MULL-ING THINGS OVER

I recently lost a good friend to cancer. He was a brilliant man. Had a wonderful wife, a good family, and enjoyed many blessings because of his work, his personality, and his deep faith. In a previous parish, he guided his wife through the RCIA process. He and she became ministers of the Holy Eucharist and went to a Nursing Home once a month on Sundays. He had a gentle way about him, loved to talk, could talk about just any topic and the older folks looked forward to his visits. He was always offering to help with this or that.

About a year ago, he called me to tell me that he had developed cancer. It was in his lung and was M.A.L.T. lymphoma. This, of course, is the same type of cancer that I have. I told him a bit of my experience in the beginning and told him how great the oncologists, nurses and social workers were to me. "I am sure you are in good hands," I said. He was. As a matter of fact, I found out later that he was assigned to my oncologist! He went through a series of chemotherapy treatments and seemed to be doing well. When I talked to him, he was always positive. He was a researcher and constantly worked to know as much as he could about his disease. We would compare notes and speak of how fortunate we were that they have treatments now for those who have this cancer. And the fact that these treatments were most often successful was a plus! His cancer went away.

After about six months, the cancer returned. Both of us had been warned by our oncologist that this type of cancer never really goes away – it can become dormant for several years but does come back. He was given some options and chose to begin another series of chemotherapy treatment. All seemed to go well. He was eternally inquisitive and would tell me of some new fact he had discovered. His wife was the hero. She wholeheartedly supported him. Drove him to treatments, shared in his positive outlook, prepared the meals he wanted, and prayed, prayed, prayed. He was told that his cancer was in remission. He went home jubilant! He and his wife celebrated another victory.

Then, the phone call came. It was a week after he had gotten news of the second successful outcome. "I have to see you," the oncologist said. Noting the alarm in her voice, the appointment was made the next day. He was scheduled for a CAT scan and met with the doctor after that had been completed. He was told that the cancer was not in remission, as a matter of fact, it had spread! It was now at a point that nothing more could be done. He was going to die.

He called me and I was in shock. We talked over the phone and I later went to see him. He was again positive, speaking of how blessed his life was, what a blessing his wife was to him, the beautiful house he lived in, the view from his room which showed the beauty of nature out every window. He gave me a book of poetry that he had written. He also talked about his future. I offered him the Anointing of the Sick and gave him and his wife Holy Communion. Then, we sat and talked – he was concerned about me and how I was doing. We talked about the garden and how well it was producing this year. He was looking forward to seeing his family – they were traveling in to see him. It was a sad visit but also surprisingly refreshing. He recalled some of our experiences and wondered about how his wife would do when he was gone. She was resilient, strong, and positive. She would be okay.

This wonderful man passed away in his hospice bed in his home. A wonderful funeral service was celebrated, and he was buried in a little country cemetery surrounded by a corn field and trees. Within a year he was gone, and he is missed. He had such a love of life that I cannot but help but think of him embracing life with God with the same fervor that he lived his life in this world. Cancer did not conquer him. He had simply used it as a path to God and new life. His living has gone on, now no pain, no suffering, no medications, and no weakness. He is renewed with God!

As we continue through Respect Life month, this story reminds me that life is not limited to the moment our eyes open for the first time in this world nor is it terminated when we permanently close those eyes in death. Life is what we make it. Seeing people, things, nature, the sun, the moon, feeling the fresh air and knowing of the love of others – this is human life – this is the experiences of living that really has no boundaries. Whether helping others or being helped yourself; whether working your job and having others work to take care of you; when we treasure a moment and live out a day – life has so many dimensions, we cannot even know them all. It is for this reason that we respect life. It is why we can find God in so many faces and so many places. Only with deep faith can we chose to fight an illness and still stay positive. Only with grace, can we go through treatment and plan for tomorrow. Only with a healthy soul can we think about others when we are dying. Life! What a precious gift! How good of God to create it in such a way that it does not end but simply transforms us so we can live all over again in heaven. Have a great week – respect one another.

Hay Fuerza Cuando Trabajamos Juntos

A veces pensamos que somos mejores que otros o mas cercanos a Dios y que merecemos más de Dios que otros. Santiago y Juan pidieron lugares especiales en el reino de la gloria de Jesús. ¡Wow! Ellos habían seguido a Jesús como los otros diez, pero se sintieron privilegiados, separándose de los otros diez.
