureau. Accepted items include clothing, shoes, sneakers, belts, purses, blankets, sheets, drapes, linens, pillow-cases and stuffed animals. Donors are asked to donate items in a plastic bag to protect against dirt and the elements. Receipts are available in a small box located on the shed which is located in the school parking lot. Please keep us in mind when you are cleaning out your closets. Your donation helps the school and the environment!
