MULL-ING THINGS OVER

Several years ago, I remember it was during the summer months, I was called to the hospital. When I arrived, I was directed to the Emergency Room. A gentleman from the parish had been admitted because of a heart attack and had asked to see me. The nurse kindly directed me to his room and as I entered, I was greeted by a booming voice. It was obvious that the patient was awake and aware of his surroundings. The man quickly told me that his wife was a patient upstairs and he wanted me to visit her but not tell her that he was here. I told him that she might get nervous with me walking into her room in the middle of the night and not saying why I was there. I couldn't tell her I just happened to drop by at 2:30 a.m.! He smiled and said he understood but he still thought I should stop and see her. I bargained with him. "I will go up," I said, "and if she is awake, I will go in." I offered to anoint him, and he took me up on the offer.

When I had left his room, I asked the nurse if anyone had told his wife that he was here? She did not know but checked with her supervisor. She came back to tell me, "No, she does not know." As I left the Emergency Department and got on the elevator, I wondered what I would say to her. As I arrived at her room, I peeked in the door, she was sitting there, lights on, reading a book. "You are staying up a bit late," I said to her. She looked over towards me, surprised, she greeted me and smiled, and said, "you are working a bit late, aren't you?" I asked how she was, and she told me, she was much better, and she was looking forward to getting out of the hospital and going home. She explained that she was concerned about her husband and she wanted to be home with him, I said nothing about him not being home but downstairs in the E.R. During our conversation, I was called out by the nurse.

The husband had had a second heart attack and was in poor shape, the nurse asked if I would return to the E.R. I said I would but asked if I should tell the wife? The nurse said that she was in a rather delicate situation and did not want her to be shocked. I went back into the room and told the woman that I had another call and would return soon. She smiled and waved. When I arrived once again in the E.R., their faces were very grim. I walked into the room just as he died. I walked over, took his hand, and gave him the Church's blessing and absolution. Then, I turned and said to the nurse – "Now, what are we going to do?" She looked at me with a tear in her eye and sent me back to the wife.

When I arrived back on the floor, I asked the nurse if any family had been called. She told me they had one son who did not live in town. They did have a telephone number for him. I called him and gave him the bad news. After a little conversation and lots of tears, I asked him about telling his mother. He thought it best if I told her face-to-face and then let him talk to her on the telephone. He said she would not be happy if she found out he had died, and no one told her until he was able to get into town. I agreed to be the messenger. When I re-entered the wife's room, she seemed removed from things, not talking clearly. I talked to the nurse who went to her bedside. In a moment, she had called an alert and many medical personnel rushed into the room. After much activity, the nurse came out and told me she was gone. I couldn't believe it!

The nurse came out and asked if I was okay. I assured her that I was – then, she asked, "Do you want to call her son, or should I?" I forgot; he was still on the phone!! I picked up the phone – he was still there – he asked me, "How did she take it?" I told him, "I have bad news for you, your Mom is gone." There was dead silence on the line. I waited, I could hear sobs and he was talking to someone. Before long, a female voice answered the phone. We spoke a bit together – intermittently because she was comforting the son and trying to keep track of our conversation. I got some information the nurse needed and then told them we would meet when they got into town. I also asked if it was okay to give the Funeral Director their telephone number. They agreed. I hung up.

It is hard to describe the emotions when two people die in your presence in such a short time – and a husband and wife as well! I went and sat down, asking myself, "What just happened?" It all seemed unreal – I asked myself, "Was there something I forgot to do?" Was there part of the emergency protocol we forgot? How could this happen on my watch? No answers. There was a confidence there that the right people were there when they were needed, the right things were done as was needed, death does occur, and we have to accept it.

I have often thought back on this night and told myself, don't put things off, say what needs to be said when it needs to be said. Stand ready in a situation even if you don't have something specific to do. Remember: we always leave the results in the Hands of God, after all, we are only a small part of the His master plan.
