MULL-ING THINGS OVER

Today we begin the month of August. August is one of those transitional months. On the one hand, it is still summer, and we have a whole month of summer activities ahead of us. But, in another sense, it is the beginning of the changes that happen as schools prepare to open. Folks go shopping for school clothes. Parishes, like us, collect school supplies especially for those who cannot afford them themselves. College students will begin their journeys back to college campus in hopes that this will be a year of face-to-face classes and college activities. Planning for Fall activities (like our October Dinner-Dance) begin to take shape. We are ordering supplies for Fall activities and for the school year.

During this month, we will receive updated guidelines from the CDC as to the safety procedures expected to be in place as school opens and we will begin to add more familiar activities to our Sunday Masses. For example, in September, we will once again have altar servers assisting the priest at Mass. The Offertory Processions of Bread and Wine will once again be in place. We will have the opportunity of praying with our new Deacon, Deacon Bob Cyrana at Sunday Mass. The college Mass at Hobert and William Smith Colleges will soon once again return. This year, we hope to begin Newman Club activities at the college, and we may see how they will intertwine with our parish activities. August is a busy month even though it is a summer month!

During this month, it is important to relax and enjoy the weather, the beauty of the season, the people who may be visiting and the young people who may be leaving to return to college. It is a time to continue our summer pace – even though the Fall pace is sneaking in... It is a time to recognize God in the beautiful flowers, the rich vegetables that come fresh to our tables, the family gatherings which take place outside around the barbecue. It is the time to feel God's presence in that nature walk that you have been planning, in the time spent at your cottage or summer home, to enjoy the Vacation Bible School, and get caught up in youthful enthusiasm. It is a time to appreciate the moon and the stars at night which we can comfortably watch without freezing or fear of slipping in the snow. It continues to be the time we upstate New Yorkers marvel at the beauty of our region that others travel here to see.

We will soon be celebrating the Feast of the Assumption of Mary. Given the great dignity of her role as Mother of the Savior and given the deep love God had for Mary because of her fidelity and gentle love for His Son, she was taken body and soul into heaven to live with God forever. She, herself, becomes a symbol for us of the promise of resurrection and new life after death. If we are faithful to God, God will be faithful to us. A week after the Assumption, we celebrate the Feast of Mary's Coronation as Queen of heaven and earth. Once again, our theology gives a special honor to Mary because of her role in salvation history and because of her intercessory influence with God. As she was reunited with her Son, she began a new role in once again intervening with Him (as she did at the wedding at Cana). We pray through Mary to her Son asking for our personal favors but also her assistance in helping us to be good faithful children of God.

As we move through the month of August, the Church in her role as teacher will invite us to retell the story of Jesus' public ministry, the miracles he performed, the teachings he gave and the example he offered to help us be part of the world's salvation. As we see Jesus heal the sick, help those with special needs (the blind and the deaf), and respond to people's questioning faith, we find ourselves in similar circumstances. We are not walking the roads of the holy land, but we are walking the roads of the world. We, too, have people come to us with their needs, with their prayers, with their hopes and dreams. In many ways, they trust us for guidance, good judgement, love, and an assistance that can sometime change our lives. We do not perform miracles like Jesus, but we can enter into the lives of others and help them carry a burden or "see the light," or offer hope. All within the ministry to which we are called are part of the ministry of the Catholic Church. As we prepare to launch into the Fall activities that begin after Labor Day, the Church wants us prepared with the grace and knowledge needed to be good disciples. Listen to the coming Sunday Gospels, hear the familiar stories of Jesus and his apostles, and realize that these biblical stories and your stories as well.

I hope you enjoy this new week. Say a prayer for good weather and a good week next week for our Vacation Bible School. (Remember that \$30 offering, if you choose to make it.) Get outside and take a walk and enjoy Upstate New York. Be at peace because you are loved by God and through His grace you love one another.



“Yo Soy el Pan de la Vida”

Mucha gente había conocido a Jesús por medio de sus sanaciones, las expulsiones de los demonios y algunos más por la multiplicación de los panes y pescados. Lo seguían y puede ser que quisieran ver más milagros o más pan; estando cerca de él iban a poder comer sin trabajar mucho. No entendían lo que todo eso significaba. Le preguntaron a Jesús, “¿Qué necesitamos para llevar a cabo las obras de Dios?” Supieron que Moisés y los otros hebreos comieron maná en el desierto, pero sin entender que no fue Moisés que había dado el pan del cielo, sino fue Dios. Así es en nuestras vidas; Dios nos da todo.

¿Qué necesitamos para poder entender lo que nosotros debemos hacer como cristianos en nuestro mundo y en nuestro tiempo? Ciertamente tenemos que estar abiertos a la acción de Dios en nuestras vidas; necesitamos escuchar la Palabra de Dios para conocer a Jesús y para escuchar lo que Él nos enseña. También tenemos que alimentarnos espiritualmente del cuerpo y de la sangre de Jesucristo—el pan de la vida—el pan eucarístico. Si realmente creemos en Jesucristo—su persona, sus enseñanzas y el sacramento que El nos dejó, vamos a recibir mucha vida—espiritualmente no vamos a tener hambre y sed. Tendremos lo esencial y eventualmente veremos que el hambre y la sed natural, y la muerte no son tan importantes. Nuestra verdadera felicidad y vida vienen de Dios.

Si creemos en Jesucristo y sus enseñanzas y vivimos su misión, aceptaremos a todas otras personas con amor como hermanos y hermanas. Este grupo de creyentes estará unido en paz y amor en comunidad intentando servir uno al otro. No habrá violencia, guerra, injusticias, falta de respeto verdad y honestidad. Necesitamos comer de Cristo más y más, reconociendo nuestra falta de dignidad de recibir a Dios dentro de nosotros, pero dejando a El penetrarnos y cambiarnos. “Oh, Dios Jesucristo fortalece nuestra fe en ti para que seamos mejores cristianos cada día.”

Este domingo **Michelle Chávez Aguilera va a recibir por primera vez el sacramento de la Eucaristía: el Cuerpo de Cristo.**] La comunidad se reúne con ella para alabar a Cristo y darle gracias porque haya otra persona en plena Comunión con Cristo. ¡Bienvenida, Michelle, a la mesa del Señor!
