# **MULL-ING THINGS OVER**

Today is Mother's Day. It is the day traditionally honoring all mothers! We usually use this day as the opportunity to show gratitude to our moms and be reminded of the sacrifices our moms have made in bringing new life into the world. Our dear Moms started sacrificing as soon as they became pregnant. Sacrificing out of love becomes the hallmark of a mother's life. When I talk to mothers, they always indicate a warm spot in their heart for their children. Nothing is too good for their sons and daughters; they want their children to be happy and successful.

Since, during this Easter Season, we are reflecting on signs of Easter, it seems appropriate to focus this week on our mothers as signs of Easter Joy and hope. The bond between a mother and her child is probably the most powerful bond there is. The first few years of a child's life, dependency on the mother is paramount! A mother feeds and cloths her child. She knows what to do to keep her child secure, healthy, and happy. In a way it is God's gentle care for a newborn that models for us the special role our moms have to influence us. There is a strong trust that Mom is doing all that is possible to assure a balanced and loving relationship; and encouraging a child to develop nurturing relationships. These Easter signs not only show us the love of God encouraging growth in a child's life and guiding the development of family life and life beyond the family. It also becomes a source of great blessing for all mothers.

I remember when one of my nephews was diagnosed with Type one diabetes. His mother went to the hospital and did not come home until her son came home. She did not want her son frightened so she stayed by his side. Since she is a nurse, she kept informed through the doctor and a nurse so that she could provide the right care in dealing with the illness. I am sure when my nephew went home, he felt very secure in what he had to do to take care of himself. Not only was my sister-in-law witnessing her personal love and care to her son, but she became a sign of God's Easter love by giving life and sharing her faith in a God who promises to work in and through us.

Even though there were nine children in our family, we always marveled at how my Mom could be everywhere all the time. None of us felt left out or unloved, or needlessly alone. Somehow my Mom had a way of making us loved. It is very close to our belief in the universalism of God. He is everywhere and is especially close to us when we are in need. It is another sign of God's reaching out to us and making sure God's love flows to us through our mothers. When we come to Mother's Day each year, it is a time of gratitude as we thank God for our mothers, and we ask God to help guide and direct our mothers. Often, we give our Mom a gift to show our love and to provide a constant reminder of our affection for her.

The year after my Mom's death, I dreaded Mother's Day coming. How do you give a gift to someone who has died? I used to give my Mom a variety of flowers that she could plant. She loved flowers and it was relaxing for her to putter in the garden. When I would see the beautiful flowers blooming, it would remind me of my love for her but also reminded her of God's love for her as she enjoyed the newly bloomed flowers. They provided opportunities to appreciate life – whether garden flowers – or the lives of her sons and daughters. Some of the flowers I had given my Mom before she died are still blooming when I see them, I am happy because she planted them. Somehow, I had the feeling that my Mom knew that those flowers were blooming again and now it became a sign of her new life with God in heaven. I could still buy and plant flowers for her and be reminded of our traditional giving gifts. Signs continue to give and continue to remind us of love – even after death has occurred.

As we continue to journey through this Easter Season, we also tend to See Mary, Jesus' mother, as the center of our Easter signs. Because Mary is especially honored in the month of May, we should raise her up, honor her in her role as Jesus' Mother, and renew our commitment to be faithful as she is faithful, to be loving as she is loving, to be open to God's grace as she was open to God's grace, and reflect the ways that she enhances Easter life in those early days of the Church. Most of our mothers have adopted Mary as their role-model. I remember every night before my Mom went to bed, she would say the rosary for all her children and ask God to help her be like Mary in protecting and encouraging her children. I am sure that such examples have given all the Mulls the love of Mary and her rosary. Please continue your journeying and discovering the signs of Easter in your life but this week, shift your attention to Mary, reflect on the deep love she had for her Son and, like her, allow our mothers to become a living sign of Easter.

# Música en Nuestras Celebraciones

Tenemos muchos medios de comunicarnos con Dios. La oración no es solamente estar en silencio y hablarle a Dios. Es caminar por la calle y contactar a Dios por medio de otras. Es también caminar en la naturaleza y sentir ese Dios Creador, ese Dios bello, ese Dios siempre vivo. Oración puede ser sentir y estar llevado a Dios y conocer el amor de Dios por medio de un abrazo o beso de alguien amado. Oración puede estar sentado en silencio ante el Santísimo. Oración también es cuando celebramos los sacramentos con otras en comunidad. Oración puede ser cuando oramos el rosario solo o con otras personas. Hay tantas maneras de estar en comunicación con Dios.

Como parte de la celebración Eucarística es la música. Tenemos la música instrumental y vocal como manera de estar en comunicación con Dios. La música puede ser muy emocional, sea alegría, tristeza, amor, perdón. El cantar como asamblea nos une en expresar nuestra creencia en común. Si te abras al significado de lo que tú estás cantando, las emociones fluyen sobre ti. Dios está presente en la letra, las notas musicales y en los sonidos de las voces y los instrumentos. Sabemos que los salmos fueron escritos para cantar; son un modo del habla humana.

Aldous Huxley escribió que "Después del silencio, lo que mas se acerca a expresar lo inexpresable es la música." La música nos ayuda a ir mas despacio en la vida, de tomar tiempo para pensar, reflexionar, expresarnos de una manera mas poética. Si la persona se llena de la música, parece que la vida sigue con menos esfuerzo. Es posible que la música puede nombrar Dios y comunicar Dios a nosotros.

Durante la Misa usamos una variedad de música instrumental y cantada. Como comunidad es esencial que cantemos, que metamos nuestras voces con las voces de los demás. ¿Y por qué muchos no cantan? Algunas personas van a decir que su voz no es buena. Dios acepta todas las voces. No todos somos fantásticos al cantar, pero somos fantásticos porque queremos dar alabanza, gloria a Dios y sentir la alegría y conforte de Dios que recibimos por cantar.

Otras dicen que no cantan porque no han aprendido las canciones. No siempre vamos a cantar las mismas canciones. ¿Tu siempre dice la misma cosa a tus hermanos o padres o hijos? Cuando tenemos cantos nuevos Nancy Rowe practica con la asamblea ante de empezar la Misa. En este tiempo de Pascua vamos a aprender un nuevo Santo y espero que hagan el esfuerzo para aprenderlo. Estamos reunidos los domingos en comunidad y no es bueno decidir que vas a hacer tu oración personal solo y no cantar. Preferencias personales son múltiples y puede ser que no siempre te gusta las canciones que se usan. Favor de darme a mí o dar a Nancy Rowe alguna canción que te gusta o una sugerencia sobre la música.

Que bueno sería si todos en la iglesia los domingos se consideren parte de la comunidad y así cantan a Dios para expresar su amor, su arrepentimiento, su alegría, su alabanza. Es también importante responder al sacerdote cuando nos saluda, nos pide profesar nuestra creencia igual o termina una oración. Nuestra participación en la Eucaristía debe ser activa. ¿Están conmigo para mejorar nuestras celebraciones comunitarias?

Espero que sí. Dios espera más que un cuerpo inactivo en el banco. ¡Aleluya, Cristo ha resucitado! *Hermana Kay*
