MULL-ING THINGS OVER

Many Easters ago, while I was at Sacred Heart Cathedral, I was staffing in an Overnight Shelter for the Homeless. For several years, our parish with several other parishes banded together to operate this shelter throughout the winter months. We would open at 9:00 p.m. and close at 7:00 a.m. Normally the shelter closed April 1st. But, this particular year, Easter was early, and the shelter was still operating. Since it was the day before Easter, we were short workers so I agreed to work – but, told folks I would be late because of the Easter Vigil. I was overseeing the RCIA at the time and wanted to be present for the catechumens entering the Church. It was after 11:00 p.m. when I arrived. We were at St. Bridget's Church which is pretty much in the middle of the City of Rochester.

As I arrived, it became very clear to me that the atmosphere I was in prior to my arrival was much different than this shelter. The cathedral was beautiful for Easter. Lilies and azaleas were everywhere. The cathedral choir was singing, trumpets were blaring announcing the Resurrection. Bishop Clark presided. There were many servers and liturgical ministers. Everyone was dressed in their holiday best. It was a wonderful celebration. I remember thinking this was like heaven on earth, so holy, so beautiful, so reverent with smiles everywhere. Eight new members of the Church were born that night through the waters of Baptism. There were close to 400 people present – I am sure many went home feeling they would never forget this holy experience.

Contrast this to a homeless shelter which was in the basement of a one-hundred-year-old Church. It was damp, reasonably clean, drafty, filled with the smells of 20 sleeping men and two bathrooms. No one owned Sunday-best clothes. Four volunteers were present. Quite a difference from my earlier Easter celebration. But it was a place of love. Most of the men were sleeping when I arrived. A few were cleaning up in the bathrooms. There had been a little Easter gathering when they first arrived. The volunteers were cleaning up when I walked in. I went over and started washing dishes. They shared some stories with me. Everyone seemed to enjoy the little gathering. As usual the men were very hungry when they arrived and all the food had been eaten. The coffee had been consumed and conversation had been about which community Easter Dinner the folks would attend the next day.

The volunteers had prepared a little sunrise service in the morning when everyone got up and an Easter Breakfast which we would begin to prepare in a few hours. We were staying open two extra hours in the morning. When we finished cleaning up, we began to put together some Easter boxes. We figured none of the men would want to walk around Rochester carrying an Easter Basket. One of the city Catholic Schools had prepared boxes colored by the students, filled with Easter candy and cookies contributed by students, and a personally made Easter card. We lovingly filled the boxes, put a bow on them and the name of each guest we had that night. These were not big boxes and there was not an overload of goodies. But it was something that would help make Easter morning a little special for our guests. We finished the Easter boxes and settled in. Two volunteers would sleep for three hours, then, the second two volunteers would sleep. At 6:00 a.m. we would awaken everyone and start breakfast and begin waking the guests.

It was 1:00 a.m. when there was a knock at the door. Technically, we were not supposed to admit anyone after midnight. But it was Easter, so I decided to open the door. A ragged gentleman was standing there. "Can I come in?" he asked. I said, we don't have any beds left, but you can use the couch. He came in, nodded to the two of us, and accepted a cookie and a cup of coffee. He explained that he had fallen asleep on a park bench when the police found him. He was told that he could not sleep there and was told to come to St. Bridget's – they will take care of you. I was glad I let him in. Soon, he was snoring on the couch.

At 6:00 a.m., we started waking our guests and I went outside to get ready for the sunrise service. One by one, the guests walked out, some members of one church's choir arrived to provide some music, the sun was beginning to rise but it was still dark. The colors were so pronounced, I can still remember the scene today. The glorious sound of "alleluia" was heard, it grew louder, a voice rang out: "He is not here! He has arisen. He has done so for you and for me." The Gospel of the Resurrection was read, another hymn was sung, the Lord's Prayer was prayed, and the Sign of Peace shared. Each man greeted one another with a jolly "Happy Easter", and we all retreated inside for ham and eggs and toast and coffee and a few goodies that had been prepared. It was not festive with material things, but the spirit of festivity pervaded the place. Then, came the time for distributing the Easter boxes. I blessed them and the other three passed them out. Smiles were everywhere.

Then, I panicked! There was no box for the late comer. We had only prepared the number of boxes to match the number of gifts. I saw the late comer come out of the bathroom and I tried to get to him. Someone said, "Hey, what about this guy?" As I arrived at our last guest, everyone was looking at me. I could only say the truth. I explained we were short one box. We did not know our friend would be joining us until after the Easter Bunny's work had been done... A guest got up and poured the contents of his box on his bed. One by one, each remaining guest placed one item from their box into the empty box. When the contributions had been received, the gentleman handed the box to the last arrival. It brought tears to my eyes. No one had uttered any instructions. No one even asked for a contribution. Spontaneously, a new Easter Box was created. Receiving the box, the gentleman said, "Thanks, I was late, it was very kind of this guy that I was even let in. Now, you honor me with a gift." Then, he said, "Jesus truly has risen and now lives in each of you!" We needed no service that morning. We needed no sunrise. This simple gesture, unaccompanied by a choir, in a damp basement, happening in utter simplicity was miracle enough.

To see Jesus in the faces of men who had suffered the hard knocks of life, who knew how to share, and had been touched by grace was more powerful than any magnificent cathedral! In the human exchange of grace, Jesus reached out and touched the hearts of each of these men. After so many years, this is the Easter that I remember. It is such a simple story: Jesus' death was violent and cruel, it was painful and humiliating, it was also filled with love which overpowered all that was negative by a single act of love. Twenty-one men and three volunteers taught me the truth of their belief and reminded me that as long as we share, Jesus will be alive. Truly, JESUS HAS ARISEN! He shares life with us every day! Happy Easter to all.

Bishop Matano gave permission for Holy Water to be made available before our Masses beginning with the Easter Vigil. Holy Water occupies a central place in the Easter celebration. During the Easter Vigil, volunteers placed the Holy Water in our church fonts. The bishop instructed us to change the water every week and make sure that fonts are also sanitized each week. We will also have Holy Water available for you to take it home. Reverence this sacramental and be happy it has returned to our home!

First Saturday Devotion

In conjunction with the consecration performed by Pope Francis on March 25, 2022, of humanity, particularly Russia and Ukraine, to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, <u>we need to do our part</u> as requested by Our Lady of Fatima in 1925:

"Look My daughter, at My Heart, surrounded with thorns with which ungrateful men pierce Me at every moment by their blasphemies and ingratitude. You at least try to console Me and announce in My name that I promise to assist at the moment of death, with all the graces necessary for salvation, all those who, on the first Saturday of five consecutive months shall confess, receive Holy Communion, recite five decades of the Rosary, and keep Me company for fifteen minutes while meditating on the fifteen mysteries of the Rosary, with the intention of making reparation to Me."

Our Lord explained to Lucia, one of the visionaries, why this devotion is necessary:

"My daughter, the reason is simple. There are five types of offenses and blasphemies uttered against the Immaculate Heart of Mary:

- 1. Blasphemies against Her Immaculate Conception;
- 2. Blasphemies against Her Perpetual Virginity;
- 3. Blasphemies against Her Divine Maternity, while refusing at the same time to recognize Her as the Mother of men;
- 4. The blasphemies of those who publicly seek to sow in the hearts of children indifference or scorn, or even hatred of this Immaculate Mother;
- 5. The offenses of those who outrage Her directly in Her holy images.

There My daughter, is the reason why the Immaculate Heart of Mary asked Me to request this small act of reparation, and in consideration of it, to move My mercy to forgive souls who have had the misfortune to offend Her."

Starting in May, on the first Saturday, we will gather in front of the tabernacle at St. Stephen's Church at the end of the 8 o'clock Mass to recite the rosary with appropriate meditations, as requested. All those who participate will need to go to confession on their own each month to fulfill the requirements of reparation set by Our Lady for five consecutive months. We will do this continually for those who may miss any of them.

Creemos en la Resurrección

¿Realmente crees en la Resurrección de Cristo? Leemos en los evangelios que Jesús vivió, murió y resucitó por causa nuestra. ¿Creemos lo que repetimos cada domingo en el credo, "resucitó al tercer día"? También profesamos que esperamos "la resurrección de los muertos." Ah, hubo muchos testigos de la vida transformada de Jesús—los discípulos a quienes él apareció en el camino de Emaús guienes no lo reconocían hasta su acción eucarística con el pan en la mesa. Magdalena estaba llorando cerca de la tumba cuando Jesús le habló. Los apóstoles estaban reunidos en el cuarto superior cuando escuchaban su voz saludándoles con la paz después que el pasó por una puerta cerrada sin abrirla.

Esta apariencia de Jesús a ellos no fue un milagro. Esta fue Jesucristo transformado, no fue una resucitación como lo de Lázaro. Este Cristo verdaderamente había muerto, pero tres días después resucitó. La parte humana y la parte divina de Jesús estuvieron completamente unidos; fueron uno en Jesucristo. Ese día de Pascua todo cambió y el cuerpo espiritual o transformado de Cristo fue reconocido por los discípulos. No pasó porque los discípulos lo querían sino porque la resurrección de Cristo realmente ocurrió.

Este evento transformó a los discípulos porque estaban verdaderamente convencidos de la realidad del evento y después comprometidos a dar sus propias vidas como testigos de esta verdad. Dieron testimonio que Cristo murió, que fue sepultado y que resucitó al tercer día (1Cor 15: 4). Con la ayuda del Espíritu Santo los apóstoles pudieron dar testimonio de su fe en Jesucristo públicamente. Hubo un cambio tremendo en sus vidas.

¿Qué tiene que ver todo esto para nosotros 2,000 años después de estos acontecimientos ? Si no hubo una resurrección de Cristo, yo creo que cuatro personas no habrían escrito evangelios y no tendríamos la fe cristiana hoy. Cristo nos da la fuerza y convicción de creer en todo lo que él enseñó y nos ayuda a seguir su camino—muchas veces un camino dificil de seguir. Así vamos recuperando nuestras convicciones, para vivir más nuestra potencial divina. Fuimos hechos a la imagen de Dios, pero los seres humanos perdimos algun brillo de ser hijos de Dios. Jesús nos mostró cómo fue posible ser más como Dios. Ojalá que nosotros aquí en la comunidad de Geneva podamos aceptar la libertad dada a nosotros por la resurrección para rechazar todo lo que nos quita la libertad de rechazar lo que son obstáculos de vivir el camino de Jesucristo. Conocemos el camino de Jesús y ahora tenemos que aceptar los medios de seguir ese camino. Hermanos y hermanas, están conmigo en intentar vivir el camino de Cristo resucitado como él nos mostró en los evangelios? Así. al final de nuestras vidas experimentaremos nuestras propias resurrecciones. Hermana Kay




