MULL-ING THINGS OVER

This weekend is First Communion weekend in our parish. As I have written before, it is a very special weekend for our parish. It is a very special weekend for our First Communicants and for their families. And it is a very special weekend for pastors – especially this pastor! When a pastor is appointed, one of his primary responsibilities is to make sure that the people of the parish have the sacraments readily available to them. This does not mean that he must celebrate all the sacraments in the parish himself. It does, however, mean that those receiving the sacraments must be prepared and coached as they receive the sacraments for the first time. It does mean that he gathers a staff who is responsible for not only the proper preparation but also a deep love for the sacraments – right from the beginning. It means he aligns priests and deacons who lovingly will share those sacraments with the people of the parish. It also means that he enlists musicians, lay people and all those who help make the sacramental celebrations beautiful, meaningful and spiritually enriching.

Any time sacraments are celebrated for the first time, it means there is growth. New people come forward for Baptism. Our young members of the community step to the altar to share the Body and Blood of Jesus. Growing members of the community are fortified with the Holy Spirit and begin a new era of their lives as soldiers of Christ and new apostles moving into the life-stream of society. As with any “first” there is a certain pride, a certain hope, and a certain dream come true that our sons and daughters have stepped to a new level of Catholic practice. I can see the pride in the faces of parents and grandparents as their children extend their hands, smile and say “Amen” to the statement, “The Body of Christ.” I can’t tell you the feelings I have as I think of Jesus embracing this young child and as He claims him/her at Baptism, so now He carries him/her to the altar for their first morsel of this Holy Food. What a smile must be on His face as He joyfully shares with a family (since He is part of all our families) that a brother or sister has in faith, embraced His gift – His own Body and Blood. Now, a new generation has begun to be nourished at the table of God to do the work of God in the world.

Take a look at precious First Communion pictures. You can feel the innocence. You can become aware of the whole family joining in that sacred moment. The First Communicant stands alone, then we see the First Communicant with Mom and Dad. Then, Grandma and Grandpa stand on either side of the First Communicant. Then the child’s godparents who held them at the baptismal font, joins them supporting them in this “next step” of their spiritual growth. Then, the whole family jumps in there for a picture witnessing the support of the whole family in this holy moment. These pictures become a dramatic sign of the Church alive surrounding this child and protecting him/her while at the same time turning them toward God who will guide and direct them. The nourishment is not for today but every day of their lives in this world.

Think back for a moment on your First Communion. There was fear there – it was the first time we had ever participated in Holy Communion and we did not want to mess things up. There was joy – Mom and Dad were happy and proud of you; Grandma and Grandpa went to a lot of trouble and expense to be present with you. Everyone got dressed up for the occasion. There were hundreds of pictures taken – so this must have been important. There was a party – so something special was happening and everyone wanted to be happy and to celebrate. In a way, it was a day we did not want to end. There were so many to see, so much celebrating to do, and it was good to see smiles on everyone’s face. We all spent a lot of time studying, praying, reading the Bible and learning to get ready for this day. It was one of those special moments hard to describe in human words but one we all were glad to be a part of and somehow, Jesus was a big part of the day, but I really can’t explain quite how that happened.

I think we all dream of one day being back on that First Communion day. Everything was much simpler, it was so simple to think of Jesus, God and the saints and not have to explain why or how. It was a time when our circle of family and friends was simple – I knew everyone’s name and they knew me. It was a time of innocence in which I simply knew – really knew – that Jesus loved me and treasured me. Where has that day gone? How did life become so complicated? Why can’t we simply go back to simpler times?

Maybe on this First Communion weekend, we can all step back – only for a moment. Maybe we can recall the innocence, the simplicity, the gentle love of God and quietly enjoy the moment. Soon it will be gone, life will re-enter, and my busy world will continue. But you would have had a taste of love, a taste of spirituality, and a taste of God – just that will keep all of us going. Have a great week. Congratulations to all our First Communicants and their families!
