MULL-ING THINGS OVER

As we continue to roll back the pandemic restrictions, I want to take a moment to thank our hard-working pastoral staff. Right from the first day, I was impressed with their commitment to keep everyone as safe as possible. We all learned the necessary steps in preparing for the pandemic and then putting the proper protocols into place. This was a challenge at the beginning because we were getting orders from the CDC, the State of New York, and the Diocese. Sometimes what we learned on Tuesday was different by Friday. It was because everyone was learning about this new illness and trying to prevent its spread and to protect as many lives as possible. Our staff proved themselves to be infinitely patient and flexible. For this I am forever grateful.

Mary Olsen planned most of her religious ed program in the parish center. Because of the ban on Council and committee meetings and outside activities, the Parish Center could be set up and arranged for Middle School classes and for Confirmation I and II. Mary was constantly sanitizing, moving the spaced chairs, having her students sign in, and in constant communication with the parents. Remember this happened in Fall, Winter and Spring. Mary's conscientious oversight made sure no one became ill from these classes. Don Cass was equally ambitious in setting up orange cones to guide students in and out of the classrooms on Sunday mornings. He and his teachers made sure all was in order in their classrooms, that the students wore masks and the rooms were sanitized as soon as everyone left. The sacramental parents' sessions were held in the Parish Center and Don followed the same protocols that Mary followed for her programs. We are all grateful for how cooperative the students and parents were!

Dr. Williams spent most of last summer trying to plan for the opening school with classrooms safe for in-person teaching, desks were arranged for social distancing, hallways fortunately would be safe and allow the school to move in the safest manner possible. She and her faculty worked throughout the summer making sure we would pass inspection and be approved to open in September. At the same time, they had to plan for virtual classes should the need arise. There were countless meetings, staff and volunteers involved in moving furniture, sanitizing a whole building, ordering the necessary protection (gloves, masks, face guards, sanitizing fluids, and cleaning fluids) to meet the criteria necessary for regular in-person classes. It all paid off and with the wonderful cooperation of parents and teachers, the school year began and continued safe and protective of our children. I remember saying at one meeting, "The biggest problem is getting all the students to wear masks all day!" Not so, I was amazed how cooperative the students (from Pre-School through Eighth Grade) were, they seemed to like those masks. It never became a problem. Our staff was consciously evaluating and improving our standards during the school year to assure continued safety and protection. I am sure Dr. Williams and the school staff feel they put in two years in one – besides their continued teaching and guiding the students, they remain compliant with all the necessary protocols. I thank them for the love they showed all in the school and their willingness to walk the extra mile.

As the Spanish Ministry continued, Sister Kay was meticulously teaching about the pandemic, assuring safety in our Church as well in each family's home. She made sure that things were translated, and Father Carlos celebrated a livestream Spanish Mass for them each week. It was interesting how they added music even though the priest and the musician, Nancy Rowe, were in two different places! There were added challenges during our shut-down period; but Sister Kay kept in contact – even zooming her weekly Bible Study!

Our office was closed much of the year, but our staff was working isolated for awhile almost every day. They all took on extra duties and did so willingly when asked. Rebecca continued to oversee the finances, monitor the money coming in through mail and bank withdrawal. She devised new and safe ways for parishioners to contribute money and made sure individual accounts remained current. Being the Compliant Officer, she also monitored all the staff making sure we were compliant with the directions provided to us. Patti was ever-so patient with those who called or came to the door. I would often see her and Marie Milligan interviewing people on the front porch! The work got done and in a safe way. Patti, of course, kept all of us "in the loop;" and she helped keep all of us informed with new and changing regulations. Joanne Church was in helping anyway she could and made sure our computers were up and running so folks could do their work and go home to the safety of their homes. And, she did this while caring for a sick husband! Joanne helped make sure our parish Blast was sent and updated.

Betty DiFederico kept in touch with families who were planning burials, wishing to buy new graves, or searching for a long-lost relative. The pandemic gave homebound families the opportunities to check out their genealogies and Betty was there to help. She worked with her customary humor, strong work ethic, and kindness to everyone who sought help. We continued to celebrate funerals throughout the pandemic and the normal necessary steps had to take place – and did take place. The practical needs of the people continued, so Marie Milligan had to keep working. Whether it was from her home and back in her office, she was there for anyone who came to us in need. She dealt with everyone giving them dignity and gentleness and they explored what could be done. She had the extra challenge of having to deal with agency shut down or working on a reduced time schedule.

Chris Sauter-Milligan had a big challenge when she heard that the congregation would not be singing during the pandemic. She also found she had to put our choir on hiatus until it was safe for them to sing together. Our liturgies encourage and demand participation (and music is a big part of this). Chris had to become creative and help us continue our participation in different ways. She did not give up. She was here for every funeral, every wedding as well as weekend services. She was available for consultation, enhancing the school's liturgies and activities, and providing necessary guidance. I am grateful to her, Ron Trunzo, our cantors, and all who assisted the music ministry during this time.

It was Father Carlos who had the idea of livestreaming our worship and other activities. When he approached me, I was not exactly sure what he was talking about. He took the ball and ran with it. While the Church was closed, we livestreamed not only weekend Masses, but a private Mass celebrated each day. We might not be there face-to-face, but we were together in the spirit of prayer and many chose to join us on a regular basis. I am grateful for Father Carlos in planning and organizing the livestreaming and enlisting David Cataline and Tom Scherer to share responsibilities for setting up, recording, and taking down. Things would not have been readily available without their cheerful help. Father Carlos also lost his father to COVID-19. Even while he was away, and during his own bout with COVID-19, he kept in contact, prayed for us and let us know that he kept up with us through the livestreaming he set up!

Perhaps those hardest working were our maintenance men Chuck Bruzee and Peter Liberatore. They were at the demand of everyone! They did the heavy lifting, they ordered supplies, they did their usual work while taking on extra responsibility to ensure safety and protection. I am grateful to them for all they contributed. Even when they were not on the job, they were on call. Whenever I called them, they were there. In the same time frame, they also assisted the Geneva Housing project as the new apartments in our old school became available and our tenants moved in! They inspired deep confidence that when new protocols were given to us, we would comply and be safer because of it. I deeply appreciate the countless extra hours they gave us.

I have always been proud of the staff Our Lady of Peace has and was pleased with their performance during the pandemic. I want to publicly thank them and do so on your behalf. Father Carlos and I, during our quarantine, did not have to worry about anything as this great staff was working! If you see any of our staff, you might want to say a "thank you" as well! We were as near to normal as possible during this pandemic because our staff is competent, loves this parish and its people, and responded to the command of Jesus to love others at all time. 
Religious Education News


