MULL-ING THINGS OVER

With today's liturgies, we bring the Easter Season officially to its close. The Feast of Pentecost is the last day of each year's Easter Season. We celebrate Pentecost today! As you know, Pentecost is the day when we commemorate the coming of the Holy Spirit into the hearts, minds and souls of Mary and the apostles and those disciples gathered in the upper room where Jesus had asked them to remain. They did not know how long they had to wait, nor did they really know what they were waiting for. The wind picked up and became really strong. The house seemed to rock as the wind poured through the windows, a loud noise was heard and figures such as flames of fire seemed to settle on the heads of all present. Then, in a moment, those in the room were speaking, but it was in various languages and yet everyone understood what was being said. They were exhilarated, joyous, almost seeming to want to jump out of themselves. The Holy Spirit had come as Jesus promised. With the Spirit's arrival, the Church was born!!!

As we celebrate the Feast of Pentecost, we do not simply designate a moment in history when the Holy Spirit came down upon the faithful who had been with Jesus. Today's feast equally reminds us that the Holy Spirit remains a driving force in our Church and in the lives of those who have said "yes" to the Holy Spirit. God first sent the Holy Spirit at the request of Jesus. Jesus told his disciples the Spirit, the Advocate will not come down upon you unless I leave you. It is the Holy Spirit who will continue the redemptive activity that I have begun among you. By their actions of praying and waiting, the apostles indicated their willingness to receive the Holy Spirit when God was ready to send Him. We share the Holy Spirit today. The Spirit comes to us in Baptism and then in

Confirmation. The Holy Spirit is the cause of bread and wine becoming the Body and Blood of Jesus. The Holy Spirit sends the redeeming grace of God in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. We are Confirmed in the Holy Spirit as co-workers of Jesus Christ. Ordination occurs through the power of the Holy Spirit and the laying on of consecrated hands. The Holy Spirit enables the Church to remain alive and "do" the work of God in our world.

Each one of us are ministers of God. God gave us specific gifts and talents to help us fulfill our transforming action in our personal lives as well as the lives of our sisters and brothers in the faith. Whether it is caring for my family, caring for my parish, caring for fellow ministers of the Gospel, reaching out to the poor of our neighborhoods, or speaking out on social justice issues, we are utilizing the divine power that God makes available to us. Transformation is a slow process and we need people of patient faith to work with the Spirit and with individuals to truly transform their lives. Beyond our sacramental experiences, we have the Holy Spirit guiding us and assisting us in who we are becoming and what we are to do. Pentecost is a day we are renewed by the Holy Spirit and invited not to begin anew but to continue on the journey Jesus set us about years ago! There is an anonymous prayer which states: "Mindful that I am a pilgrim, may I treat each and every one with reverence and love, as a manifestation of you with whom I journey. May the work of my hands and even the trials I have experienced – be part of the redemption of the world and its eternal liberation. Amen." Our pilgrimage of life cannot continue without the Holy Spirit.

Pentecost, then, invites us to reflect on the manifestations we have already encountered in life. To see once again the moments that God has revealed Himself to us. It may be through prayer, through friendships, through family experiences, through a sacramental celebration, or through an everyday experience which raised us up and helps transform our view from nature to divine. Everyone has transforming experiences that we sometimes call conversions. St. Paul experienced it as he rode a horse to Damascus and was thrown off and blinded. The other day, I was talking to a friend of mine who had a conversion experience as he drove his truck on a country road. Countless priests and/or deacons will confide that their ordination was a transforming experience. Couples tell me their wedding days were a profound moment of holiness and change. The birth of a firstborn child and holding that child for the first time is reported to be transformative and mystical. Think about it. How have you experienced a Pentecost moment?

As we celebrate today, we will renew our faith in God and receive the Holy Spirit once again. In our minds, we will hear Jesus speak to us: "You are not my slave! You are my friend!" We will also hear the eternal Word: "I have made you; you are mine." These are not only biblical statements. They are a call to action – receive the Holy Spirit and use that Spirit to accomplish the mission God has given to us since the moment of our existence. Tell the story and be the story. Have a great Pentecost Week!

Did you know?

St. Francis-St. Stephen School partners with St. Pauly Textile Inc. to collect used clothing and textiles. The school receives payment for these items, which are then distributed both here in the U.S. and worldwide to people who need them. St. Pauly collects over 120,000 pounds of clothing every day and estimates that this clothing ends up in 44 different countries yearly. In 2017 the company was able to help keep over 20 million articles of clothing out of landfills. The company was founded 22 years ago in Rochester and is an A+ rated member of the Better Business Bureau. Accepted items include clothing, shoes, sneakers, belts, purses, blankets, sheets, drapes, linens, pillowcases and stuffed animals. Donors are asked to donate items in a plastic bag to protect against dirt and the elements. Receipts are available in a small box located on the shed which is located in the school parking lot. Please keep us in mind when you are cleaning out your closets. Your donation helps the school and the environment!
