### MULL-ING THINGS OVER

As I walked into the hospital, I was greeted with a pleasant greeting and what I think was a smiling face. I say “I think” because she was wearing a mask so I could not see her face. I went through the COVID protocols. She asked, “Whom are you here to see?” I responded with a name and informed her that the hospital switchboard had called me – the family had asked for anointing. She promptly called the ICU and was told that I could come up to the floor. After sanitizing my hands, I walked to the elevators.

As I arrived on the second floor, the hallway was empty. I walked silently toward the ICU. It was quiet and there seemed to be no one in the hospital. I went around the corner and saw empty rooms and a nurse at the Nurses’ Station. I smiled and greeted her, she responded, and I kept walking. ICU seemed very busy. The receptionist greeted me. I told her the person I wanted to visit. She told me that the patient was a COVID patient. Did I still want to visit? I told her the family had contacted the hospital for me to anoint this patient and I was here to do so. If the patient had COVID, so be it. I went down the hallway, started to follow COVID protocols. I washed my hands, I put on a second mask. I took a gown out of the plastic bag and the nurse kindly helped me tie it in the back. I put on a second pair of gloves. I put on a hair covering and proceeded to the room. The nurse there questioned me as to the procedures I had followed. She then allowed me into the room. I was given five minutes.

The patient was hooked up to several machines, IV lines and she lay motionless in the bed. I began the prayers, speaking them out loud wondering if the individual was hearing me. I anointed her forehead, I anointed one hand – the only one I could reach. I then stepped back to the doorway and continued the prayers of blessing, asking God’s help for this person, for the doctors, nurses and family who were helping the patient, loving her, and supporting her. I gave her absolution, a plenary indulgence, and the final blessing of the Church. No response. Somehow, it seemed that she had heard me even though there was no visible response. I remained another moment and then with a final blessing left the room.

I was taken to another room where my head covering was removed and disposed of. I took off the second mask, the outer gown, the second pair of gloves and disposed of them. I then went to a room with a sink where I removed my first pair of gloves, washed my hands for thirty seconds, dried them and threw the paper towels away. I was reminded that I should go home, shower and put on fresh clothes. Everyone was very helpful and polite. As I left the hospital, somehow, I felt dirty. I avoided people, went home, showered, and changed clothes. As I began to return to my office, I began to wonder if Jesus ever thought we would be celebrating a sacrament in such a fashion. It made me think of how important our sacraments are to us as Roman Catholics. We go to excess to make sure they are celebrated. We take special care that those most in need have the sacraments made available to them. I kept thinking if the patient were me, I would be grateful that there was a priest there and was happy I could make that a possibility for this person. Something that is very powerful, very holy, and very important became very sterile, very threatening, and obsessively sanitized – for good reason. What was Jesus’s thinking?

What happened to the patient? She died even before I was out of the hospital. Her family knew she had received her sacraments, hopefully that was a comfort to them. The hospital had been successful in responding to their request. Hopefully, they were happy that they had accomplished a last request. It is our belief that with her faith and the administration of this sacrament, grace was exchanged, and this Child of God now rested in the arms of her Creator. Her end was frightening, her pain I cannot even imagine, her moment of death was probably unconsciously felt, but her soul was filled with the warmth of God’s love and the knowledge that her journey to heaven would soon be complete. COVID has strange control over us – but does not overpower us. In the face of such an illness God has the upper hand. Very few people knew what went on that afternoon – but the mystery of God’s love was present once again and people came to peace because of it.

As another Thanksgiving approaches, I am grateful that we have medical personnel who are concerned about the body and the spirit. I am grateful that I am a priest and can share in responding to people’s needs. I am grateful to God that He has anticipated the needs we humans so often have and allows us to respond to those needs with human and divine intervention. I am grateful for God’s love and faith, which reminds me that this family has an empty place at their Thanksgiving table this year; however, God has someone filling a new chair added to God’s heavenly banquet. Thanksgiving is more than traditions, eating, watching football – it is oftentimes a timeless moment – connecting us with God. Have a good week!

## UNIVERSAL SYNODAL PROCESS

On Sunday, October 10, Pope Francis started the Synodal process with a Mass at St. Peter's Basilica. For a Synodal Church: Communion, Participation, and Mission will conclude in 2023 with the 16<sup>th</sup> Synod of Bishops. During his homily at the Opening Mass, the Pope related the Gospel to the meaning of the upcoming Synod: A certain rich man came up to Jesus "as he was setting out on his journey" (Mark 10:17). The Gospels frequently show us Jesus "on a journey;" he walks alongside people and listens to the questions and concerns lurking in their hearts. He shows us that God is not found in neat and orderly places, distant from reality, but walks ever at our side. He meets us where we are, on the often-rocky roads of life. Today, as we begin this synodal process, let us begin by asking ourselves – all of us, pope, bishops, priests, religious and laity – whether we, the Christian community embody this "style" of God, who travels the paths of history and shares in the life of humanity. Are we prepared for the adventure of this journey? Or are we fearful of the unknown, preferring to take refuge in the usual excuses: "It is useless" or "We have always done it this way!"

Celebrating a Synod means walking on the same road, walking together. Let us look at Jesus. First, he encounters the rich man on the road; he then listens to his questions, and finally he helps him discern what he must do to inherit eternal life. Encounter, listen and discern. The Pope goes on to explain in more detail the meaning of those years as it relates to how the Church needs to look at the world. The Pope concludes his homily by saying, Dear brothers and sisters, let us have a good journey together! May we be pilgrims in love with the Gospel and open to the surprises of the Holy Spirit. Let us not miss out on the grace-filled opportunities born of encounter, listening and discernment. In the joyful conviction that, even as we seek the Lord, He always comes with His love to meet us first. As more information becomes available, we will keep you informed.

## Responsabilidad de Construir la Fe en Su Familia

En 1994 los obispos de EE. UU. publicaron una carta pastoral, Sigan el Camino del Amor, sobre la familia que es nuestra primera comunidad y la más básica. Una parte de las obras de la familia es prometida el día del bautismo de su hijo: transmitir la fe, enseñar a los hijos lo que nosotros los católicos creemos, y a la vez fortalecernos para la misión en el mundo, fuera de la familia. ¿Padres, cumplen lo que prometieron cuando sus hijos fueron bautizados? No siempre. Sabemos que los que han tenido una experiencia de fe en la familia crecen para ser adultos que tienen una relación fuerte con Jesucristo y están comprometidos a su fe como adultos. Los que meten su fe en la vida familiar diariamente están ayudando a sus hijos hacer lo mismo cuando ellos son adultos. Las familias que nutren fe están tomando en serio su responsabilidad de formar discípulos.

Quizás los padres y madres están pensando, ¿Cómo podemos hacer eso? En el hogar hay que hablar de Dios y cómo estar presente y hablar con Dios por oración. También hablen sobre lo que creen y por qué los católicos lo creen. Compartan cómo su fe es una ayuda en hacer decisiones y la importancia de poner su fe en acción. Que triste es cuando un joven sabe muy poco de Dios y de su fe porque no ha sido una parte importante en la vida familiar.

Algunas maneras posibles de ayudar a sí mismo y a sus hijos es que cuando:

- \*Tú crees en Dios y que Dios te quiere. Es Dios a quien tú pides ayuda en tiempos difíciles; es a Dios a quien tú agradeces cuando las cosas te van bien.
- \*Tú amas y sigues creyendo en el valor de otra persona. Los niños entienden cómo es el amor de Dios por el amor que han experimentado de otras personas.
- \*Tú evangelizas por actuar de acuerdo con los valores del evangelio y así dando un ejemplo de la vida cristiana a sus hijos. Los hijos pueden captar el significado de eso.
- \*Tú educas por hablar a sus hijos de la fe y los valores de la vida cristiana. Tu ejemplo de vida enseña.
- \*Como familia oran juntos, dando gracias a Dios por sus bendiciones, pidiendo fuerza y consejo.
- \*En familia ustedes sirven uno a otro, a veces sacrificando sus propias deseos por el bien de otros.
- \*Tú luchas para aceptar tus cruces y llevarlas con amor.
- \*Tú perdonas y buscas reconciliación. Aun los padres y madres deben hacer eso con sus hijos. Deja ir las viejas heridas y rencores para hacer la paz unos con otros.
- \*Tú celebras la vida—cumpleaños, bodas, nacimientos, muertes, trabajos nuevos, reuniones familiares, graduación, días feriados... Cuando están juntos comparten historias, y así siendo más una familia de amor.
- \*Tú actúas justamente cuando tratas a otras con respeto, y cuando estás en contra de racismo y discriminación y haces cosas para combatir hambre, pobreza...


