MULL-ING THINGS OVER

Now that we are officially into summer, the Fourth of July has been celebrated, the schools are closed for the summer, and perhaps life has slowed down a little for you, it is time to reflect a bit on what Summer 2021 might become for you. These are the warm days when we do not have to worry about winter storms, activities cancelled because of the cold or the snow, having to put on heavy clothing and big, heavy winter coats. Life becomes a little more leisurely during July and August. We don't cook large meals – it is too hot. We tend to eat lighter and cold dishes. We also enjoy spending times out of doors with friends and families – since we are vaccinated and not isolated. Your social calendar may be filling up. But, what about your personal calendars – what are you going to do for the good of yourself?

Sleeping in is nice and we can always catch up on lost sleep. How are you going to renew yourself, replenish your energy and your relationship with God? You may want to consider a little longer prayer time. I am not suggesting hours – just minutes! Set a time when you can easily be quiet. I like the mornings. It helps me to add to my morning prayer time. Since we have more daylight each day, I like to sit near an open window with the rising sun shining in the window. I marvel at the colors of sunrise, the cool morning air brushing my face and the promise of another day of life. It is helpful to me to experience the beginnings of a day. It is one thing to let morning happen, it is another to sense morning happen – the movement from darkness to light, the changing light patterns, the singing birds, (what kind are they?) and the world waking up around us. This always puts me in a mood to pray as I thank God for another day of life. I then pray that God will help me get through this particular day. I also find it helpful to pray for the various individuals with whom I will have contact in the day.

I find myself a little more relaxed as I pray during the summer. For some reason I don't feel the pressure of "getting it done" because I have many things to do. I still have many things to do but summer seems to allow me to do things a little more leisurely. Maybe you are not a morning person. You may wish to extend your prayer time at another part of the day – after lunch, before dinner, before you go to bed? There are different sensual experiences we have during the day – all of them can tie into prayer. You may not have to add anything to your prayer just relish it amid the experience of the sensations of summer.

I don't know about you, but people occasionally give me books, or I set them aside for the right time to read them. Summertime may be that "right time." Most of the TV shows go into replays during the summer months. Maybe during your TV time, you can pass up the re-run and pick up your longed-for book. Reading can oftentimes relax us and even invite us to dream. Reading is a good discipline for our minds and challenges our sensory perceptions. When we start a story, we enter another new reality and it is nice "to get away." Reading a spiritual book allows us to reflect on a saint, or the Church, or another's life and sometimes find examples of things we can do to become a better person or man/woman of God. Some of the great spiritual writers have struck a chord and provided conversion experiences for people of faith simply by sharing their dilemmas, teaching their disciplines, or presenting an alternate spirituality.

Try getting out and taking a walk! I would suggest not doing it in the middle of a hot summer day! Walk in your neighborhood, go to a nearby park, take a stroll down to the lake, take in one of the local nature walk areas, think of your favorite spot, and go there! The walk doesn't necessarily have to be of long duration. Just getting out in the sunshine, the fresh air and moving is good for everyone. Those of us who live in upstate New York sometimes forget about the great beauty that surrounds. People go to great expense to travel here and spend some time here. We live here – perhaps this summer will be the time we get out and enjoy the beauty of our back yard.

As you travel, spend time with others and enjoy moving about – what we have not been able to do for the past year and a half – also remember to be cautious. New York State is open, but COVID-19 is still afflicting a few vulnerable people. Those vaccinated are safer than others but we must also know depending where we have been and those with whom we have spent time, we can carry the illness.

Washing our hands, wearing masks in those areas designated for mask use, and keeping a distance can help assure a good time and a safe time. Have a good week. Relax and enjoy these July days, remember to pray, and take a moment to listen to God!

Did you know?

St. Francis-St. Stephen School partners with St. Pauly Textile Inc. to collect used clothing and textiles. The school receives payment for these items, which are then distributed both here in the U.S. and worldwide to people who need them. St. Pauly collects over 120,000 pounds of clothing every day and estimates that this clothing ends up in 44 different countries yearly. In 2017 the company was able to help keep over 20 million articles of clothing out of landfills. The company was founded 22 years ago in Rochester and is an A+ rated member of the Better Business Bureau. Accepted items include clothing, shoes, sneakers, belts, purses, blankets, sheets, drapes, linens, pillow-cases and stuffed animals. Donors are asked to donate items in a plastic bag to protect against dirt and the elements. Receipts are available in a small box located on the shed which is located in the school parking lot. Please keep us in mind when you are cleaning out your closets. Your donation helps the school and the environment!
