MULL-ING THINGS OVER

November is the Month of Remembrance. At all the Masses this weekend, we will be announcing the names of those whose funerals have been celebrated at Our Lady of Peace Parish since November 2, 2020. It is a very solemn moment as we stand and hear the names, remember the faces, and offer a little prayer as each name is pronounced. For many, we may remember the funeral celebration, or a life well-lived, or a family that is grieving – whatever the thought or memory, we pray. We will remember our deceased veterans this week on Veterans' Day. Come Thanksgiving, we will enjoy one another who are present, but we will also remember those who sat at table with us last year, but their chair is empty this year. Yes, as the autumn winds creep in, the trees lose their leaves, and the last of the Fall flowers bloom, we remember our dead.

It is important for us to remember. For one thing, often families will promise their loved ones at the moment of death that, "we will not forget!" Another reason is that we all like to feel close to those who have left us and remembering brings us emotionally closer and confident and at peace. We remember because of the stories that are so often told at this time of year. We like to remember the stories and such stories help bring our loved ones back to life. Thirdly, God has given us the privilege of remembering. We need to take advantage of that gift and utilize it to help enrich our lives and be moved to prayer. As we pray, we connect with our loved ones and again present them to God. Year after year, it is important to remember and treasure the memories.

Remembering our dead often moves us to sadness. So, we should try to remember the happier times as well. Remembering is not supposed to depress us but enliven us and allow us another dimension of life and love. To remember happy moments, pleasant activities, and good people helps us become grateful for all that God has given to us. It allows us to not only remember the special moments but, in a way, to relive them. If you can walk away from a memory with a smile then you know that it is a good memory, as it has spoken to us once again. Perhaps we can balance off our sadness with a smile if we remember our deceased not only at the moment of death but in another setting and at another time.

We are moving into the time of year when local and family traditions take on significant meaning for us. Think of Thanksgiving Day. We have many traditions about this holiday which actually shape what we say and do during the day. The menu is one big tradition. Even the recipes are matched year-after-year! We have standard places at the table, and usual times for gathering. We have specific pies that are to be made and even prayers that are recited. We look forward to the family activities which we do only on Thanksgiving Day year-after-year. The warm traditions are what makes Thanksgiving and are those that we look forward to year-after-year. We remember traditions and interact with them.

Many of our faith traditions are found in our memories. We usually remember to pray before a Thanksgiving Dinner because there is much for which we need to thank God. We are aware of the fact that we live very blessed lives and Thanksgiving provides the time to formally thank God and show our appreciation. In the many stories we hear about our founding mothers and fathers, they did not leave their faith in the "old country", it traveled with them and influenced them putting down roots with God and even enshrining them in the Declaration of Independence and Constitution. They had a confidence in God that what they were doing was right and they continually asked God to bless their ventures. They had a desire that God be seen in their lives and their work as is witnessed by the crosses they erected when a new town was founded, a business venture begun, or a new home built. God, then, was part of their memory.

Think of the good times you have had. Thank God for the good blessings you have received. Thank God for the assistance and courage He gives you to shoulder your cross and face your burdens, to mourn your dead and pray for their rest – but also smile, be happy, rejoice that you are alive. Each day is a new day, and each day gives you the opportunity to develop new memories for tomorrow. And to be reminded that we do not live alone but are surrounded by many, many people whose lives are enriched by you and who enrich yourselves as well. Memories can make us cry, but they also need to make us smile and laugh. As we move through these November days, remember the good times, laugh at the silly moments, recognize those whom you love and who love you and thank God. Have a great week!
