MULL-ING THINGS OVER

It is the beginning of a great week in the Church! Today is Halloween – while not a liturgical feast, it has much to do with tomorrow's feast, All Saints' Day. Today was to be a day of prayer in earlier cultures where the people would pray to be spared the influence of evil spirits. It was a day of fasting and sacrifice asking God to drive out evil spirits, protect God's holy people from the influence of the devil, and pray that people would be spared the influence of evil and be protected by the good spirits – the angels. All sorts of traditions began, from music, to dancing, to incantations, to intense prayer, to burning the effigy of the devil, to gathering for Mass and processions. On All Hallows Eve, evil was sacrificed, and all awoke to All Saints' Day the celebration of God's good people and a reminder of joyful life with God in heaven.

All Saints Day was a day of prayer and celebration. Special Masses were held to gather the people at prayer and celebrate the goodness of God. Special foods, treats and meals were prepared and shared with neighbors and friends. Oftentimes, processions would happen when people would dress up as their favorite saint and proceed through the town. The Saints' stories were told, and the celebrations would last into the night. In Medieval times, plays would be written and acted out. It usually would be the story a saint, his/her goodness portrayed, or his/her death and martyrdom portrayed, also examples from a saint's life would be recited or portrayed – such plays would become teaching tools about the saint and of the Church's beliefs. All Saints' Day celebrations would lead to All Souls' Day commemoration. This year, the Feast of All Saints is not a holy day of obligation – so, we will follow our usual daily Mass schedule: 7:00 a.m. (Mass at St. Stephen's Church); (12:10 p.m. Mass at St. Francis deSales Church).

The day after All Saints' Day was named All Souls' Day because the Church wanted to honor not only those who had made it to heaven but also those who were on the road to heaven. Today, we put great stress on remembering past events. We recently celebrated the twentieth anniversary of 9/11. We prayed for those who died in the twin towers, on Flight 95 and in the Pentagon. We vowed twenty years ago that we would not forget – and we continue to maintain the day and the memories. All Souls' Day was meant for the same purpose. Even though our loved ones have passed away, we promise them we will not forget. And we don't! We keep pictures of them in our homes. We honor them on birthdays, anniversaries, at their graveside, and through warm memories. This remembrance moves us to prayer – prayer to assist them on their journey, prayer to calm our fears, prayer, like on All Saint's Day that allows us to raise them up to God. On the previous Sunday, at each Mass we celebrate, the names of those who have died and been buried from our Lady of Peace Parish are solemnly read. Each name echoes through the Church and inspires memories in the very place we made our last good-byes. We also have a special Mass in St. Mary's Cemetery where we go to the place that many of their burials took place and look out at the field, see the headstones, and recall who is buried there. As they joined this community in countless numbers of moments to prayer, the community hasn't deserted them – the community remains faithful, remains close, and prays.

November is the traditional month of remembrance. As we enter the month, we remember those who inspire our memories – our saints and our souls. We are thankful to God for holy memory which allows our minds to travel, and our memories become real once again. We also perform the great challenge of the human mind to intensify prayer amid our own loved ones. We are inspired to live today's life with the vigor and joy of our ancestors. When we do this, we tend to appreciate people, places, and past events just a little more. We make them holy by invoking God and realizing that we are all holy children of God whenever we bring God into our minds, our prayers, and our hearts. At the end of November, we celebrate Thanksgiving – an American holiday which invites everyone to stop for a moment, realize how very blessed we really are, and give thanks for families, friends, peace, and possessions. There is always a holy moment on Thanksgiving Day when everyone quiets down and simply says "than you" to God. It may be in Church; it may be at the table or it may be in one's "quiet place."

As we walk these days of the first week of November, let us do it as pilgrims. Holding our head high as people of faith, searching for those faces who gave us life and nurtured that life. Moving our lips in quiet prayer and slowly, ever so slowly, letting gratitude fill our minds and our hearts. Halloween, All Saints, All Souls, Thanksgiving – days we look forward to, days we do not want to waste! This is the month we tell those who are important to us, that they are important. This is the month when we realize how lives are weaved together into a tapestry of the world in which we live. It is a special month when we find God!



Dios no pide que ayunemos por dos días cada semana y que leamos la biblia por una hora cada día, pero puede ser que las situaciones difíciles nos lleven a responder de esa manera para que podamos ajustar nuestras vidas y tener a Dios en el medio de ella, especialmente en situaciones difíciles. Dios pide que amemos a Dios y a otros y lo hagamos cada uno distintamente.

Sean conscientes de esa presencia de Dios en su vida mientras baila, come pizza, vaya al cine, escuche música y que esté escribiendo un mensaje de texto a un amigo. Sean santos como Dios quiere de ustedes.
