MULL-ING THINGS OVER

Today, August 22nd, is the Feast of the Queenship of Mary. You will remember that last week, we celebrated Mary's assumption into heaven. We reflected on the grand reunion: Mary unites with Joseph, her husband; Jesus, her Son; and God, her creator. Having completed the Holy Family's entrance into heaven, it seemed only right that Mary would be recognized for her special role in God's plan of salvation. Mary was spoken about by the prophets, proclaimed in the psalms, and honored by the apostles and the early Christian community. She was held in high esteem by the early Christians because of her blood relationship with Jesus. When Jesus, dying on the cross, gave Mary to John so that he could care for and protect her, he also gave Mary to the world. He wanted others to know her love, her wise counsel, her history, and her faith. Jesus loved His mother and wanted others to love her as well.

Mary's coronation is not described in the Bible. As a matter of fact, it is not mentioned in the Bible (except in the visions of the Book of Revelation). Mary's special designated role was founded in the traditions and teachings of the early first century Christian community. Mary occupied a special place in the hearts of those Christians. She was a widow, her husband dying when she was quite young. She was a mother who lost her only Son to a cruel and painful death. She lived in poverty and at the mercy of John and those who helped take care of her. As she had when Jesus was with her in the world, she had a definite trust in God. All of these qualities raised her up in the early Church. There was no reason to think that death would lower Mary's position. As a matter of fact, death would only enhance this position since her assumption took her directly to God.

This is a statement that ratifies the Church's teaching of life after death. If Mary was special in this world – she would have to remain special in the world to come. What does this mean? We don't know. Artists will recognize this reality through the action of coronation. You have seen the pictures – Mary is raised, angels seem to fly on either side of her, choirs of angels and the saints stand at attention to welcome her, Jesus and His Father seem to float in the air as they hold a crown waiting to set it on Mary's head. It is all an artist's rendition of Mary's coronation. As beautiful and as warm as it may make us feel – we really don't know how it happened – but we acclaim with the whole Church that Mary has assumed her rightful place in heaven. The living tradition of those early days of the Church has become the believed tradition of the Church triumphant.

Today's feast invites us to reflect on our own mothers. We are all well aware of the sacrifices our mothers made for us and our families. We know of the simple and unspoken ways that our mothers showed us love and taught us love. Most of us, when we think of our Moms, think of the good things they did for us, the goodness they brought out of us, the unconditional love that we knew was always there, and the privileged places they hold in our hearts. If it could be, we all would probably want to crown our Moms as the Queen of our Heart was the Queen of Heaven. There is that special maternal bond that exists both in this world and in the world to come. Like Mary, we don't know exactly how to put that into words, but we know that the bond is there. When we pray, we become aware of a unique connection that God allows between us and our mothers. Even though many of them may have left us for heaven, we still enjoy that bond. I like to tell people that I firmly believe that when I pray to my Mom – she is, in turn, praying for me as well. When Jesus taught us to pray, it was not simply words He taught but He invited us to enter a holy experience connecting us with God, Jesus, the Holy Spirit, Mary, the saints and all our loved ones. God is Father of our family! Intercessory Prayer is the holy activity that touches everyone's heart and lifts us up to God – even if only for a moment.

Perhaps this feast day, like Mothers' Day, invites us to take our Moms to heart once again, thanking God that we have them and inviting us to continue our love, support, and connection with them. In honoring our mothers, we honor Mary who is the patron saint of all mothers. In giving Mary the special recognition of Queen of Heaven and Earth, we offer that to our Moms who are queens of our hearts. Maybe today, you can take a moment and thank your Mom for her love, prayers, and support. If your Mom has died, perhaps a little prayer might be whispered where you tell her that even though resting in death, she is alive in your heart. Yes, we honor Mary today – but we can honor Moms as well.

As our college students leave us to begin another school year, and as the students from Hobart/William Smith return to town, we wish all of them a blessed, happy, and safe semester. We will miss you, but you remain in our hearts. Enjoy the final weeks of summer and celebrate this beautiful time of year. Be good to your Mom!


