MULL-ING THINGS OVER

Last Thursday, we celebrated the Sacrament of Confirmation with Bishop Matano. We were gathered with Waterloo, Seneca Falls, and Auburn parishes. There was a total of 63 candidates from these parishes. For two years they have been preparing to receive this sacrament and be filled with God's Holy Spirit. It was a beautiful celebration and there were smiles on the faces of all who shared this sacrament. As I watched the families present, you could see the pride in the eyes of parents whose sons and daughters were taking another major step in their life-journey of faith. Sponsors stood at the side of their candidate giving them moral support, witnessing their faith in a very special way, and praying as the Holy Spirit entered their friend. The bishop spoke of the violence and challenges which exist in our world and the great need for good, solid Catholics willing to witness their faith. He also spoke about the importance of sharing in Holy Communion and receiving it as a way of being strengthened and nourished by God to continue the work of Christ in our world. These young adults became for me and for many of those gathered that night signs of Easter joy. Signs of Jesus continuing to be present in our world today. With the Holy Spirit's coming, they became signs of the initiation completion which called candidates to be adult witnesses of the growth of our Church and the willingness of living a life dedicated to God and God's work.

This afternoon (May 1st) our parish's young people will step forward and receive First Holy Communion. The First Communicants have spent the last four months preparing with their parents and families so that they will be ready to share in this sacrament. Three weeks ago, we commemorated Holy Thursday. It was on this day that Jesus at the Last Supper consecrated bread and wine into his Body and Blood. Not only did His apostles receive Holy Communion for the first time but Jesus empowered them be able to consecrate bread and wine and thus continue sharing the Body and Blood of Jesus for as long as the Church exists. The Eucharist is one of the sacraments that we can receive whenever we attend Mass. It is the on-going remembrance of Jesus' promise that He would be with us all the days of our lives. The Eucharist becomes a sign of our participation in the Family of God as God feeds us from his holy table. The Eucharist, then, becomes a reminder of Jesus' Presence, His wish to nourish us, and a sign of empowerment of missionary activity bringing people face-to-face with God. The Eucharist becomes a sign of God's love, Presence, and divine nourishment.

These two sacraments serve us as Easter signs of Jesus' life and living Presence today. With the sacrament of Baptism, these three sacraments form our sacraments of initiation. We enter the Church, the Family of God, through the doors of Baptism where as children of God we receive a right to the Kingdom. With the coming of the power of the Holy Spirit, we are inspired to be part of building the Kingdom of God with the Holy Spirit as guide, inspiring us to use God's grace to strengthen us. Through the sacrament of the Eucharist, we are nourished to do the work of God as a full-fledged member of the Body of Christ. With these three sacraments we enter the vocations of the church and are entitled to utilize the sacrament of Reconciliation or the Anointing of Sick. Anointing brings healing of the body; reconciliation leads us to the healing of the spirit. The seven sacraments create the life of the Church to perform the work of Jesus.

These Easter Signs signal to us the role of the Church present in the world. They make the Church a living, breathing Body – the Body of Christ. Through the Church's social ministry, the poor, the vulnerable, the needy are cared for and lifted up. Through the Church's education, the Body comes to know Jesus and learn his directions and discover the beauty of God and the power of God. Through liturgy, the Church can gather in prayer, raising our voices in praise of God, uniting hearts and souls in wonder and awe of the Creator God and inviting community prayer and recognition of God. The Church is allowed to bring peace, healing, gentleness, and acceptance into a world that suffers from violence, rejection, war, and death. Our Church invites us to dream of the possibilities of God's grace working in the world, activated by God's gifts and the love of Jesus shining through who we are.

Once again, this week, I invite you to open your eyes; and, to recognize in your world the Easter signs and wonders that God has provided - Jesus has risen, is alive, and works in and through us to help the world see God. With eyes of faith, we find the divine; but, with only eyes of the world, we are isolated, in competition, and lost. The message of Easter is: We are alive, we live the promise, we have hope for the future, we love God and one another. Have a great week!

My dear sisters and brothers in Christ:

With this letter, I am happy to announce the weekend of May 14th and 15th, the Fifth Sunday of Easter, as Diocesan Missions Sunday.

In the readings designated for this chosen Sunday, we see the disciples, strengthened by prayer and fasting, being sent to proclaim the Word of God, and embarking upon the mission they were given to accomplish (Acts 14:21-27). Jesus, in the Gospel of John, further commands us: "as I have loved you, so you mut love one another." (John 13:34)

La Misericordia de Dios Vivida en Nuestra Vidas Diariamente

La Iglesia habla de las siete obras de misericordia corporales que están incluidos en las enseñanzas de Jesús. Hemos recibo la misericordia de Dios; Dios nos muestra su amor y perdón. Jesús había alimentado a los hambrientos y sedientos. El ayudaba a los que faltaban la libertad debido a una enfermedad o un pecado.

Las obras de la misericordia nos desafían a ver a los demás y no solamente verlos sino mirarlos prestando atención a ellos con la intención de ver la persona con sus cualidades positivos y con la intención de ayudarlos si sea necesario. Las obras de la misericordia "son acciones caritativas mediante las cuales ayudamos a nuestro prójimo en sus necesidades corporales" (USCCA).

*<u>Alimentar a los Hambrientos</u>—Tenemos que considerar una mejor administración de alimentos para beneficiar a los demás. Como individuos: donar a una colecta que ayuda a otros como la colecta mensual de la parroquia para los necesitados o traiga sus donaciones de comida a la iglesia. Trate de no comprar mas alimentos que necesarios para su familia. Done dinero a organizaciones (después de investigarlas) que tienen la capacidad de dar servicios a personas necesitadas.

*<u>Dar de Beber al Sediento</u>—Muchos no tienen acceso a agua limpia. Debemos apoyar los esfuerzos de los que trabajan para que haya una mayor accesibilidad de este recurso esencial. Done para ayudar a construir pozos de agua para los necesitados. Haga un esfuerzo por no desperdiciar agua. Cierre la pluma de agua cuando se cepilla los dientes o está lavando los platos.

*<u>Albergar a los Desamparados</u>—Hay varias razones que causan a una persona convertirse en una persona sin hogar. Sería bueno salir y conocer a las personas sin hogar. ¿Por qué está durmiendo en el sofá en la casa de un conocido o por qué está quedándose en un hogar para desamparados? Done tiempo o dinero a las organizaciones que construyen casas para los que necesitan refugio. Hoy están intentando ayudar a los refugiados que vienen al pais buscando refugio, huyendo de violencia y guerra, y buscan ayuda.

*<u>Vestir al Desnudo</u>—Muchos no tienen bastante dinero para comprar la nueva ropa que otras compran varias veces por año. Piense cuando decide comprar otro vestuario si realmente lo necesita. O si decide comprar otra cosa, done su ropa usada a la iglesia y mételo en el dumpster de la escuela para ropa en el parqueo.

*<u>Visitar a los Enfermos</u>—A veces olvidamos a los enfermos, pero están en sus casas, hospitales o hogares para los enfermos, teniendo el deseo de visitas. Done sangre, ofrece su tiempo en un hogar de ancianos. Tome tiempo para visitar a un vecino anciano o un conocido en necesidad de algo social. Lleve una comida a la persona en su propia casa.

*<u>Visitar a los Presos</u>—La gente en la cárcel sigue siendo personas, hecha a la imagen de Dios. Merecen recibir la Palabra de Dios con el mensaje de Jesucristo. Done a las organizaciones que realizan este ministerio. Ofrece regalos de Navidad a los niños cuyos padres están encarcelados. Comuníquense con el grupo en la parroquia que visita a los encarcelados.

*<u>Enterrar a los Muertos</u>—Funerales nos dan la oportunidad de llorar y mostrar apoyo, puede ser solo con un abrazo sin palabras. Ore por el difunto y apoye al que sufre. Envíe una carta a la persona que ha perdido a un ser querido. Visite al cementerio.
