MULL-ING THINGS OVER

In last week's Gospel Reading, the Wedding Feast of Cana, we heard the Gospel recounting the first miracle of Jesus – the Miracle of Cana. Jesus, His mother, and His apostles had been invited to this wedding. Apparently, they all accepted the invitation. In the time of Jesus, weddings would often go on for three days. Sometime in this wedding celebration, the host ran out of wine. This could be very embarrassing for the bride and groom. The couple must have had a special relationship with Mary in that they went to her – asking her to ask Jesus to help them out. When Mary went to her son, he responded, "Woman, what would you have me do?" Mary did not give instructions. She simply went to the headwaiter and told him to do whatever Jesus told him. Jesus told them to fill six water jars with water. They did this. Then, Jesus then told them to take cup of this liquid to the head waiter who tasted it. It was perfect wine! The best he had ever tasted! Then, the famous words were spoken: "Ordinarily, the good wine is served first then an inferior one after everyone had been drinking for a while. You served the best wine now!" The first miracle of Jesus career was completed!

An interesting feature about this miracle is the fact someone had to ask for it. Jesus was not "waiting for his chance"! He had to be asked. He had to be made aware of the problem. Mary had trust in her Son – we do not know if she really knew what Jesus would do after the request was made, but she trusted. Notice, Mary did not tell Jesus what to do. She did not explain the situation and then explain what her response would be. She simply told the head waiter, "do whatever he tells you." Mary acted in good faith with a deep trust in her Divine Son.

This first miracle provides an example of our prayer experience. We must begin our prayer with trust in God. God knows what we need, and He wants to care for us. But not everything is a need and sometimes care is shown by denial. The perfect trust of Mary will never disappoint. Mary trusted not that Jesus would answer her request (she seemed to instinctively know that) but that He would answer it with what was best for all. So, when we pray to God, we do not need to coach God on how to answer our prayers but to trust that God will answer our prayers for what is best for the person we carry in prayer. God is aware of the need that is there. Like the Miracle at Cana, God sees the need, knows what to do, He simply waits for the request. Then, He expects us to follow His lead

Another quality of this story is the fact that faith is necessary when someone makes a request. Mary must have believed that Jesus would perform a miracle because Jesus was aware of her faith and her trust and then responded to it. There is no record of someone making a request of Jesus and then being surprised. Many in the crowd may be surprised. Many who are skeptical of Jesus might be surprised. Many who are challenging Jesus might be surprised. Faith is, however, a necessary commodity because Jesus responds to faith. Several times Jesus has made the statement: "It is your faith that has saved you." He reminds people that he is not responding to people by putting on a show like a magician would do it. Jesus does not show off and has no need to show off. Jesus knows His Father well and utilizes His relationship with God in such a way that that relationship is put at the service of others. We should not be surprised that Jesus hears us — we may be surprised by how God responds!

When we pray authentically, we have the confidence that God is listening, God hears our prayers and, out of love, God wants to help us. It is for this reason that Jesus will often say, "Give God the glory." Jesus does not need praise, nor does He look for thanks. He is on a mission and that mission is to accomplish God's Will. He only wants to please His Father to do His Father's request. Look at the Our Father — "... Thy Kingdom come; Thy Will be done..." Jesus knows there is a plan, and He knows that to accomplish this plan God's grace is needed. Before God's grace can be given, however, the recipient must be open to this plan. Even during the Agony in the Garden, Jesus was subservient to God's Will or God's plan, "Father, if possible, remove this cup from me, not My Will but Your Will be done..." Jesus had recognized that even if He did not want to die, He would have to do it if it was His Father's Will and He subjected himself to the Father's Will. Faith was the invaluable connection that helped to keep Jesus' head above water and helped Him understand that the whole purpose of His life was bound up in the holy Will of God.

Today's Gospel then reminds us to pray and trust that our prayers will be answered. It helps us understand that not all our prayers will be answered the way we would like them answered. We must always be open to God's Will not our own. God does answer our prayers in such a way that alignment with God's Will will give us peace, courage, and renewed faith. Mary walked away knowing everything would be okay. We should do the same thing once we have concluded our prayer. Have a great week! Stay warm!


