MULL-ING THINGS OVER

I find it fascinating to baptize children. When we baptize, it seems the family travels in from all over! We have grandparents, great-grandparents, brothers, sisters, aunts, uncles, and cousins, and an assortment of friends and co-workers. Sometimes we will have 100 people or more attending a Baptism! During the COVID intense time, we did not baptize or had very small baptismal ceremonies. The larger crowds are returning as people once more begin to travel.

Of course, we have two separate families gather for the Baptism – family of the Mother and family of the Father. In many cases I will hear people say, we haven't seen you since the wedding. If individuals don't live close, they would not be running into one another. So, in many ways, a Baptism becomes a reunion!

Recently, I celebrated a Baptism for a couple whom I married four years ago. They now live in Pennsylvania. Before we began the ceremony, the spirit of reunion was in the air! There were greetings, hugs, and kisses. There were smiles and everyone wanting to "see" the baby and hold the baby. I talked a moment with the couple about what had happened since the wedding and spoke with their parents. In a way, getting in touch with one another, catching up with one another, and settling down to pray was a good introduction to the ceremony. The Baptismal Ceremony opens with a greeting to the parents, the naming of the child, and the marking of the child with Sign of the Cross. The priest or deacon then welcomes the new child into the Church. The Church wants the family to know it is her great joy that another son or daughter (in this case, a daughter) is joining the Church. She welcomes all and invites all to settled down, recognize that we are all part of God's Family and surround the baby with both love and prayer.

There are all sorts of traditions families have personalizing the Baptismal ceremony. For instance, the baby often wears a beautiful Baptismal gown. Very often, it is a family heirloom that has been passed down from generation to generation. In my family, my sisters and brothers and I were baptized in my Mom's baptismal gown. All thirty-one grandchildren were also baptized in this baptismal gown. We had to retire it because it was getting pretty thin – so it is framed now to remind us of its significance in our family. In the Baptism to which I refer above, the grandmother told me that she had taken part of her wedding dress and had it redesigned to become the baby's baptismal gown – and it was beautiful, and, I am sure, carried with it many memories of its previous use. It will now become available for future Baptisms. Such traditions tend to deepen the meaning of the Baptismal ceremony and the Baptismal day.

As we moved closer to the moment of Baptism, the Church's prayer continually calls the parents and godparents and all present to remember that they are called to surround this baby with love, to serve as living examples of what Christ taught us to be, and to remain a constant support for this newest member of our Church community. As we made the Baptismal Promises together, we promised our belief in Father, Son and Holy Spirit and all that means in our hearts and souls. Like all the sacraments, Baptism is offered to the individual child, but every participant is called to remember his/her own Baptism and that the sacrament's significance continues today. The Church is a living body, continuing to grow and be filled with the grace of God. The Church is only as strong as her members and her members become strong through God's holy grace.

The water is poured, the anointings are completed, the candlelight is passed on and with a special blessing for the mother, a special blessing for the father, and a special blessing for all present, it comes to any end. But does it? The whole church seems exhilarated when the ceremony ends. We are all happy for the child, of course; we are happy for the parents and proud that they brought the child for Baptism; we are also proud of all those who gathered to show love, to witness pride in their faith, and the willingness to support our newest Catholic. A new life has been dedicated to God and we have been a part of it.

During this Respect Life month, we are asked to look for signs of our commitment to life and our joy in embracing God's life. I can think of no better moment to recall than a baptismal ceremony. We are all precious in the sight of God, we are all committed to being the best person we can possibly be, we must love life to respect it and spread it. I said that I find Baptism a fascinating sacrament to celebrate. So many different people are there. So many relationships are renewed and blessed. So many come to recognize the present of God in that holy moment. Thank you, God, for life – especially life you transform by consecration in baptismal water! Have a good week!

RESPECT LIFE ALL WAYS

Now that October - Respect Life Month - is coming to an end, I would like to remind you of the ways we have respected life right here in our own parish.

We have assisted many people with funds to in-part pay their utilities and water bills so that they could stay in their homes, not be evicted and have a haven for their families. You donated hundreds of dollars to the Hunger Collection so that those same people could be fed or have the Center of Concern purchase food for the Center's daily distributions. You fed people. You physically fed them by volunteering at the Community Lunch

Program and seeing people face to face and feeding those in most need. You donated school supplies to support the children getting ready to go back to school - no matter what form school took. Extra supplies were donated to the Center of Concern for them to put in Christmas boxes - by then children will need new supplies. By this you have respected their desire for learning and helped them to be productive people.

You gave blood to the American Red Cross blood drives. Every unit given saves three lives.

You donated furniture to be given to those who needed it and we were able to coordinate the givers and those who were fortunate enough to be able to take it. You have begun donating for the Thanksgiving Baskets. Boxes of stuffing have already been donated, the school and religious education and the Boy Scouts have begun collecting food. Eight local agencies along with Sr. Kay and myself are compiling lists of those who will receive a wonderful Thanksgiving dinner.

You have always volunteered to collect, sort, pack and bag food for the baskets-I'm sure you will do so again this year. I'm sure I'll see many faces the day of the distribution November 22 at the Parish Center, helping to hand out the baskets. Respecting life, again. We will also feed the men at 5 migrant camps - those who put food on our tables - will have food on theirs, from you.

I also want to thank all who have supported this ministry over the past months when things were far from normal and yet we carried on and did the work. If we keep respecting life there is no end to good we can do, all in the name of Christ.
