MULL-ING THINGS OVER

About a week ago, I participated in a Memorial Service for the New York State Troopers who had lost their lives in the line of duty. It is an annual Memorial Service and each time I participate I find myself emotionally involved in what we are doing. We gather outside Troop E headquarters. There is always a delegation of State Troopers from Albany present as well as men and women from Troop E and other employees and their families. Members of the families of the deceased troopers are also invited and generally turn out for the service. After the official trooping of colors, prayer, the acknowledging of the cause of our gathering, the official lowering of the flags, the names and a brief bio of the deceased troopers are read and family members place a rose on the monument dedicated to these deceased troopers. Present are parents, spouses, and children related to the deceased. Brother and sister troopers stand at attention and witness the fact that the mission to protect and save can demand the ultimate sacrifice. A moment of silence is offered. There is silence. Just silence. Quietly, the notes of TAPS can be heard. Music that touches the heart and causes us all to remember. We end with a blessing and the colors are retired.

Such a Memorial Service will be repeated several times in several places this weekend. It is Memorial Day Weekend in the United States once again. Annually, we are asked to step back from our daily routines on the last weekend of May and remember those who have made the ultimate sacrifice for our nation. On this weekend we are reminded that liberty comes with responsibility. Unfortunately, we must defend ourselves from violence and evil that is in our world. The names of the wars and battles have changed, but the activities have not. We pray for peace but continue to fight our battles. As long as there are enemies, there will be war.

In some ways, this year's Memorial Day has an even greater importance. We have all been confined, limited, protecting ourselves and our families, not allowed to gather or celebrate any holiday as we normally would. Now, we have limitations, but with vaccinations, common sense, and caution, we are allowed to gather with family and friends, we can travel once again, and have fewer restrictions. Family picnics will be happening. Cook outs and family excursions will be taking place. Pools will probably be opened, parks will be available, and our "first summer gathering" will take place. It will be good to look forward to a fun activity, family and friends from whom we have been separated, and the picnic foods we all enjoy. Because of this, Memorial Day is shaping up to be a real celebration of the end of COVID!

COVID, however, like war, remains. It is still a threat to society and something about which we must caution others. The pandemic has not officially ended. We still need folks to get vaccinated, we must be careful with the groups we join and the size of gatherings in which we participate. What has happened in the past year has given us knowledge – knowledge we did not necessarily seek but nonetheless found. We are not immortal beings. We can (and will) die. We need to be cautious. No place on this earth is completely safe and we are responsible for one another. We have learned that COVID is not a scourge from God. It is an infection. It can be passed on to others. We are confining it and limiting it, but we have not destroyed it. It has been an illness that has reminded us that life is a gift and should be treated as a gift. God gives it to us, and it is precious, and we need to protect it and nurture it and recognize its sanctity.

In many ways, passed wars have done the same thing to us. No one wants war – unless they are selfish, have little concern for the common link existing between all human beings, put money, power and objects above people and the development of the human spirit. There is never a winner in war because precious human lives are lost, people's dignity is destroyed, and sadness becomes the end results. Memorial Day calls us to honor our heroes and those who made the ultimate sacrifice, but it also calls us to recommit ourselves to ending war and not repeating what has happened all too often in the past. We are not doomed to repeat history unless we chose to reject history. In a similar vein, COVID will not repeat if we have learned to deal with it, are willing to take precautions and again become aware of our obligation towards one another.

This Memorial Day weekend have fun, enjoy the people who will share it with you, eat the foods you love and drink the drinks that refresh you, rejoice that we have this possibility again. But, also take a moment to remember and say a little prayer for our fallen heroes. In that moment, thank God for the country we live in and the freedoms we enjoy. We are not perfect, we make mistakes, but we can change, and we do grow. Then remember, we are truly free when we are responsible. Responsibility helps us love, protect others and deepen the meaning of life.

A Statement on a Return to Sunday Mass by the Roman Catholic Bishops of the Upstate New York Dioceses

Today, with vaccination rates rising, infection numbers across the state are falling and we are seeing the reopening of every sector of society, including businesses, restaurants and sporting events. Now it is also time to return to Sunday Mass.

The obligation to attend Holy Mass on the Lord's Day is a sacred one. Anyone who is frail or at risk due to advanced age or medical conditions is always excused from this obligation, and we encouraged you to use your prudential judgement throughout this pandemic to determine if it was unsafe for you to attend Mass. This remains true.

However, for those who are healthy and not at great risk, the presumption of the faithful should be that, unless they are at an enhanced risk, sick, or caring for others who are at risk or sick, the obligation to attend Sunday Mass now resumes, effective the weekend of **June 5-6, 2021**, the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ in our dioceses. One should consult their local pastor if questions arise about the obligation to attend. All required safety protocols and liturgical directives of each Diocese remain in place until modified or revoked by the respective Diocesan Bishop.

We are grateful to God to have reached this point, and we speak for all of our brother priests in saying we can't wait to see you again. Come home to Mass!



¡Ah, Tan Grande Es el Amor de Dios!

Hoy, por la fiesta de la Santísima Trinidad estamos reconociendo y celebrando el hecho que Dios es una comunión del amor relacional. Para los de Israel en el tiempo de la biblia ningún otro dios pudo comparar con su Dios quien fue creador y liberador y quien estaba actuando constantemente en sus vidas y en su historia. No hubo ningún otro dios como el suyo. Pero, no solamente Dios estaba en sus vidas dándose a ellos, sino ellos a la vez estaban aceptando las responsabilidades de los mandamientos que Dios dio a ellos y los descendientes de ellos.

Los primeros cristianos recibieron una tarea--lo que Mateo escribió al final de su evangelio--que tenían que ir a otras naciones, bautizándolos en el nombre del Padre, del Hijo y del Espíritu Santo. Escuchamos hoy en el evangelio que este Dios trino va a estar con nosotros hasta el fin del mundo. No debemos hablar de la ausencia de este Dios de amor, este Dios en el cual las tres personas se relacionan por una comunión de amor. Nosotros entramos en ese amor y ese Dios de amor entra en nosotros. Dios está con nosotros como Mateo había escrito de Emanuel al principio de su evangelio. Hoy en día este Dios de amor está con nosotros de otra manera, no por medio de la persona humana de Jesús, sino por la presencia de la Trinidad: Dios el Creador, Dios Espíritu Santo que nos ayuda crecer por medio de tantos dones y por el Cristo cósmico que había participado en la obra creadora, como también en la obra redentora y santificadora. Por la resurrección de Cristo se abre paso a la resurrección de cada uno de nosotros y la redención de la creación.

Existe Dios hoy en un movimiento cíclico de amor tan fantástico porque Dios nos reúne en este movimiento. Dios está cerca; Dios está adentro de nosotros. En esta fiesta de la Trinidad celebramos no solo el misterio de Dios sino la cercanía de Dios que sigue invitándonos a entrar al ciclo de la vida y el amor--una invitación que es no solo para los seres humanos sino para todo el cosmos.

Cuando van persignándose piensen en el significado de esta acción simbólica de nuestros bautismos y pongan atención a la vida divina que habita dentro de ustedes y en el cual nosotros tenemos el privilegio de habitar. ¡Qué afortunados somos!
