MULL-ING THINGS OVER A LETTER FROM OUR BISHOP

My dear brothers and sisters in Christ:

On September 12th of this year, it will be two years since the Diocese filed for bankruptcy under Chapter 11 of the United States Bankruptcy Code in order to address in the best and fairest manner possible the now approximately 475 claims (this is the number of claims, not the number of persons accused) brought against the Diocese by the survivors of childhood sexual abuse by clergy, religious and laity.

Over these past two years, all parties concerned have been seriously affected, certainly the survivors, our priests and others in diocesan ministries who have had no part in these egregious acts, but who daily continue to serve the faithful, and truly, my sisters and brothers, all of you rightly scandalized and your faith shaken by those who violated a sacred trust and betrayed their promise to serve faithfully Our Lord and His Church. Naturally everyone wants a resolution, especially the survivors. Bringing this process to a conclusion has been a long and arduous task further exacerbated by the Coronavirus pandemic. Nonetheless, seven mediation sessions were conducted with the Official Committee of Unsecured Creditors appointed by the Office of the United States Trustee, which comprises several representative survivors, together with the insurers, and the Diocese. Sadly, these sessions held virtually did not result in a settlement agreement.

To move the process along, at a hearing conducted by telephone on July 9th last, United States Bankruptcy Judge Paul Warren ordered the parties concerned to return to in-person mediation with the United States Bankruptcy Judge Gregg Zive in Reno, Nevada, where Judge Zive resides. However, because of recent surges of the Coronavirus, especially in localities such as Reno, Nevada, the mediation will continue as scheduled from August 31st to September 2nd, but alternate arrangements have been made to conduct the mediation. I ask for your prayers that a clear path may be developed toward a final resolution, with compassion and justice for the survivors, while also ensuring that the sacramental, spiritual, catechetical, pastoral, and charitable ministries of the Diocese continue for the welfare of all our diocesan family.

I am so sorry, and I again apologize to the survivors of childhood sexual abuse for the pain, anxiety, heartache and even loss of faith that they, as well as their families, have suffered over these years. While renewing my apology especially to our survivors, I pray that we reach a conclusion that provides for them and their families some hope, renewed faith and restores their belief that Jesus never abandons us, as He is ever faithful to His promise, "And, behold, I am with you always even unto the end of the world." (Matthew 23:20).

This month, I reach seventy-five years of age. In accordance with Canon #401, #1 of the Code of Canon Law, I will submit my resignation from the office of Bishop of Rochester to His Holiness, Pope Francis. It, then, is entirely the decision of Pope Francis regarding his acceptance of this resignation and when it will become effective. Several other Diocesan Bishops in the United States are continuing past seventy-five years of age until the Holy Father appoints their successors. We all await and accept in obedience the will of our Holy Father. I would hope to be able to see the Diocese through to the completion of the bankruptcy process, thereby relieving my successor of this painful situation. His will be the task of rebuilding and, I pray, a new time will dawn, and this very sad episode of our diocesan history is passed. But, always praying daily for all who suffered through this period and taking every precaution that the grievous sins of the past not be repeated.

In the end, I place my trust in the Lord and in His Vicar on Earth, our Holy Father, Pope Francis, repeating the words of our Blessed Mother Mary, Our Lady of Sorrows, "Thy will be done." (Luke 1:38).

Asking your prayers and begging the intercession of God's Mother and our Mother, and our diocesan patron, St. John Fisher, I remain



¡Feliz Día de la Patrona de las Hermanas de la Misericordia!

El viernes de esta semana, 24 de sept., es la fiesta de Nuestra Señora de la Misericordia, la patrona de mi congregación. No es una fiesta solemne de la Iglesia universal, pero para nosotras las hermanas y nuestras asociadas (hombres y mujeres que han hecho una alianza con nosotros, siguiendo una vida de misericordia, el carisma de nuestra congregación), la fiesta es motivo para celebrar. Fue María, una mujer y la madre del Misericordioso, que nos desafía vivir la misericordia. Como María nos disponemos a recibir la Palabra de Dios y actuar de acuerdo con ella. Vamos a reunirnos por oración para reanimarnos espiritualmente y por un tiempo social con algo para comer el viernes en nuestra casa central en Rochester. Echo de menos este tipo de vivencia comunitaria.

La misericordia es tan central en nuestras vidas y nuestro servicio. Tanto me gusta el nombre de mi congregación, misericordia. Como otras organizaciones, gobiernos y congregaciones, tenemos Constituciones y en la primera oración de ese documento se dice, “Catalina McAuley (nuestra fundadora), respondiendo desde la fe a la misericordia de Dios, escuchó el llamado de Jesús de entregarse con audacia y amor a los necesitados de su tiempo.” El 11 de diciembre de 1831 Catalina fundó la congregación, aunque ella nunca había pensado fundar una congregación religiosa. Mujeres solteras en ese tiempo no andaban las calles ayudando a los necesitados, pero como miembros de una congregación religiosa les fue posible. Ella sentía la misericordia para los pobres, los enfermos y los que faltaban educación y quería responder con misericordia a los que vivían en Irlanda donde ella vivía. Desde mi entrada a la congregación hace 62 años he visto muchos cambios en la manera de responder a los necesitados de nuestros tiempos. La idea es que nos comprometemos a seguir a Jesucristo en su compasión por los que sufren. La mayoría de las congregaciones religiosas tienen los tres votos de castidad, pobreza y obediencia, pero nosotras también tenemos un cuarto voto de servicio a los que sufren pobreza, enfermedad e ignorancia. Hay énfasis especial en ayudar a los pobres y apoyar a las mujeres.

Como Cristo había pedido sus discípulos ir a todas naciones, para proclamar el evangelio, hemos tenido que desarrollar una visión global de las obras de la misericordia. Estamos en América Latina, América del Norte, Europa, algunos países de África y Asia. Nuestras hermanas en las Filipinas fundaron una misión recientemente en Vietnam.

Ustedes pueden decirme si yo logro ser un testigo de misericordia y justicia. Es mi intento, pero a veces no lo hago bien. Es solo con la misericordia de Dios que podemos ser misericordiosos. Ninguna persona puede hacer todo solo, y es por colaborar con otros en las obras de misericordia, cuando voy aprendiendo de otros cómo ser misericordiosa. Tenemos que estar por medio de oración y observación atentas a las necesidades de otros y usando talentos personales, vivir la misión de la misericordia. Algunos retos son reverenciar la dignidad de cada persona, crear un espíritu de hospitalidad, y buscar integrar la palabra y acción en nuestras vidas. Invito a todos ser más misericordiosos.
