### MULL-ING THINGS OVER

Part of the Marriage Preparation for couples getting ready for their weddings at Our Lady of Peace includes a discussion about the professions each person is practicing. Questions like, “Does your profession identify who you are?” or “What percentage of your time is spent working professionally?” These are questions meant to help the couple define the parameters of their professional lives and where their couple life, family life, personal lives, etc. fit into who they are and how they define themselves. For instance, if you are a professional lawyer, do you define yourself first as a lawyer, then a wife, a mother, a daughter, or what? Does what you do define who you are?

So often because our profession demands so much of our daily time, we define ourselves by what we do, the law we practice, the medical assistance we offer others or the education that comes in our classroom. The Church, of course, defines us first as a Child of God, made in the image and likeness of the Creator. Our professions are meant to help us hone our God-given gifts and talents and then put them at the service of our family and others. Because of our professions, we earn money, develop our talents, improve ourselves, and provide for our families.

This weekend, we once again celebrate Labor Day. It is a national holiday by which we as a nation celebrate human labor which continues to build up our country allowing it to be strong, function with order, utilize the rich talents of a multitude of individuals and, on a national level, to become servants to one another. Its origin can be found in early Labor Unions which were formed to help protect the rights of workers, and help to build safe factories and workplaces where laborers are protected, the risk of accidents is minimized, and workers are treated with dignity and respect. Workers need to be assured of a living wage, just benefits and opportunities to grow and develop.

There used to be many parades on this holiday during which workers could lobby for improvements, justice, and true equality. There were times in our history when violence was even evident on this holiday because laborers and owners were standing on opposite sides. There were some values that were challenged, and our society often grew from these conflicts.

Today Labor Day has become the last holiday of the summer. Soon after the holiday, schools in the Northeast open and a new routine is established for families as summer comes to an end and autumn takes over. It is a day of transition from which comes the reminder that our country’s greatness still depends on basic human labor, and the willingness to develop our talents, allowing our national prosperity to grow. It helps build pride in America and a sense that we are doing good for others even as we support ourselves. It is an annual call to action where “Made in America” means something.

Being a part of the industrial society in which we live, we often find folks identifying themselves by the job they do – doctor, nurse, lawyer, teacher, fireman, policeman, postal servant, funeral director, Mayor, City Council Representative, and so on... It is a common way that we identify others and describe ourselves. We need to, however, be careful that we don’t define a person by what they do. One of the important aspects of our Eucharistic Liturgy is the understanding that when we enter the Church, we leave our labels outside. We stand before God as his family, equal, defined by grace not our work, and enjoying a certain freedom that we are all equal in the sight of God.

The above warnings given to engaged couples are meant to help them set priorities for themselves, realizing the priority in a marriage is our partner – the husband or wife we are marrying and with whom we will be spending the rest of our lives. Growing closer to one another in love during their marriage they identify more and more as a couple and as a family. When we labor, it is with and for our partner and our family. We then build our country on the solid foundation of strong family life and people willing to make sacrifices and willing to continue building this wonderful country, not because of what we receive, but by what we give.

This Labor Day say a prayer in thanksgiving to God for what He has given us and what we have the privilege of developing. Look back with love in your hearts to our ancestors who sacrificed much to help create the country in which we live. Take the challenge of today as the struggle to continue to work to bring dignity to all our laborers and recognize every job as vital for getting a project done!

## Did you know?

St. Francis-St. Stephen School partners with St. Pauly Textile Inc. to collect used clothing and textiles. The school receives payment for these items, which are then distributed both here in the U.S. and worldwide to people who need them. St. Pauly collects over 120,000 pounds of clothing every day and estimates that this clothing ends up in 44 different countries yearly. In 2017 the company was able to help keep over 20 million articles of clothing out of landfills. The company was founded 22 years ago in Rochester and is an A+ rated member of the Better Business Bureau. Accepted items include clothing, shoes, sneakers, belts, purses, blankets, sheets, drapes, linens, pillowcases and stuffed animals. Donors are asked to donate items in a plastic bag to protect against dirt and the elements. Receipts are available in a small box located on the shed which is located in the school parking lot. Please keep us in mind when you are cleaning out your closets. Your donation helps the school and the environment!


## Box Tops for SFSS School

## Valor y Dignidad del Trabajo

Desde el año pasado hemos escuchado mucho del trabajo y de lo que el gobierno piensa que son los trabajos esenciales. Entre ellos son trabajadores agrícolas, trabajadores de la salud, primeros respondedores, los trabajadores en los supermercados, etc. El trabajo tiene valor para la persona que lo hace y para los que reciben los beneficios del trabajo. Puede ser que de vez en cuando usted piense “¿por qué estoy gastando tanto tiempo y esfuerzo haciendo un trabajo cuando poca gente lo aprecia mis esfuerzos?” No subestime el valor de su trabajo--todo tipo de trabajo tiene valor y dignidad; hay trabajo con y sin remuneración.

Mucha gente perdió su trabajo el año pasado y al perder su trabajo, algunas estaban pensando que perdieron su valor personal. Habían adjuntado la idea de su valor personal al trabajo por el que se les pagaba. El valor personal y el valor del trabajo son dos cosas distintas. Pero es importante trabajar; cada trabajo hace una diferencia en la persona realizándolo y en la persona que recibe los resultados del trabajo. Cuando está sirviendo alguien y haciendo un servicio de algún tipo, está mostrando el amor hacia esa persona. Los trabajos tienen valor y usted necesita tomar orgullo en su trabajo, haciéndolo lo mejor que posible y responsablemente.

El trabajo debe fortalecer nuestra vida familiar, brindando recursos y respeto, beneficios y atención médica para las familias. El trabajo debe permitir que la familia viva con dignidad. Realmente por medio de nuestro trabajo vamos continuando la creación de Dios. Las cosas que hacemos son contribuciones al bien común de nuestra sociedad.

¿Ha pensado en la posibilidad de desarrollar una espiritualidad de trabajo? Hay que empezar por pedir la presencia y ayuda de Dios en su día del trabajo. Tiene que empezar a hacer algo espiritual consciente y fielmente para poder cambiar su consciencia de lo que está haciendo.

Algunas sugerencias pueden ser: (1) Poner algunos objetos religiosos o fotos de la familia y amigos que tienen un significado profundo de espiritualidad. (2) Reconocer regularmente que usted es humano y va a hacer errores. Hay que vivir con imperfecciones para poder reconocer el santo y divino en la vida. Somos débiles y necesita la ayuda de Dios para poder hacer el reino de Dios en la tierra. El trabajo no es la única cosa importante en la vida. Tenemos que equilibrar el trabajo con otras responsabilidades. (3) Debemos hacer el trabajo lo mejor que posible para que el trabajo puede alimentar nuestras vidas espirituales. (4) Hay que dar gracias y felicidades a otros trabajadores y a sí mismo por un trabajo bien hecho. Hay que tratar a otras personas con quienes trabaja como desearía ser tratado. (5) No es posible siempre mejorar y hacer más de lo que ya está haciendo. Hay que decidir cuándo usted ha hecho bastante y seguir haciendo esa buena cualidad de trabajo sin intentar hacer más, metiéndose en una vida llena de estrés.

Espero que pueda sentir la presencia de Dios en su lugar del trabajo y en el trabajo mismo. Haga con orgullo su trabajo y ofrezca ese trabajo por la gloria de Dios.
