May God bless them all!

We cannot, however, define a year by the severity of the pandemic. Many good things have happened this year which move us to be grateful people. I have watched people stand together, reaching out and loving one another. It has been a privilege to see folks offering assistance and support for those who have suffered but also to those who have survived. I stand in awe of those who have kept businesses going, reach out services active in caring for those in need, schools that have remained open and students and teachers kept safe and healthy, families monitored and nurtured. You have probably been active in this past year with your own activities and service towards others and helped others to be safe and protected. Thanks to you!

I must offer a word of genuine gratitude to the many people who have been a great support and help to me. It seems wherever I go, a host of "guardian angels" seem to be there to help me. People have accompanied me walking and particularly going up and down stairs. Very kindly, people have asked if I needed anything and provided for my needs. I have received hosts of cards with wishes for good health and volumes of prayers being offered for me. I am deeply grateful. When I have had the misfortune of falling, people have quickly responded and, in various ways, have gotten me to my feet. I am especially grateful to the parish staff who are there when I need them. I hope and pray that I have not caused discomfort or difficulties for those who have assisted me. Our local Funeral Directors have gone especially out of their way to make sure that I am safely able to move in the cemeteries to pray with those grieving and offer the final prayers of the Church for our deceased brothers and sisters in the faith. I love the ministry to which God has called me and I am able to continue it because of the generosity of so many people. Thank you and be assured of prayers of gratitude for you!

As a parish, we have continued the work of the Lord due to your financial support and your faithful stewardship. Whether in Church or praying with us livestream, you have made sure your donations were offered and we were able to finish the fiscal year with our bills paid. Our liturgical ministers, social ministers and all who help "make the Church work" were faithful to their calling and zealously made sure the spiritual needs were met. Parents presented their children for Baptisms and helped prepare sons and daughters for First Reconciliation and soon First Holy Communion. You faithfully supported our Confirmation candidates as they journeyed to the Bishop asking for the sacrament. It is with deep sorrow that we apologize and pray for the victims, but it is with fortitude and trust in God that we also hold our heads high and continue to work "in the name of the Lord" doing what Christians do – survive and bring God's grace and love into the lives of others.

On this Holy Family Sunday we acknowledge Jesus, Mary and Joseph as our model and guide. We re-commit ourselves to our families, to be faithful to God and the work to which God has called us. I pray that we remain a vibrant parish with love for one another – neighbor, family, and stranger. May the coming New Year be a Year of Hope, a Year of Grace, and a Year in which the world rediscovers the beauty and power of God. On behalf of our Staff and Parish Council: Happy New Year!
