MULL-ING THINGS OVER

This weekend we celebrate the Feast of the Assumption of Mary's body and soul into heaven. You will recall that when the angel came to Mary in annunciation of the birth of Jesus, the angel acknowledged that Mary was "full of grace." She had been chosen, set aside by God for a very special mission. If she said "yes," she was to bear His Son. After the question (if she would be the Mother of the Son of God) was asked, there was silence, it seemed the whole world was awaiting Mary's answer. Finally, Mary's lips spoke, "Let it be done to me according to your word." In that moment, Christ was conceived, "the Word became flesh," and the salvation of the world was at hand.

Mary believed. She did not understand exactly what her answer meant but she had faith that this was part of God's plan and she was part of God's plan and she would see this plan through to its end. Later, she would become famous for saying, "My soul does magnify the Lord, and my spirit rejoices in God my Savior!" Her faith, her "yes," began to help the world to realize the love of God as it shown forth through her Son. At various stages of her life, Mary would fall back on her simple faith. She had the courage to marry Joseph. Later, she agreed to travel with Joseph to Bethlehem knowing she was almost at the term of her pregnancy. In the middle of the night, arriving in Bethlehem, that Child was born. Mary experienced the kindness of the local people and settled in her makeshift nursery which looked like a stable! But that didn't last long, the angel awoke Joseph and told him to take Mary and Jesus away from Herod – go to Egypt to protect him!

After several years, the angel again appeared and encouraged Joseph and Mary to return to Nazareth. None of this was expected, but it all happened, and Mary continued to believe. Ever wonder what she prayed for? Have you ever asked if she asked the question, "Why?" We don't know the answer to those questions but each challenge, each conflict, each sword that pierced her heart must have encouraged her to pray and renew that faith she held in her heart. All the way to the foot of Jesus' cross, she believed. When we visualize the scene described as Mary and John stood at the cross watching helplessly as Jesus died; then, we feel her heart break as the dead body of her Son was placed in her arms, and then in sadness seeing her walk by that body as it was laid in a borrowed tomb, she believed.

We don't know how Mary knew of the Resurrection. Did He appear to her when she was alone or did He simply appear to her and the apostles at the same time – we don't know. In answer to her prayers, however, the dead Son she lay in the tomb was now standing, living, and breathing before her. She did not know how or why but she did believe. I am sure she embraced that Lord with a loving hug, held his hand, looked deep in His eyes, and she believed – believed more than she ever had before. He is Risen. He is alive! He will never die again.

It makes perfect sense that God, witnessing the life that Mary lived, and deeply aware of her fidelity and love would, when the moment of her departure from the earth came, simply bend down, scoop her up and allow an assumption that brought her before the angels, into the arms of her dear Joseph and allowed her to stand again, face-to-face, with her Son. It was God's faithfulness to her because of her faithfulness to Him that God simply brought her home. Finally, the Family is back together.

Not only does the Feast of the Assumption speak of the closure of Mary's earthly life and its continuation living in heaven, but it also becomes an example for each one of us – as Mary has gone so we shall follow! Mary spent her life caring for and supporting Jesus, and we have been asked to do the same. We are called to witness Jesus by our own faith, by the trust we witness when things get difficult, by the support we offer to others when things get difficult, and the gratitude we daily express to Jesus for all that He does for us. Her reward was heaven and so shall ours be. We all must die (or shall we say "fall asleep") but we are called to open our eyes to see the beauty of heaven.

Let us celebrate today with a sense of real hope, with a vision of what is to come, and with that same faith that Mary witnessed so often. It was a moment of triumph for Mary and one day will be for us. Have a great day and a great week! Remember to pray for our college students who will be leaving to begin another semester. May God guide them and keep them safe!

Did you know?

St. Francis-St. Stephen School partners with St. Pauly Textile Inc. to collect used clothing and textiles. The school receives payment for these items, which are then distributed both here in the U.S. and worldwide to people who need them. St. Pauly collects over 120,000 pounds of clothing every day and estimates that this clothing ends up in 44 different countries yearly. In 2017 the company was able to help keep over 20 million articles of clothing out of landfills. The company was founded 22 years ago in Rochester and is an A+ rated member of the Better Business Bureau. Accepted items include clothing, shoes, sneakers, belts, purses, blankets, sheets, drapes, linens, pillow-cases and stuffed animals. Donors are asked to donate items in a plastic bag to protect against dirt and the elements. Receipts are available in a small box located on the shed which is located in the school parking lot. Please keep us in mind when you are cleaning out your closets. Your donation helps the school and the environment!
