MULL-ING THINGS OVER

Slowly, we are beginning to return to normal. This weekend, as you know, the Upstate New York State Bishops have reinstated our Sunday obligation. Beginning in March 2020, the Bishops had dispensed us from that obligation. If you recall, that was when the churches were closed, and the only Masses allowed were private Masses that were livestreamed. Each priest was given permission to celebrate one Mass a day, but no one was to be invited to be present at that Mass. Obviously, if you were not allowed to attend Mass, the Bishops could not require you to be obligated to go to Mass. So, it has been fourteen months with the dispensation. With people vaccinated, we can feel safe attending Mass and not “catching” COVID or spreading COVID. While all the protocols have not been lifted, we are inviting you home and asking you to rejoin us sharing the wonderful privilege of weekend Mass. What better feast day to begin the obligation than the Feast of the Body and Blood of Jesus?

With an end in sight, I do want to take this opportunity to thank you, one and all, for your cooperation, loyalty and trust. When this pandemic began, there were many emotions experienced and expressed. There was fear, wonder, questions, sadness, anger, and anxiety. When the list of COVID deaths began to get longer and longer, we became more aware of the deadly nature of this illness. Not only that, but we became aware of how quickly this illness could spread. Two fears arose at this point: 1.) fear of catching the virus; and, 2.) fear of spreading the illness. No one wants to be sick, especially with an illness that can kill you. At the same time, no one wants to be responsible for another person getting sick and possibly dying. Thank you for taking the precautions that would preserve your life and keep others healthy. Your obedience to the rules was admirable and very much appreciated by me and the staff.

Our liturgies radically changed. No longer were we allowed to sing as the illness could be spread more quickly by singing. We were able to speak so we reverted to speaking all Mass responses and leaving the singing to the cantor. We were asked not to have tactile contact with others. We did not hug, we did not shake hands, the Sign of Peace was not to be given, we were asked not to gather into groups after Mass and chat. When we were told to go in peace, we were expected to do exactly that – go in peace. Holy Water was thought to be a way to pass the disease as hand after hand after hand touched the holy water as the congregation entered Church and gathered for Mass. The fonts were emptied. Processions were thought to help spread the disease as we walked close together and, in the case of the Offertory Process, a number of things were touched, carried and passed from hand to hand. So, our liturgies became static and isolated. Thank you for accepting these changes and making sacrifices to help insure the wellness of others. In many cases, folks did what we asked them to do without really knowing why! Thanks for trusting us.

One of the holiest parts of the Mass is sharing Holy Communion. When one form of Holy Communion was taken away from us (Communion from the Cup), we could have become angry. But we understood the wisdom of our Bishop feeling several people drinking from the same vessel was a sure way of passing along the illness. It wasn't so much as a denial of something as it was a safeguard and one which everyone graciously accepted. When we are under pressure, we are often asked to sacrifice, offering up the Cup was one of these sacrifices. Thank you for your willingness to refrain from the Cup – just for a time. It will be back. One of the sacrifices which affected me directly was receiving Holy Communion in the hand. Because of my cancer treatments, my lung surgery, a weak autoimmune system, I am particularly vulnerable to developing the COVID illness. By your receiving Holy Communion in the hand, you showed me that you cared. You made the sacrifice that people like me might be safe while fulfilling my ministry. You did what was very difficult for the good of others. I am deeply appreciative. Your gift to me did not go unnoticed and I said an extra prayer for you every time I gave you Holy Communion. I have not developed this infection and part of the reason for that is you. Thank you.

No one likes to be told what to do, when to do it and what to avoid. Out of love, concern, precautions and safety, the CDC, our State Government, our Bishop and I laid down the protocols. Were they all necessary? Were they right? Should we have had so many? We probably will never know. Did our parishioners develop COVID? Most certainly they did! Did some die! Yes, I was at many of their bedsides so I can testify to that. I believe, however, many more would have been sick and perhaps died had we not put these protocols in place, and I thank you for following them. I believe you helped save lives – one of them was probably mine.

We are not out of the woods there, but we can see the edge of the forest. Continue to pray, please. Continue to follow the protocols. Little by little they will fade away. But, never stop showing concern for your neighbor, never stop being willing to show love by the sacrifices you make, never stop extending yourself in the service of others. Doing so is not only faithful to Jesus' commands, but also what we do for people we love. Enjoy this month of June!

A Statement on a Return to Sunday Mass by the Roman Catholic Bishops of the Upstate New York Dioceses

Today, with vaccination rates rising, infection numbers across the state are falling and we are seeing the reopening of every sector of society, including businesses, restaurants and sporting events. Now it is also time to return to Sunday Mass.

The obligation to attend Holy Mass on the Lord’s Day is a sacred one. Anyone who is frail or at risk due to advanced age or medical conditions is always excused from this obligation, and we encouraged you to use your prudential judgement throughout this pandemic to determine if it was unsafe for you to attend Mass. This remains true.

However, for those who are healthy and not at great risk, the presumption of the faithful should be that, unless they are at an enhanced risk, sick, or caring for others who are at risk or sick, the obligation to attend Sunday Mass now resumes, effective the weekend of **June 5-6, 2021**, the Solemnity of Corpus Christi, The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ in our dioceses. One should consult their local pastor if questions arise about the obligation to attend. All required safety protocols and liturgical directives of each Diocese remain in place until modified or revoked by the respective Diocesan Bishop.

We are grateful to God to have reached this point, and we speak for all of our brother priests in saying we can’t wait to see you again. Come home to Mass.
