MULL-ING THINGS OVER

Time flies when you have a good time. Look, it is already the middle of January. We have moved through the Advent Season, the Christmas Season, the Time of Epiphany, and we are once again in Ordinary Time. The Liturgical Year has taken us on a journey, and we know that journey to Jesus' public ministry. We will be reading about his preaching, his miracles, the friends he calls apostles, the arguments he has with Scribes and Pharisees and His intimate moments with God. While we are doing that, we will be praying within our community, experiencing the love of God in various ways, and growing in our personal faith. Meanwhile, winter has settled in, we are once more confined to our homes and workplaces and rush when we are outside to find a nice warm place inside. And so, it is January in Upstate New York.

It is good for us periodically to stop, take stock of things, and reflect on what God has done for us. For instance, think back to Advent. Besides the COVID scare, what do you remember about Advent? What did you do to draw closer to Jesus and what did you do to make Jesus the center of your life? Did you find some quiet time for yourself in Advent and did it help you appreciate the wait for Christmas and the wait for eternal life? Our world made COVID the central theme of Advent. There were many controversies that surrounded that disease. It seems to always cause some chaos and social upset. But we constantly heard the phrase: "Do not be Afraid!" It was spoken by the prophets, spoken by the Angel Gabriel, it was even spoken by Jesus. The Advent message I remember is, "Do not be afraid. Behold, I am with you always." And when Christmas dawned on this world, we were reminded of God's promise that He would send a Savior and that the Savior's Presence was to be a reminder of God's continued Presence in all aspects of our world. Even during COVID, God will remain close to you!

Christmas was beautiful. We had a little snow, but by and large, we had good weather to travel, get to Church, join in family activities, drive around to see the festive lights and enjoy the signs and symbols that Christmas brings us each year. The decorations and trees and wreaths and wonderful aromas in the kitchen brought back many memories of past Christmases. This experience not only helped us remember but also helped remind us how lucky we are and how meaningful it is to carry on traditions. Going to Christmas Mass, we again found the infant Savior in a manger made of straw. The music mesmerized us, helping retell the Christmas Story and inviting us to truly enter into the mystery of the Season of God-made-flesh in the person of Jesus. "O night divine..." we heard sung and truly it was that and much more. At the 10:00 p.m. Mass, a Church almost 2/3 full stood at the beginning as the hymn "O Come All Ye Faithful..." began, called us to the Nativity scene and helped us sing, "Glory to God," as we welcomed the Infant who began human life in this world. As we walked into the cold winter night after Mass, we felt warm because of the prayer we offered and the liturgy we experienced. Jesus became real for us as we received Holy Communion and gave us a starting point for the day's celebration. The meals, the baked goods, the presents, the heart-filled hugs and kisses all helped us express the deep and warm feelings we felt as Children of God.

We rested between Christmas and New Year's Day, enjoying the little things of family and friendship. We had a whole week to give ourselves the freedom of feeling the season and generously sharing time and talent with those whom we love. It was during these days that we heard two tragic stories of the slaughtering of the innocents, the jealousy of King Herod, and the difficult Flight into Egypt. It was also during these days that we heard Simeon's words echo: "And your heart shall be pierced and the thoughts of many will be revealed." The peacefulness of Jesus challenged the violence of human life and the eternal battle was begun. Yes, Jesus taught love, but he also had to compete with human feelings and negative expressions. His life was to become a battle of good and evil. As we entered the New Year of 2022, we heard again the prophetic words, "Do not be Afraid, I am with you." Those words live for us today, as we face the reality of the pandemic, the violence in our streets, the jealousy and hatred shown by so many and the unwillingness to see one another as brother and sister. We don't give up; however, we rise to another day – another year – and renew our witness to God whose Gift of His Own Son was worth it all and we are better for it. We commemorate Martin Luther King and remember his dream because it is our dream as well. We pray for an end to abortion because its reality continues the unacceptable practice of playing God. Can we really decide who lives and who dies? The fight goes on but so does the hope. We are not afraid because we are Children of God, people with a long history of miracles, and we have been taught by Jesus that even the impossible is possible. God bless you in this ordinary time of year. Let's work hard this year to make the ordinary extraordinary!
