MULL-ING THINGS OVER

Recently, I celebrated a funeral at St. Stephen's Church. For the burial, we went to the mausoleum at St. Mary's Cemetery. It was quite a large funeral. Many people were present at the cemetery. We also had the privilege of burying a veteran, so the military was present for the Military Burial Service. We proceeded into the mausoleum and we had a single chair for the widow to sit in. No sooner had she sat down, her great-grandson went over and sat on her lap. He remained there throughout the ceremony. It was precious to see the grieving widow hug her great-grandson, and he clung to her. The military solemnly folded the flag when the flag was presented, the widow held one end of it, the great-grandson held the other. It reminded me of the spectrum of life. This wonderful lady stood by her husband's side as he defended this country. For what? For that little great grandchild who has his whole future ahead of him. Ah, the spectrum of life visible right before my eyes. This was a moment which reminded me of the preciousness of life no matter what stage we might find ourselves.

October is Respect for Life month. Each year the Bishops' Conference sets aside this month for the opportunity for her children to reflect on the preciousness of human life. We are called to be grateful for the life God gave us. We have the great freedom of determining what road that life will take. We are free to make choices to determine what type of life we will live and what our life's priorities will be. We are invited to reflect on how our life choices affects not only ourselves but many others. In the scene above, it is clear that this deceased veteran had made choices to protect his family, to give them life and then let them determine where their lives would lead. He worked hard all his life and provided for his family, went to Church to pray for them and brought them to church with him and his wife. He encouraged them to appreciate the depth of the meaning of family and encouraged them to make family the center of their lives and he had made it central to his own life. Generously did he and his wife sacrifice so that their family would have things they did not have. He was also committed to serving the wider community and not just himself and his family. Service was at the heart of his life. He became a servant of God.

As I reflected on this grandmother and her great-grandson, I became deeply aware of how many people are intertwined with me and with my life. Not only do I come from a big family, but that family has become a bigger family. Having become a priest and been given the opportunity to join many Church Families, I have been blessed by the example and love of many and I still carry many wonderful memories with me enhancing my life and enriching my memory. Life is precious because of its origin in God and because of the many strands of life that crisscross and form a tapestry of life scenes and opportunities. And, that tapestry constantly expands and becomes richer. What a gift people are to us and we to people.

I watched folks leaving the mausoleum, many holding hands, some hugging one another as they approached their individual cars. The cars processed out as they had come in; but somehow, we were all richer from that funeral experience. All of us tend to evaluate our lives when we mourn the passing of a loved one. What have I done with my life? How have I influenced others? What gifts have I used that have assisted others? How deep is the meaning of life because I have lived? What will I continue to do to enhance my life and show deep appreciation to God? All this is appropriate to start off October – Respect Life month.

All of us have had experiences in our life that help to set a part our lives to deepen our life's meaning. What are some of yours? Don't tell anyone, just imagine. All of us have much for which to be grateful. What are some of the things for which you are grateful? Many of us make new resolutions when we encounter these life-altering moments? What are some of your life-resolutions? During this wonderful season of autumn take some time to be grateful. Take some time for yourself and remind yourself that you are precious in the eyes of God. Relish who you are and what you are becoming because of God and those with whom you surround yourself. Respect Life Month does not have to be theoretical thinking alone, nor does it have to be simply holy thoughts. Life is good. We need to make it better. Name names and bring them to prayer. Keep your eyes open for new ways to serve. Be grateful you are a child of God and live in a world waiting to be formed by your presence, your faith, and your God. When the time comes for you to pass, what will be the memories folks will have at your grave? Enjoy the week, God bless you!

Hay tantas razones que empujan personas dejar lo conocido para enfrentar lo desconocido.

En las noticias recientemente son los migrantes de Haití que han llegado a Del Rio, Texas después del asesinato de su presidente y un terremoto y huracán que han creado una situación difícil para muchos. También hay muchos de Afganistán que están viviendo en carpas en bases militares por varias partes del mundo. Como en años pasados hay muchos que llegan a este país de países latinos.

Estos movimientos de tantas personas en el mundo nos llaman a ver los miedos y esperanzas de todas estas personas. Son seres humanos y son hermanos nuestros como el Papa Francisco habla de todos en el mundo. Es importante compartir; Dios vive entre todos nosotros—su pueblo; ofreció su reconciliación no a individuos solamente sino a su pueblo. Ahora estamos llamados a salir a las periferias para curar los heridos y buscar los perdidos, sin prejuicios o miedos, sin proselitismo para acoger a todos. ¿Vamos a manifestar a ellos el amor, mostrándolos como los cristianos tratan unos a otros? Esto es otra oportunidad de “construir juntos nuestro futuro de justicia y de paz, asegurando que nadie quede excluido.”

En vez de encerrarnos en nuestro país sin dejar pasar otros para adentro, tenemos la posibilidad de conocer mucha gente de otros países y vivir en armonía y paz. Es posible vivir en paz y concordia si pensemos en todos como nosotros y no solamente en el yo. El Papa Francisco nos desafía construir puentes que favorezcan la cultura del encuentro, viendo las conexiones entre nosotros, enriqueciéndonos por los diversos dones de todos.

Que acogamos los excluidos, rechazados y descartados con amor y tratarlos como hermanos. Intentemos mirar los ojos de la persona desconocida que puede ser de otro país, de otro idioma o religión y ver y responder a sus sentimientos y necesidades. “Cuando lo hicieron con alguno de los más pequeños de estos mis hermanos, me lo hicieron a mí”.
