MULL-ING THINGS OVER

We have reached Divine Mercy Sunday. Lent ended last week, the Easter Octave ends today, we are now invited to spend six weeks enjoying the Easter Season and celebrating the Resurrection of Our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. What a beautiful time of year. As we see the world around us transform from Winter to Spring, as we watch the earth come alive, the flowers bloom, and the trees begin to bud, we celebrate life, and the beauty life presents to us.

During Holy Week, the Church offers us some powerful signs and symbols. We are asked to focus on the cross. We are called to see it as an instrument of torture and death as well as a sign of victory, salvation, and new life. We celebrate Mass every day. How often do you take time to reflect on the chalice sitting on the altar, the paten filled with hosts? Those signs certainly remind us of the Last Supper, Jesus' desire to feed us always, the opportunity we have to commune with God and have Jesus become real for us once again. They are two other symbols of Holy Week. At the Easter Vigil, we lit a fire and as it came to life, the darkness was banished, we could see. We blessed the fire, we blessed the Easter candle, we lighted the candles of all present and our deacon announced: "Christ our Light!" It was a symbol of the Resurrection and the fulfillment of Jesus' final promise — "behold I am with you all days." Holy week is filled with liturgical signs and symbols meant to help tell the story of the Paschal Mystery in images that directly speak to us

The Easter Season is very similar to Holy Week in that it invites us to see the symbols of the season – once seen, they lead us to the deeper mystery of Jesus' post-Resurrection days and the days of life we will enjoy until this world ends. We are invited through the prayers and Scriptural readings to recognize the signs of the Season. This is not only the Church signs – it is nature's signs. For instance, at the Easter Vigil, three folks joined the Catholic Church. Ethan, A.J. and Kirra have been part of the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults (RCIA) for the last seven months. They have come to weekly sessions, shared about their faith, learned the teachings of our Church, discussed the sacraments, and now are fully initiated Roman Catholics. Their smiles radiated their joy at becoming Catholic. They were (and are) living signs of God's grace alive in our world today. To see them sent a reminder to my heart about how important faith is to me and that I need to refresh my joy at being Catholic and representing Jesus in our world today. One of the principal activities of the Easter Season is being reminded that we all represent Jesus every day of our lives.

We are challenged in these days after Easter, then, to look around ourselves and recognize the signs, treasure the signs, enhance those signs through our eyes of faith. For instance, we can see the grass is greener as it begins to grow. The tulip leaves and daffodil stems, which only broke ground a couple of weeks ago, now hold beautiful flowers that are alive and making the world alive with beauty. What we may call the work of Mother Nature is an act of God in His eternal plan constantly renewing the earth and giving life. The signs of Spring mirror the activity of Jesus in His resurrection from the dead. He died, He was buried, and as a tiny plant begins to grow, He rose from the dead, revealing himself to Mary Magdalene, then Peter and John, then the disciples on the road to Emmaus, then to the eleven apostles in the upper room. The world seems to come alive in spring as Jesus came alive in Resurrection. The beautiful plants and trees of nature are becoming living signs of God's activity in the world and the new life we enjoy because Jesus is fulfilling His promise to remain with us all days.

Very soon, we will be celebrating the sacrament of Confirmation with our young adults, who have spent the last two years under the guidance of Mary Olsen. As these young people progress in their faith and receive the sacrament of the Holy Spirit, they will serve as signs to us of the on-going growth of our Church as her members continue their faith journey, becoming full-initiated members of our Church. A week later, our 2022 First Communion class and their families will be celebrating their invitation to come to the table of the Lord, and like the apostles of Holy Thursday be invited for the first time to share in the sacrament of Holy Eucharist. They are excited and can't wait for the moment. These two groups are signs of our faith embracing members growing in their faith and alive with love for God. They remind us of the time when we were confirmed, when we made First Holy Communion, and how that tradition continues on, and more and more Catholics come to recognize Christ alive with us.

Keep your eyes open, look for Easter signs, relish your own faith in a living God, see signs of God in you, the people around you and in the world in which you live. Happy Easter!

First Saturday Devotion

In conjunction with the consecration performed by Pope Francis on March 25, 2022, of humanity, particularly Russia and Ukraine, to the Immaculate Heart of Mary, we **need to do our part** as requested by Our Lady of Fatima in 1925:

"Look My daughter, at My Heart, surrounded with thorns with which ungrateful men pierce Me at every moment by their blasphemies and ingratitude. You at least try to console Me and announce in My name that I promise to assist at the moment of death, with all the graces necessary for salvation, all those who, on the first Saturday of five consecutive months shall confess, receive Holy Communion, recite five decades of the Rosary, and keep Me company for fifteen minutes while meditating on the fifteen mysteries of the Rosary, with the intention of making reparation to Me."

Our Lord explained to Lucia, one of the visionaries, why this devotion is necessary:

"My daughter, the reason is simple. There are five types of offenses and blasphemies uttered against the Immaculate Heart of Mary:

- 1. Blasphemies against Her Immaculate Conception:
- 2. Blasphemies against Her Perpetual Virginity;
- 3. Blasphemies against Her Divine Maternity, while refusing at the same time to recognize Her as the Mother of men;
- 4. The blasphemies of those who publicly seek to sow in the hearts of children indifference or scorn, or even hatred of this Immaculate
- 5. The offenses of those who outrage Her directly in Her holy images.

There My daughter, is the reason why the Immaculate Heart of Mary asked Me to request this small act of reparation, and in consideration of it, to move My mercy to forgive souls who have had the misfortune to offend Her."

Starting in May, on the first Saturday, we will gather in front of the tabernacle at St. Stephen's Church at the end of the 8 o'clock Mass to recite the rosary with appropriate meditations, as requested. All those who participate will need to go to confession on their own each month to fulfill the requirements of reparation set by Our Lady for five consecutive months. We will do this continually for those who may miss any of them.

La Misericordia de Dios Se Muestra de Muchas Maneras

Rezamos el salmo 117 hoy: "Diga la casa de Israel: eterna es su misericordia. Diga la casa de Aaron: eterna es su misericordia. Digan los fieles del Señor: eterna es su misericordia." Todos respondemos:

"Den gracias al Señor porque es bueno, porque es eterna su misericordia."

Reconocemos el amor de Dios por reconocer las muchas veces en el Antiguo Testamento cuando Dios había mostrado su misericordia a su pueblo en la tierra. En el tiempo presente Dios nos muestra esa misma misericordia amorosa. Una y otra vez Dios muestra misericordia al perdonar. En nuestro tiempo tan limpios, libres y felices nos sentimos después de celebrar el sacramento de Reconciliación.

Igualmente, la práctica de la misericordia requiere que nosotros perdonemos a los que nos han ofendido y herido. Significa que nosotros los perdonamos y no exigimos que, según la justicia humana, ellos restauran lo que han destruido. Jesús nos pidió ser misericordiosos como su Padre es misericordioso. Sin la misericordia, perdón y reconciliación no habrá sanación. Puede ser que una nación, institución, un grupo o un individuo nos ha atacado o abusado. Tenemos que actuar como personas maduras y soltar nuestras acusaciones y pensamientos contra otros y actuar misericordiosamente.

Yo recuerdo algo que aprendí sobre la cualidad de la misericordia cuando en enseñanza media yo estaba estudiando *El Comerciante de Venecia* escrito por Shakespeare.

"La cualidad de la misericordia no se tensa. Cae como la suave lluvia del cielo Sobre el lugar de abajo. Es dos veces bendito: Bendice al que da y al que toma....

Misericordia es un atributo de Dios mismo;

Y el poder terrenal entonces se muestra como el de Dios Cuando la misericordia sazona la justicia."

Como Dios debemos moderar la justicia con la misericordia. No es algo fácil para hacer, pero es tan necesario para estar en paz con otros y nosotros mismos.

Sí, tenemos que aprender de nuestro gran maestro Dios. Padre John Hardon define la misericordia como la disposición de ser bondadoso al otro o perdonando al otro. Hay acción en esto; la persona quiere ayudar al otro que tiene una necesidad, especialmente la necesidad de perdón o reconciliación. Aprendamos de Dios.

Hoy es la fiesta de la Divina Misericordia que fue anunciado por el Papa Juan Pablo II el 30 de abril del 2000 durante la canonización de Sor Faustina Kowalska. El papa designó el segundo domingo de Pascua como el domingo de la divina misericordia. El decreto vaticano aclaró que el segundo domingo de pascua seguía con las mismas lecturas del misal romano.






